### CLINTON SLIPS IN NH, ROMNEY THE GOP FRONTRUNNER?

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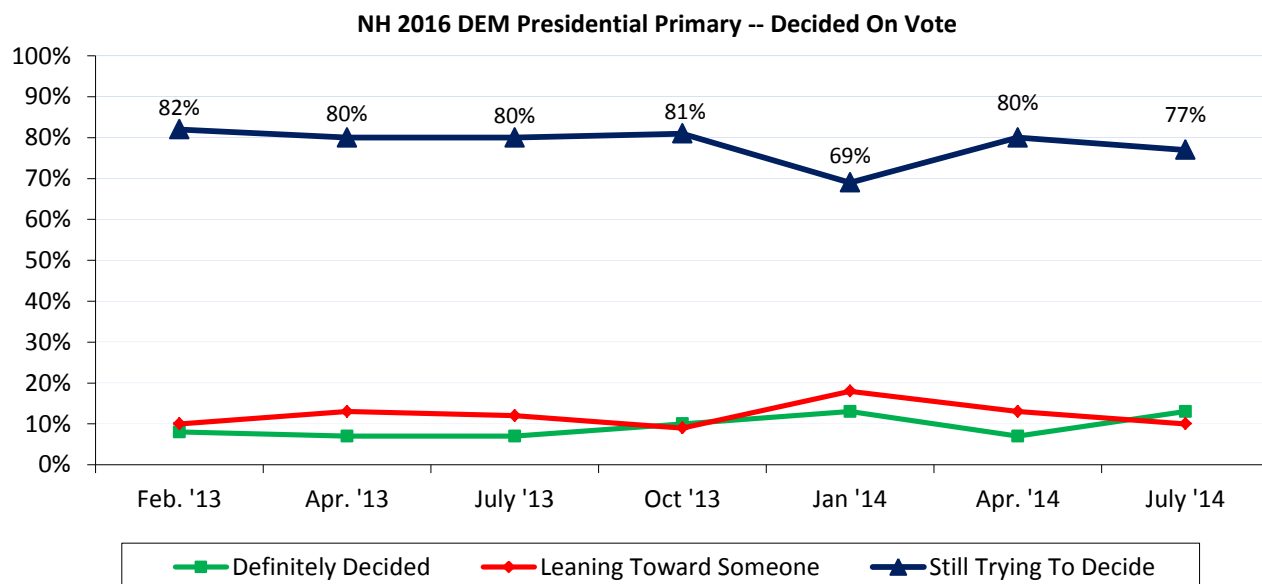
DURHAM, NH –Hillary Clinton remains the frontrunner in the 2016 New Hampshire Primary, but her lead over her Democratic rivals has shrunk in recent months. On the Republican side, there is no frontrunner, but if 2012 nominee Mitt Romney were to get into the race, he would lead by a significant margin. Very few voters have made up their minds about who to vote for in the 2016 New Hampshire Primary.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,\* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred and sixty-nine (669) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between June 19 and July 1, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.8 percent. Included in the sample were 251 likely 2016 Republican Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 6.2%) and 257 likely 2016 Democratic Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 6.1%).

