### CLINTON MAINTAINS LEAD IN NH DEMOCRATIC PRIMARY FIELD, GOP A MUDDLE

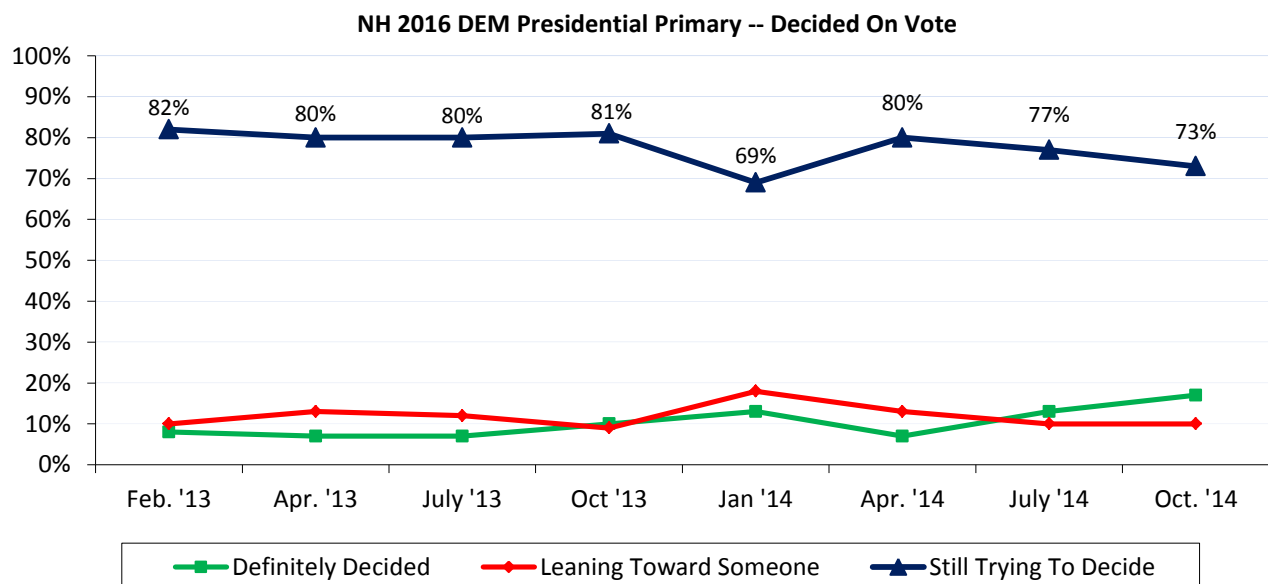
DURHAM, NH –Hillary Clinton remains the frontrunner in the 2016 New Hampshire Primary. On the Republican side, there continues to be no frontrunner. Very few voters have made up their minds about who to vote for in the 2016 New Hampshire Primary.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,\* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred and eighty-one (681) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between September 29 and October 5, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.8 percent. Included in the sample were 275 likely 2016 Republican Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 5.9%) and 234 likely 2016 Democratic Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 6.4%).

### NH Voters Are Still Very Undecided

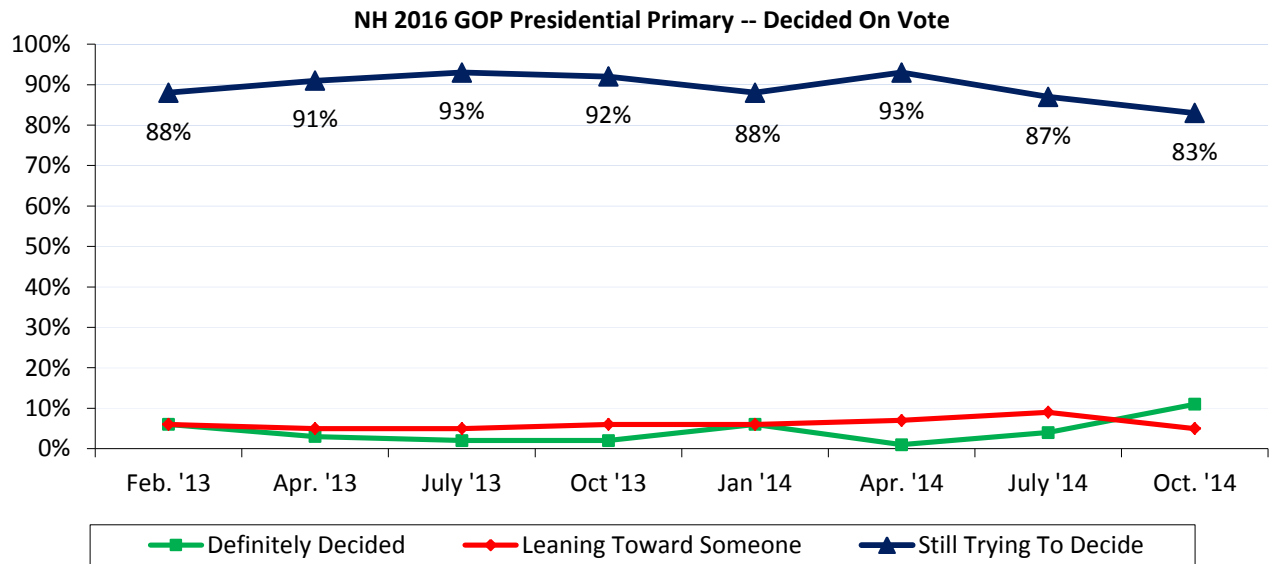
With less than two years until the First in the Nation New Hampshire Presidential Primary, prospective Republican and Democratic candidates have been testing the waters here for presidential runs in 2016. While many of the candidates discussed in this poll will decide not to run, and others may enter who were not discussed, candidates who are the early identified frontrunners have typically won past New Hampshire primaries.

New Hampshire primary voters typically decide who they will vote for in the last weeks, or days of the campaign and it is no surprise that very few voters currently have made up their minds about who they will support in 2016. Currently, only 17% of likely Democratic primary voters say they have definitely decided who they will support, 10% are leaning toward a candidate, but the great majority of voters (73%) are still trying to decide who to support.

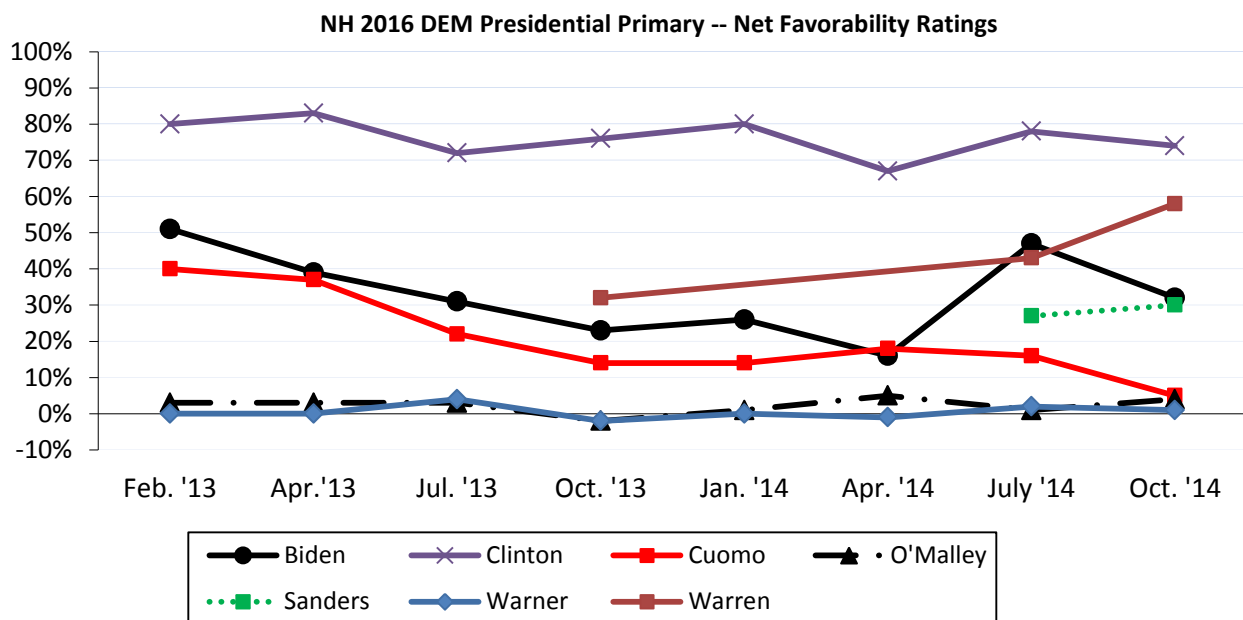
Republican voters are even less sure than Democrats. Only 11% of likely Republican Primary voters say they have definitely decided who they will support, 5% are leaning toward a candidate, and 83% are still trying to decide.



### Democratic Favorability Ratings

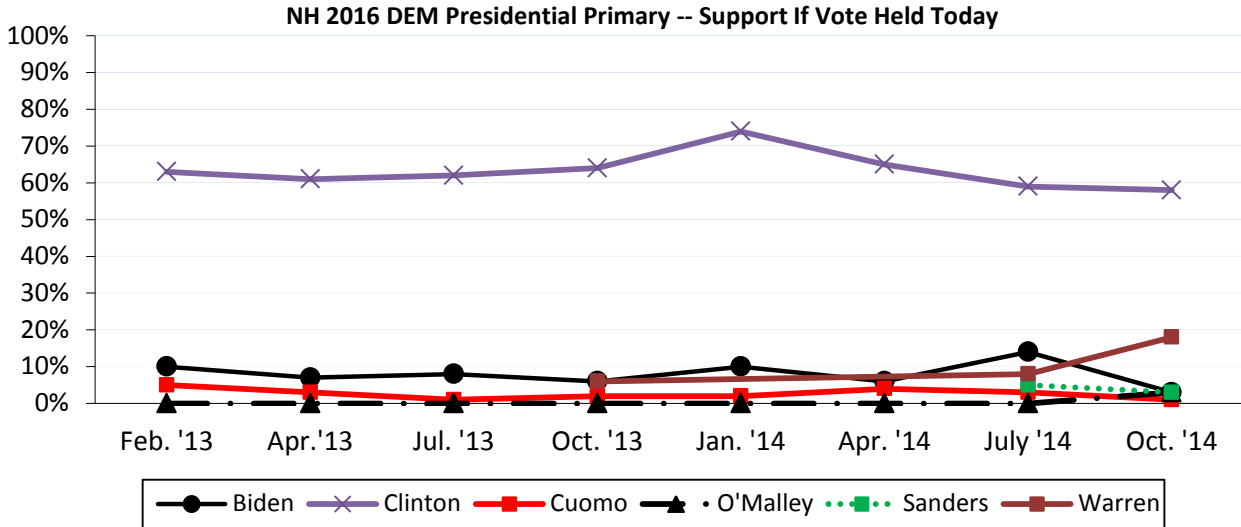
2008 New Hampshire Primary winner Hillary Clinton remains the most popular Democratic candidate by a wide margin. Most likely Democratic Primary voters, 84%, have a favorable opinion of Clinton, only 10% have an unfavorable opinion of her, and 6% are neutral or unsure. Her net favorability rating, the percentage who have a favorable opinion minus those who have an unfavorable opinion, is an extremely high +74%.