#### NH Voters Are Very Undecided

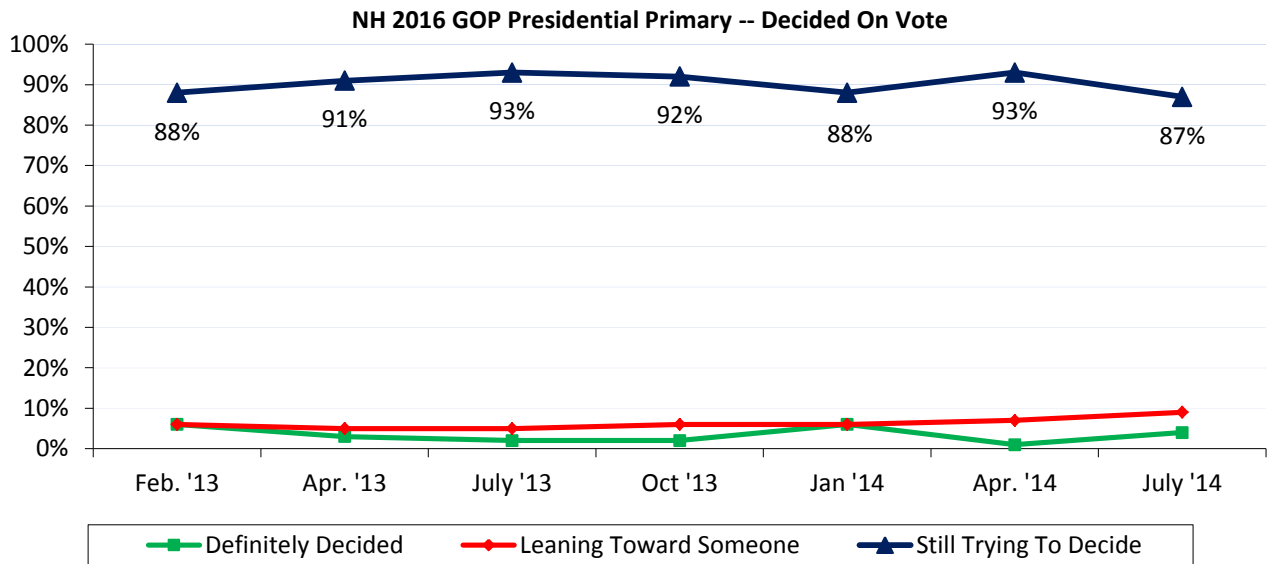
With less than two years until the First in the Nation New Hampshire Presidential Primary, prospective Republican and Democratic candidates have been testing the waters here for presidential runs in 2016. While many of the candidates discussed in this poll will decide not to run, and others may enter who were not discussed, candidates who are the early identified frontrunners have typically won past New Hampshire primaries.

New Hampshire primary voters typically decide who they will vote for in the last weeks, or days of the campaign and it is no surprise that very few voters currently have made up their minds about who they will support in 2016. Currently, only 13% of likely Democratic primary voters say they have definitely decided who they will support, 10% are leaning toward a candidate, but the great majority of voters (77%) are still trying to decide who to support.

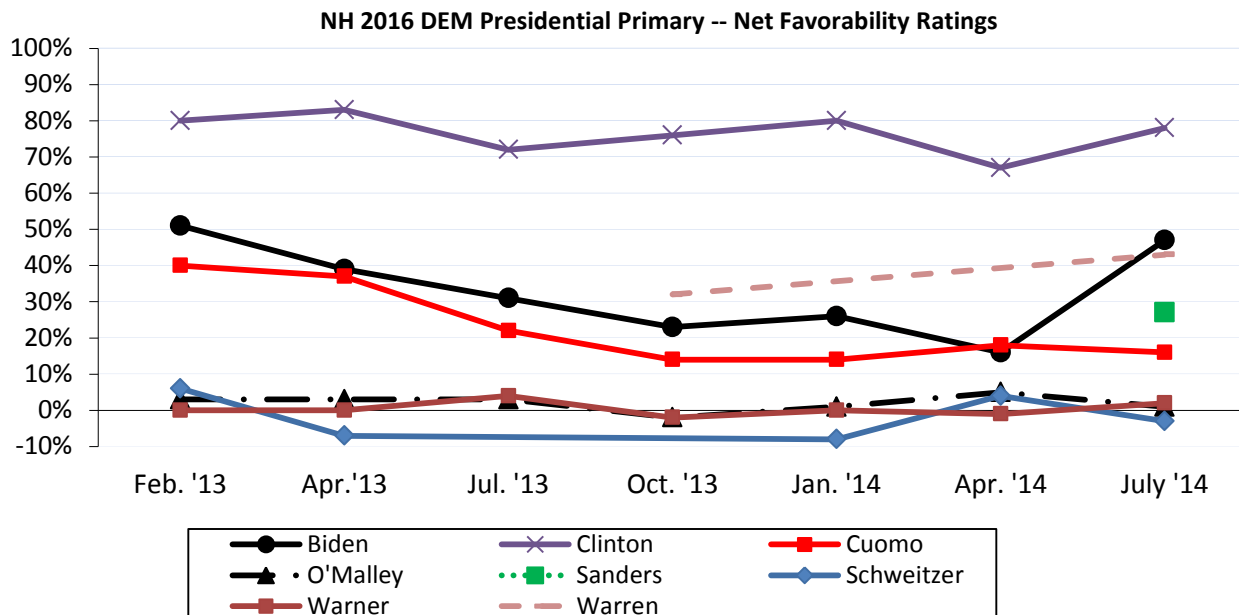
Republican voters are even less sure than Democrats. Only 4% of likely Republican Primary voters say they have definitely decided who they will support, 9% are leaning toward a candidate, and 87% are still trying to decide.



### Democratic Favorability Ratings

2008 New Hampshire Primary winner Hillary Clinton remains the most popular Democratic candidate by a wide margin. Most likely Democratic Primary voters, 87%, have a favorable opinion of Clinton, only 9% have an unfavorable opinion of her, and 3% are neutral or unsure. Her net favorability rating, the percentage who have a favorable opinion minus those who have an unfavorable opinion, is an extremely high +78%.

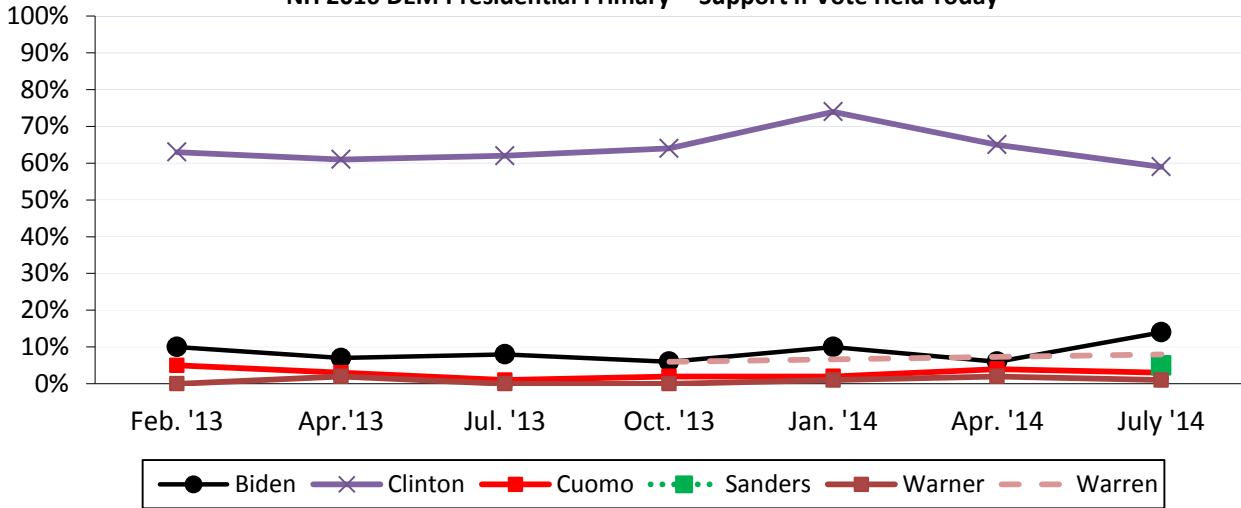
Potential Democratic candidates that have moderate net favorability ratings are Vice President Joe Biden (+47%), Massachusetts Senator Elizabeth Warren (+43%) and Vermont Senator Bernie Sanders (+27%). Biden's net favorability has rebounded dramatically after hitting a low of +16% in April. Meanwhile Virginia Senator Mark Warner (+2%), Maryland Governor Martin O'Malley (+1%) and former Montana Governor Brian Schweitzer (-3%) are less well known and have lower net favorability ratings. New York Governor Andrew Cuomo (+16%) has a low net favorability rating despite being relatively well known.