Massachusetts Senator Elizabeth Warren also has a high net favorability rating at +58%, an increase of 15 percentage points since July. Potential candidates with moderate net favorability ratings are Vice President Joe Biden (+32%) and Vermont Senator Bernie Sanders (+30%). Maryland Governor Martin O'Malley (+4%) and Virginia Senator Mark Warner (+1%), are less well known and have lower net favorability ratings. Despite being relatively well-known, New York Governor Andrew Cuomo (+5%) has a low net favorability rating, which has continued to slide since last February.



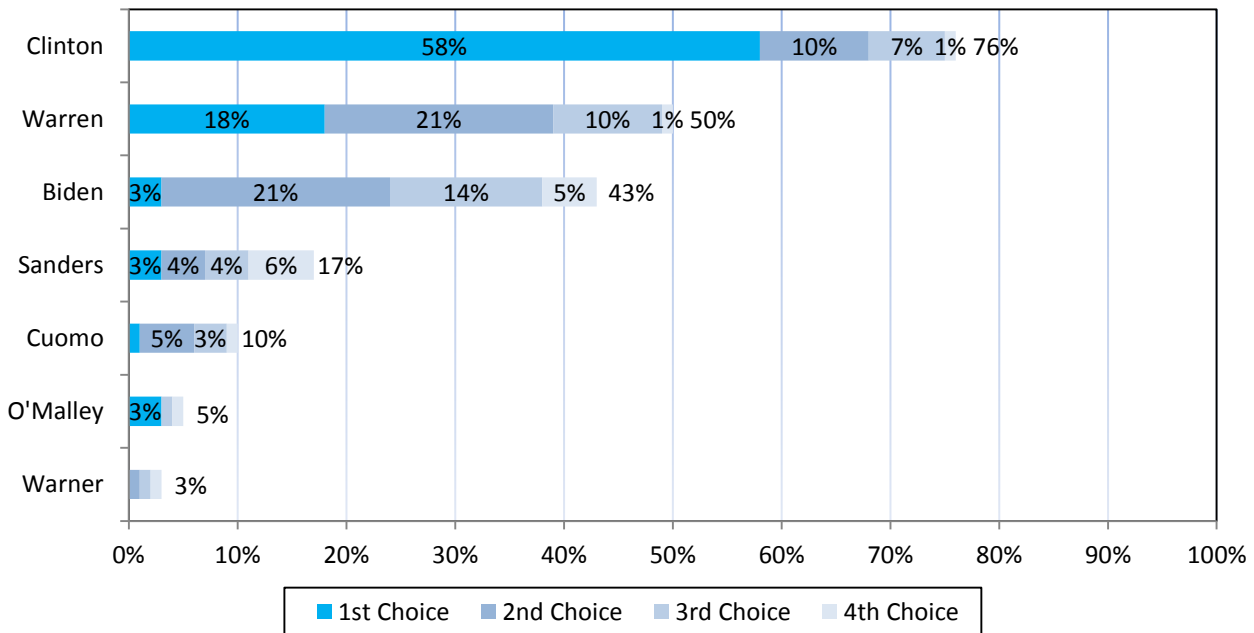
### 2016 NH Democratic Primary Trial Heat

Although the primary will not be held until early 2016, Clinton remains the clear favorite among Democratic voters when they are asked to choose from a list of prospective candidates. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 58% of likely Democratic Primary voters say they would vote for Clinton if the election were held today, 18% prefer Warren, 3% prefer O'Malley, 3% prefer Sanders, 3% prefer Biden and 1% prefer Cuomo. All other potential candidates mentioned received less than 1% support and 13% say they are undecided.