### 2016 NH Democratic Primary Trial Heat

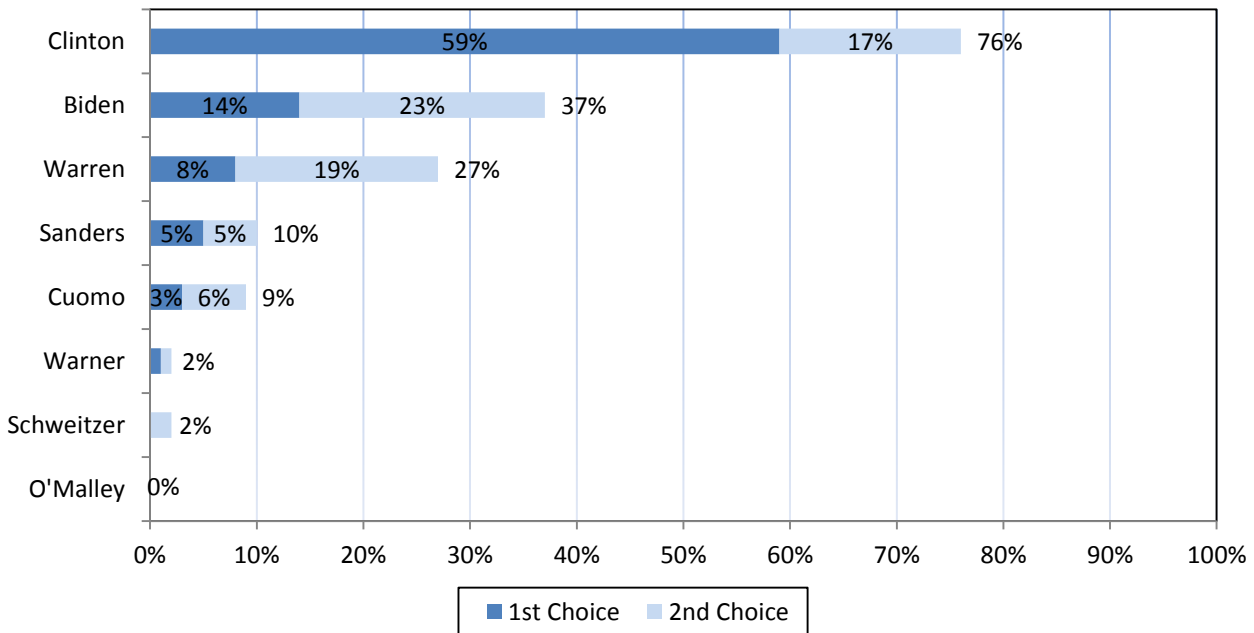
Although the primary will not be held until early 2016, Clinton remains the clear favorite among Democratic voters when they are asked to choose from a list of prospective candidates. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 59% of likely Democratic Primary voters say they would vote for Clinton if the election were held today, 14% prefer Biden, 8% prefer Warren, 5% prefer Sanders, 3% prefer Andrew Cuomo and 1% prefer Warner. All other potential candidates mentioned received less than 1% support and 9% say they are undecided. While Clinton still has a commanding lead over the field, her support has decreased 15 percentage points from 74% January. This drop mirrors a recent nationwide Quinnipiac poll.