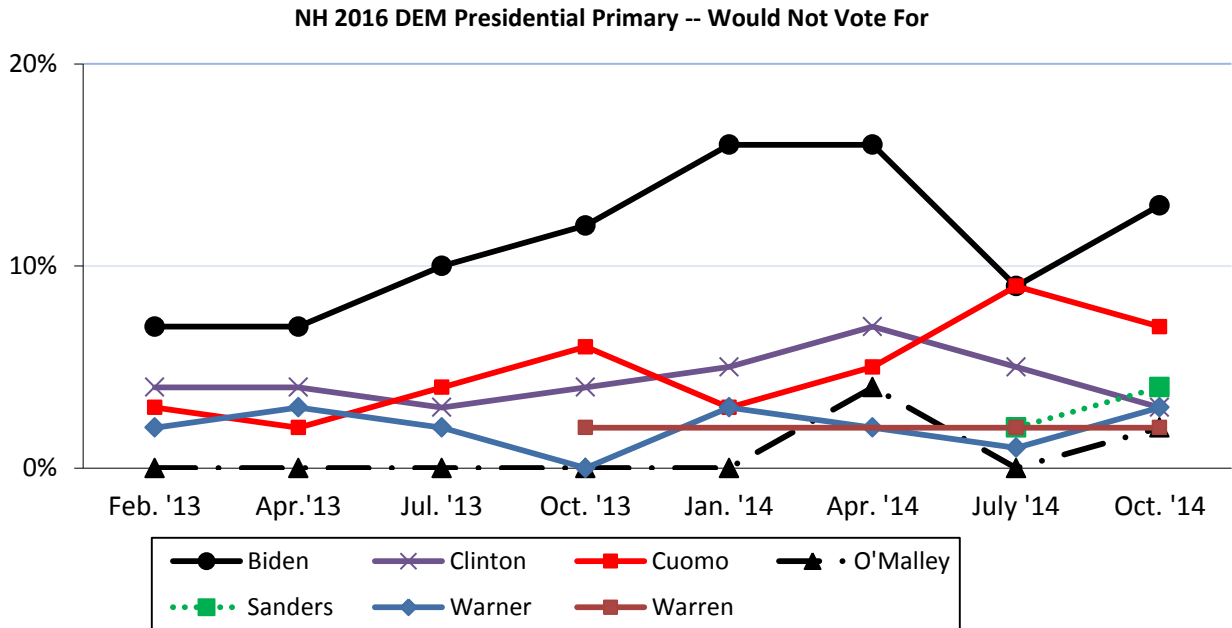
### 2016 NH Democratic Primary with Second, Third & Fourth Choices

While Hillary Clinton is currently the clear favorite in the Democratic field, likely Democrat voters also view Elizabeth Warren and Joe Biden as viable options – When all four choices are combined, 76% of likely primary voters chose Clinton, 50% chose Warren and 43% chose Biden.



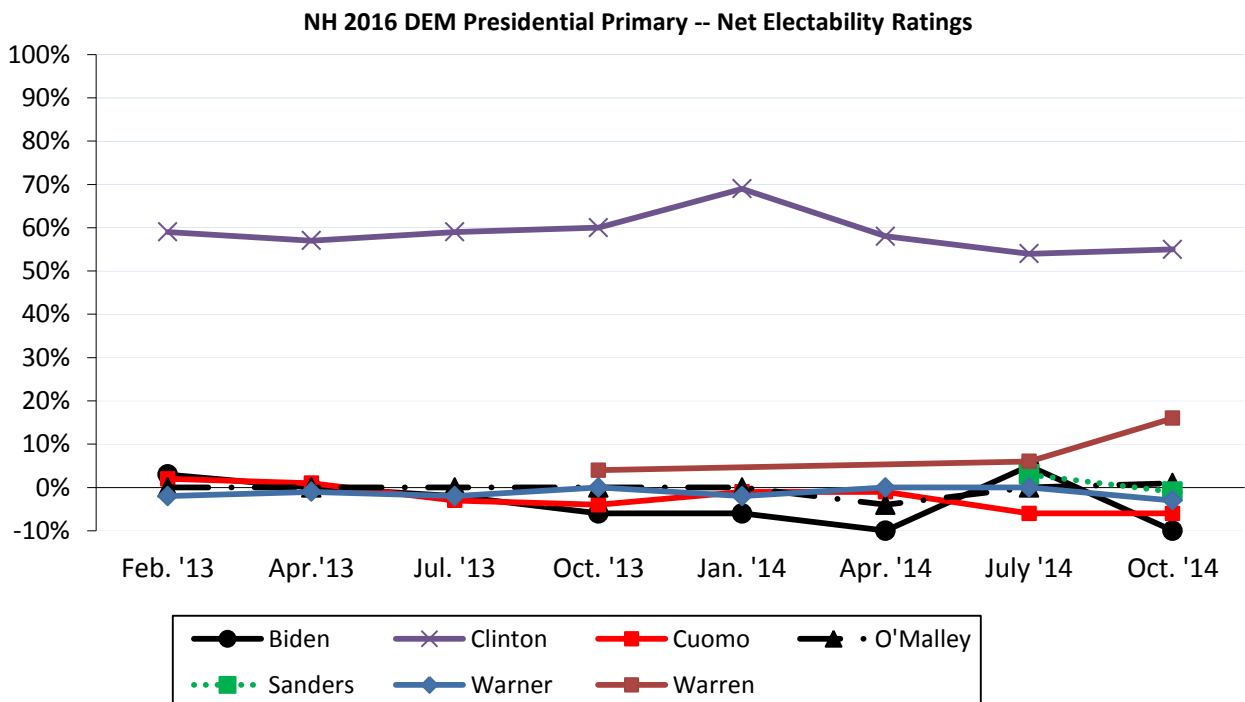
### Most Unpopular Democrat Candidate

Nominations typically go to candidates who are acceptable to most members of their party and not to polarizing figures. When asked which potential candidate they would NOT vote for under any circumstance, 13% of likely Democratic Primary voters say they would not vote for Biden, 7% would not vote for Cuomo, 4% would not vote for Sanders, 3% would not vote for Warner, 3% would not vote for Clinton, 2% would not vote for Warren, 2% would not vote for O'Malley, 1% say they would not vote for some other candidate, 35% think that all of the prospective candidates are acceptable, and 31% are unsure.