### 2016 NH Democratic Primary With Second Choice

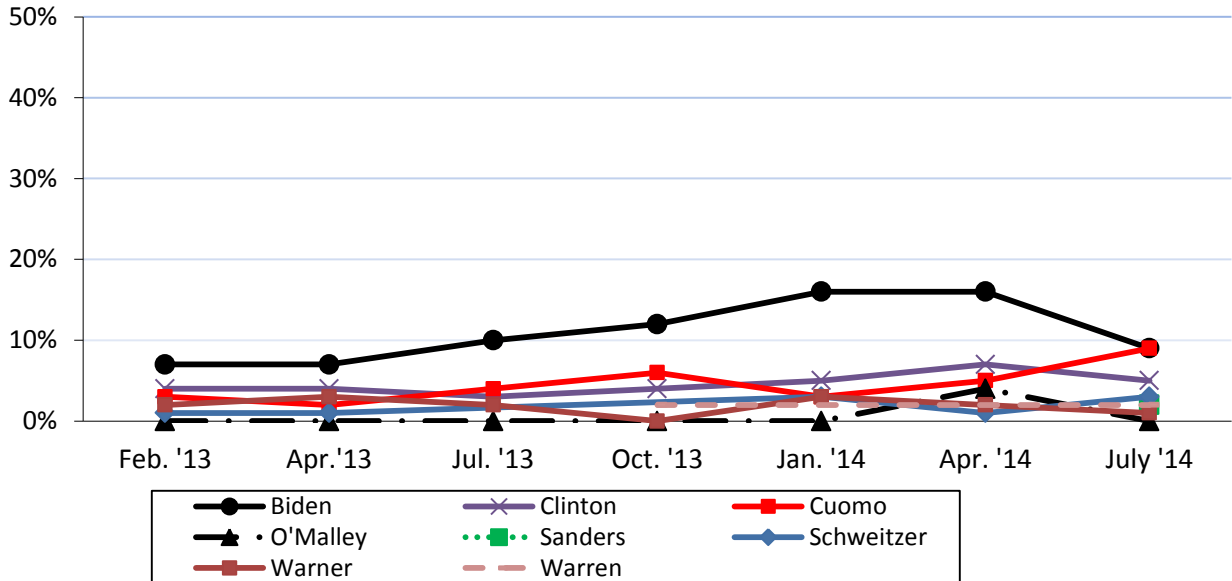
When asked who their second choice would be, 23% chose Biden, 19% chose Warren, 17% chose Clinton, 6% chose Cuomo, 5% chose Sanders, 2% chose Schweitzer, and 1% chose Warner.



### Most Unpopular Democrat Candidate

Nominations typically go to candidates who are acceptable to most members of their party and not to polarizing figures. When asked which potential candidate they would NOT vote for under any circumstance, 9% of likely Democratic Primary voters say they would not vote for Biden, 9% would not vote for Cuomo, 5% would not vote for Clinton, 3% would not vote for Schweitzer, 2% would not vote for Sanders, 2% would not vote for Warren, 1% would not vote for Warner, 1% say they would not vote for some other candidate, 29% think that all of the prospective candidates are acceptable, and 38% are unsure.

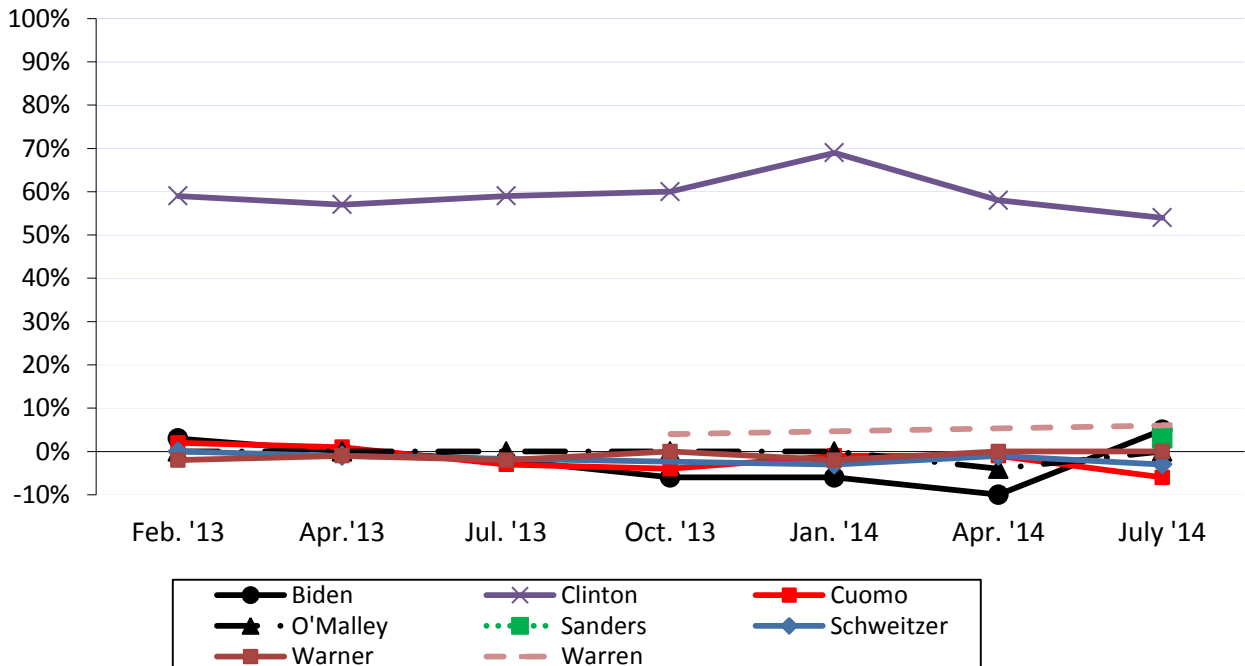
NH 2016 DEM Presidential Primary -- Would Not Vote For