### Democrat Net Electability

Clinton has a wide lead in net electability (the percentage who support a candidate minus the percentage who would not vote for that candidate under any circumstances) at +55%. Warren (+16%), and O'Malley (+1%) have positive electability ratings while Sanders (-1%), Warner (-3%), Cuomo (-6%), and Biden (-10%) have negative ratings.



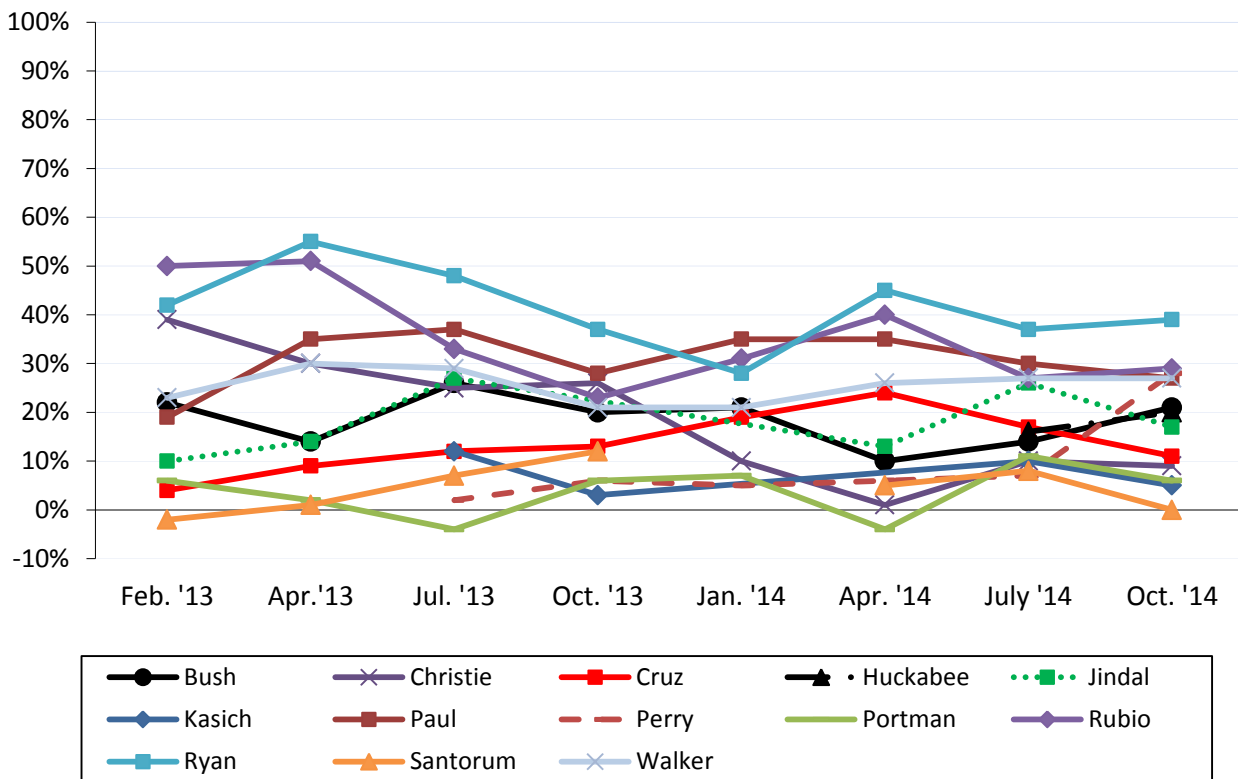
## GOP Favorability Ratings

Typically, the Republican front-runner in New Hampshire is the candidate who finished second in the prior nomination struggle. Past examples include Mitt Romney in 2012, John McCain in 2008, Bob Dole in 1996, George H.W. Bush in 1988, and Ronald Reagan in 1980. But in this cycle, no Republican candidate has the “next in line” mantle. Furthermore, most of the Republicans who are considering runs in 2016 are largely unknown to Republican voters. Wisconsin Congressman Paul Ryan continues to lead the field in net favorability as he was the vice presidential candidate in 2012. Ryan is viewed favorably by 51% of likely Republican Primary voters, 12% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 37% are neutral or don’t know. Ryan’s net favorability rating is +39%.

Other GOP candidates with moderate net favorability ratings include Florida Senator Marco Rubio (+29%), Texas Governor Rick Perry (+28%), Kentucky Senator Rand Paul (+27%), Wisconsin Governor Scott Walker (+27%), former Florida Governor Jeb Bush (+21%) and former Arkansas Governor Mike Huckabee (20%). Perry, who has been in the news often in recent months, has seen his net favorability increase significantly since July.

New Jersey Governor Chris Christie (+9%), former Pennsylvania Senator Rick Santorum (0%), and have low net favorability ratings, despite most Republican Primary voters knowing them. Louisiana Governor Bobby Jindal (+17%), Texas Senator Ted Cruz (+11%), Ohio Senator Rob Portman (+6%) and Ohio Governor John Kasich (+5%) have low net favorability ratings, but they also are not well known.