### Democrat Net Electability

Clinton has a wide lead in net electability (the percentage who support a candidate minus the percentage who would not vote for that candidate under any circumstances) at +54%. Warren (+6%), Biden (+5%), and Sanders (+3%) all have positive electability ratings while O'Malley (0%), Warner (0%), Schweitzer (-3%), and Cuomo (-5%) have neutral or negative ratings.

NH 2016 DEM Presidential Primary -- Net Electability Ratings



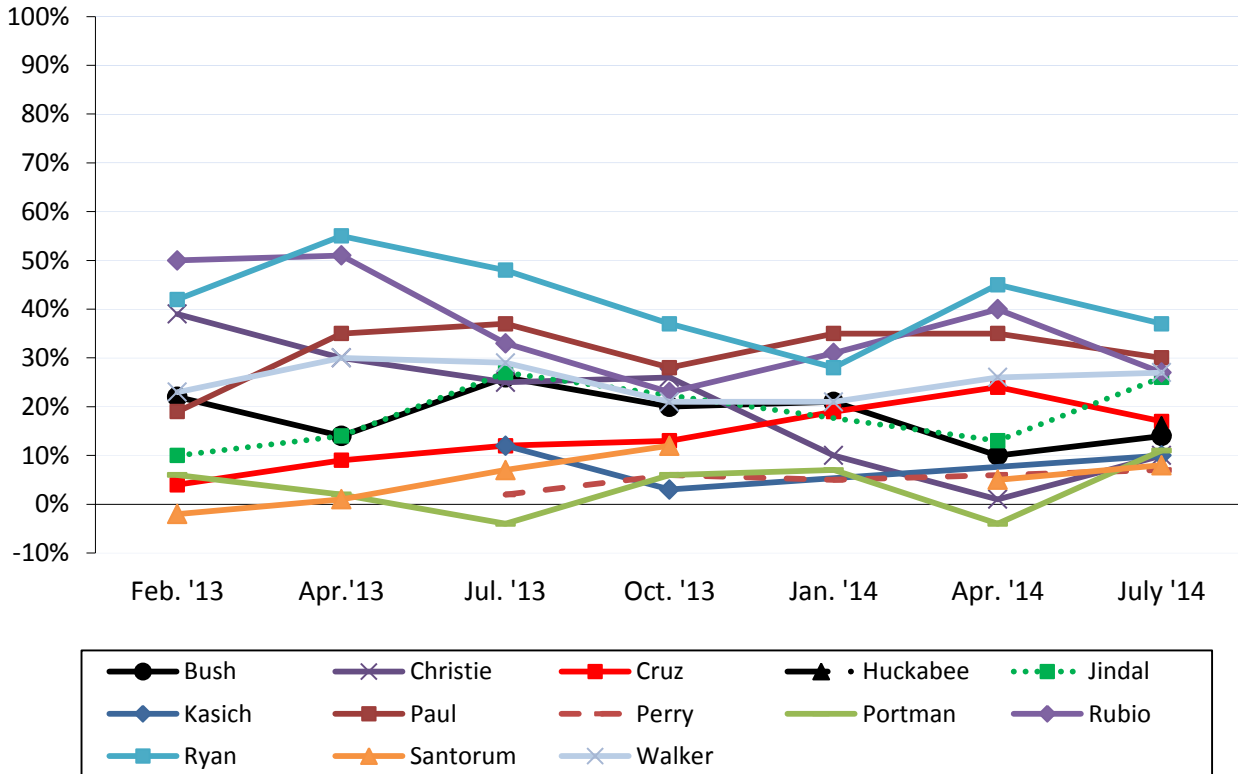
## GOP Favorability Ratings

Typically, the Republican front-runner in New Hampshire is the candidate who finished second in the prior nomination struggle. Past examples include Mitt Romney in 2012, John McCain in 2008, Bob Dole in 1996, George H.W. Bush in 1988, and Ronald Reagan in 1980. But in this cycle, no Republican candidate has the “next in line” mantle. Furthermore, most of the Republicans who are considering runs in 2016 are largely unknown to Republican voters. Wisconsin Congressman Paul Ryan continues to lead the field in net favorability as he was the vice presidential candidate in 2012. Ryan is viewed favorably by 55% of likely Republican Primary voters, 18% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 26% are neutral or don't know. Ryan's net favorability rating is +37%.

Other GOP candidates with moderate net favorability ratings include Kentucky Senator Rand Paul (+30%), Florida Senator Marco Rubio (+27%), Wisconsin Governor Scott Walker (+27%), and Louisiana Governor Bobby Jindal (+26%).

Former Arkansas Governor Mike Huckabee (16%), former Florida Governor Jeb Bush (+14%), New Jersey Governor Chris Christie (+10%), former Pennsylvania Senator Rick Santorum (+8%), and Texas Governor Rick Perry (+7%) have low net favorability ratings, despite most Republican Primary voters knowing them. Texas Senator Ted Cruz (+17%), Ohio Senator Rob Portman (+11%) and Ohio Governor John Kasich (+10%) have low net favorability ratings, but they also are not well known.

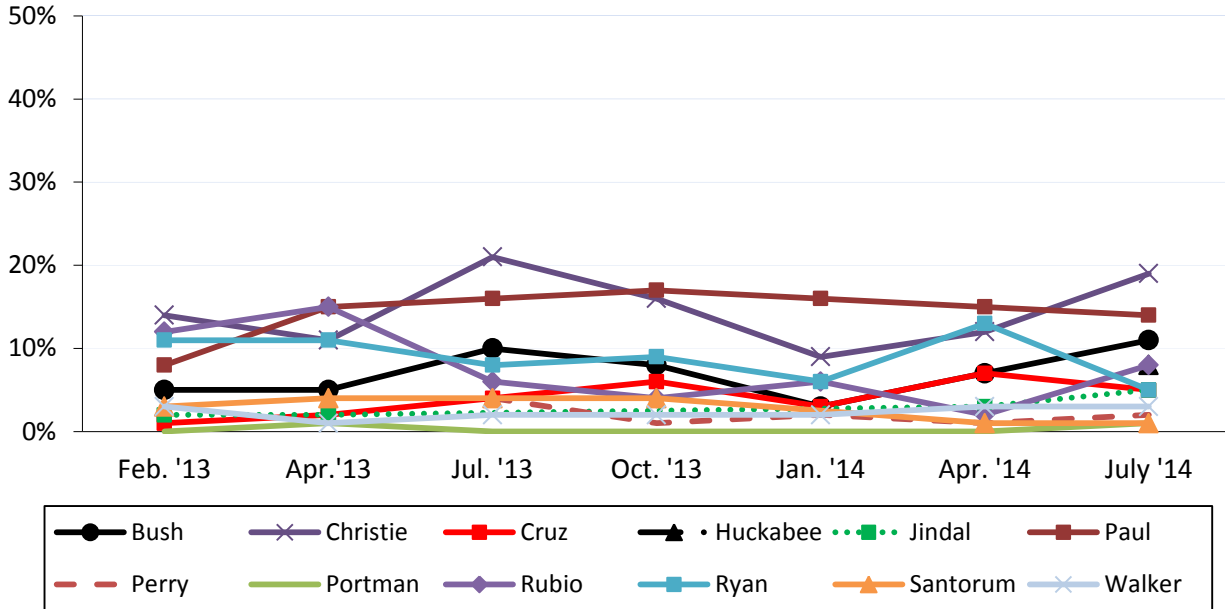
**NH 2016 GOP Presidential Primary -- Net Favorability Ratings**