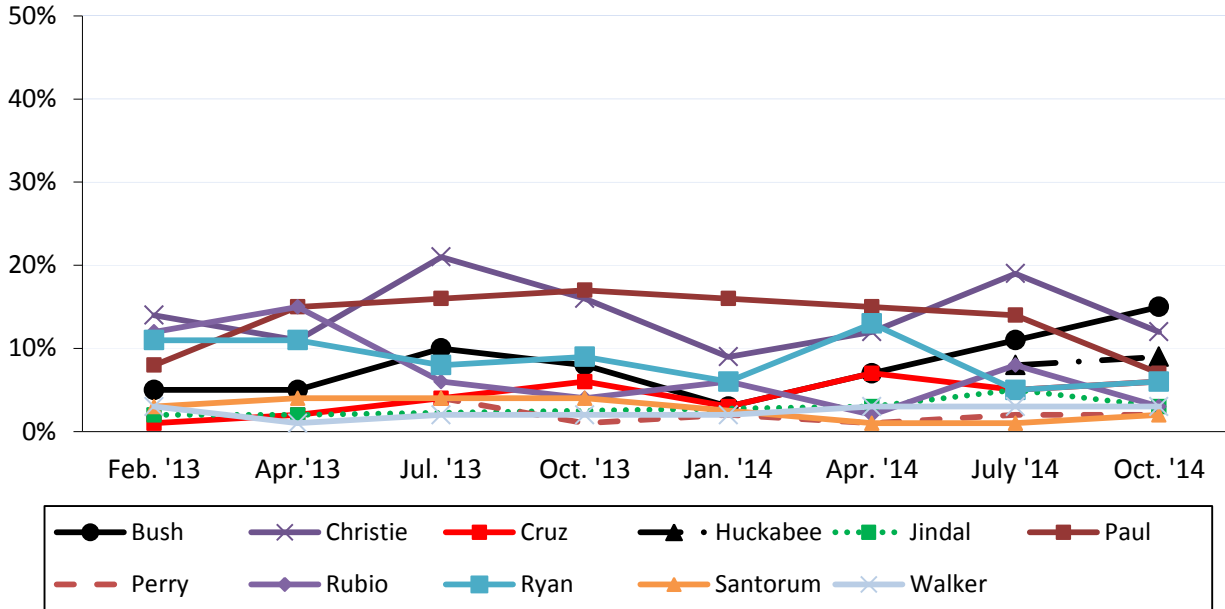
**NH 2016 GOP Presidential Primary -- Net Favorability Ratings**



### 2016 NH Republican Primary

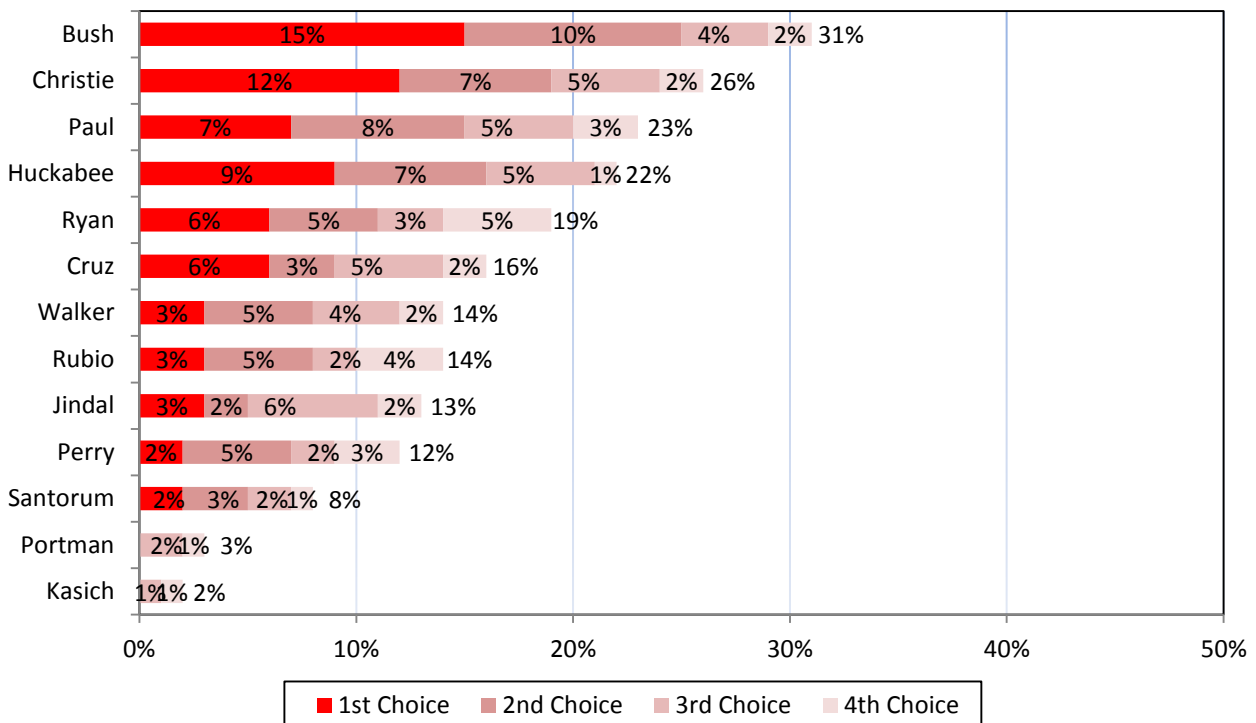
The Republican field continues to be muddled with no candidate exceeding 15% of the vote. If the election were held today, 15% of likely Republican Primary voters say they would vote for Jeb Bush, 12% would vote for Christie, 9% for Huckabee, 7% for Paul, 6% for Ryan, 6% for Cruz, 3% for Rubio, 3% for Jindal, 3% for Walker, 2% for Perry, and 2% for Santorum. All other potential candidates receive less than 1% support, and 28% say they are undecided.

NH 2016 GOP Presidential Primary -- Support If Vote Held Today



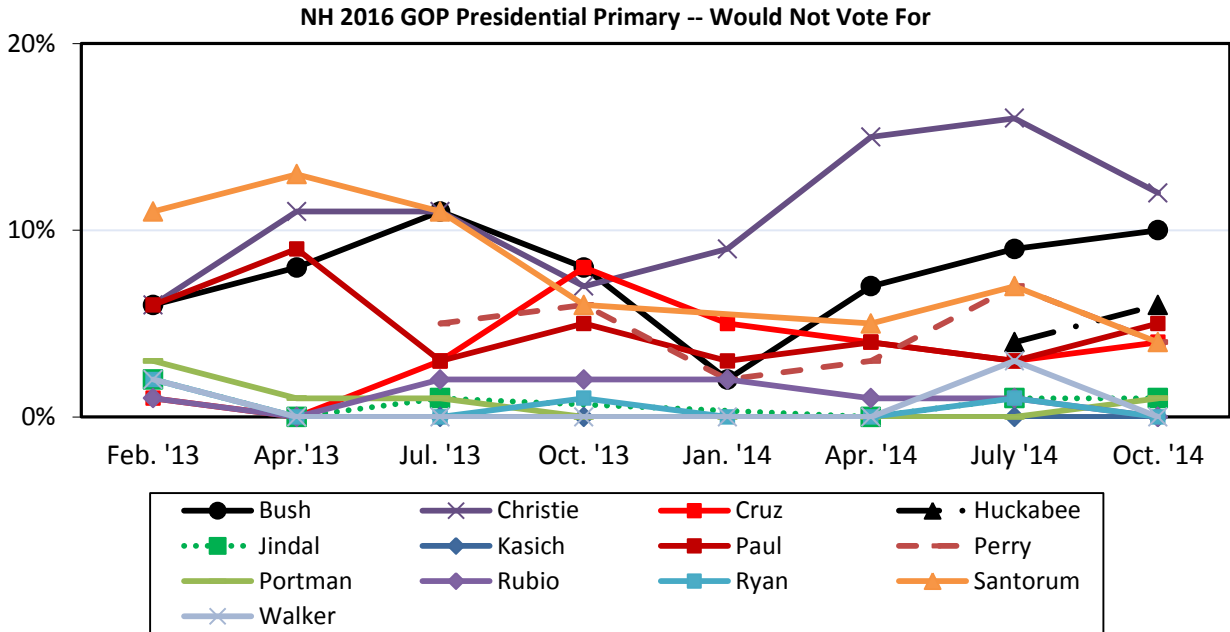
### 2016 NH Republican Primary with Second, Third And Fourth Choices

Asking likely primary voters for their second, third and fourth choices does not clarify the GOP picture --- With all four choices combined, 31% chose Bush, 26% chose Christie, 23% chose Paul and 22% chose Huckabee.



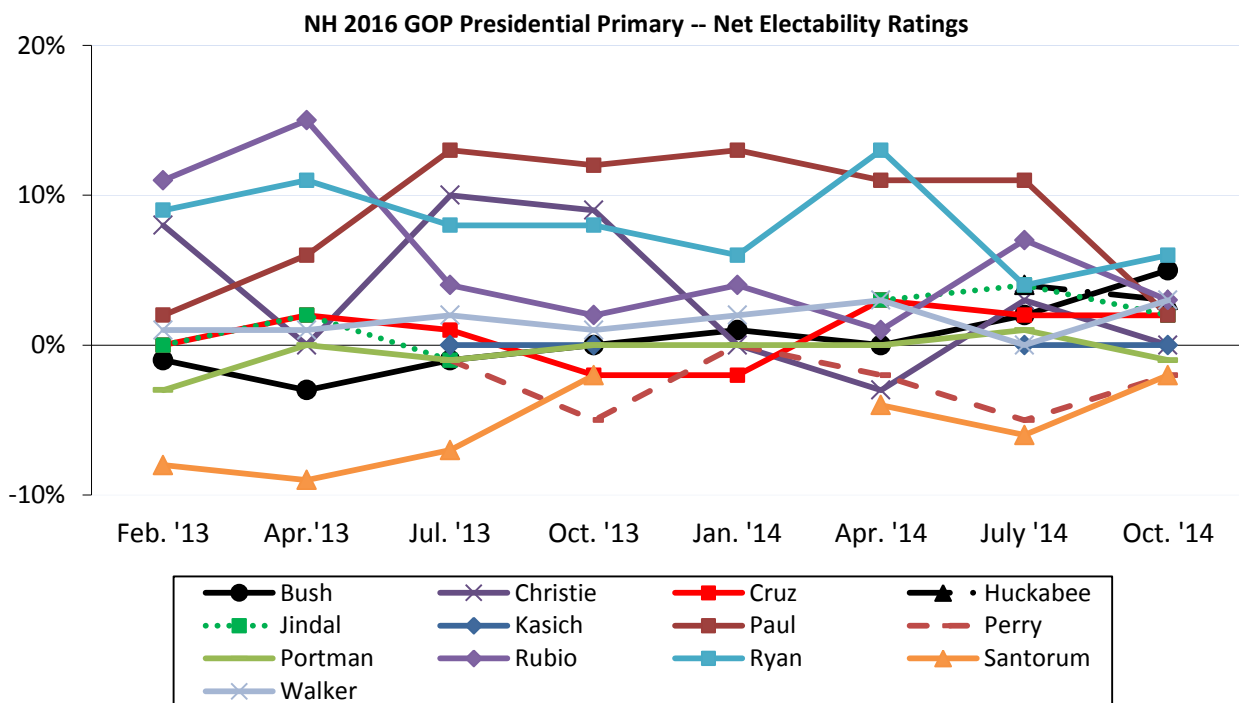
### Most Unpopular Republican Candidate

When asked which candidate they would NOT vote for under any circumstance, 12% of likely Republican Primary voters say they would not vote for Christie, 10% would not vote for Bush, 6% would not vote for Huckabee, 5% would not vote for Paul, 4% would not vote for Santorum, 4% would not vote for Perry, 4% would not vote for Cruz, 1% would not vote for Jindal, 1% would not vote for Portman, 17% think all the prospective candidates are acceptable, and 34% are unsure.



### Republican Net Electability

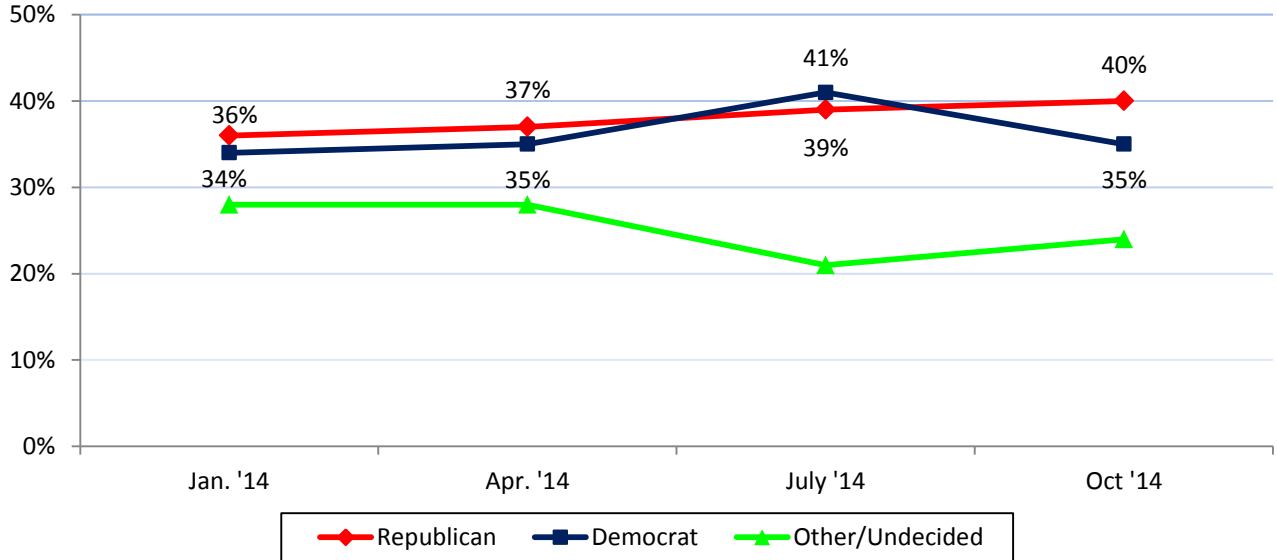
When looking at electability scores, Republicans are unlike Democrats in that there is no clear leader -- Ryan (+6%), Bush (+5%), Walker (+3%), Rubio (+3%), Huckabee (+3%), Cruz (+2%), Paul (+2%), and Jindal (+2%) all have positive net electability scores. Christie (0%), Kasich (0%), Portman (-1%), Perry (-2%) and Santorum (-2%) have either neutral or negative net electability scores.



### Generic 2016 Presidential Election

Though the 2016 general election is more than two years away, if the election was held today, 40% of New Hampshire residents say they would vote for the Republican candidate, 35% would vote for the Democratic candidate, 3% would vote for another party and 21% are undecided. At this same time in the 2008 cycle, 42% said they would vote for the Democratic candidate, 32% said they would vote for the Republican candidate, 2% would vote for another party and 23% were undecided.

## Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred and eighty-one (681) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between September 29 and October 5, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.8 percent. Included in the sample were 275 likely 2016 Republican Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 5.9%) and 234 likely 2016 Democratic Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 6.4%).

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, age, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