### 2016 NH Republican Primary

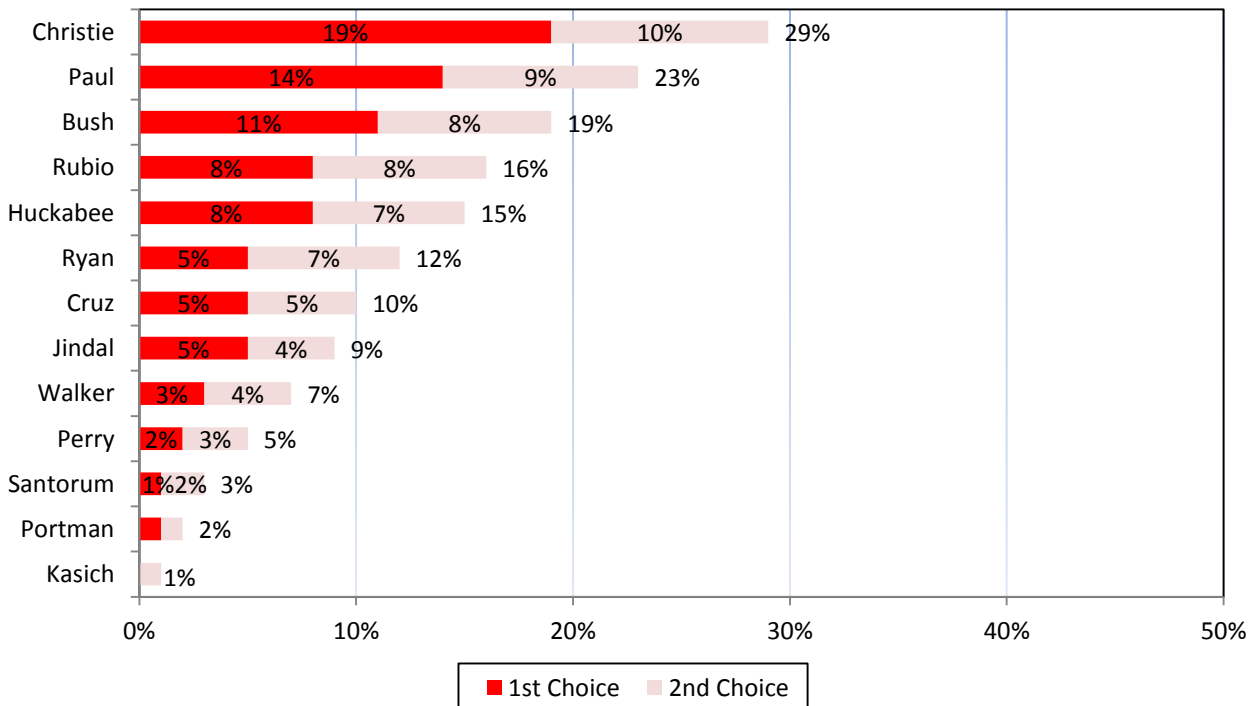
No potential Republican candidate has been able to separate from the tightly bunched field. If the election were held today, 19% of likely Republican Primary voters say they would vote for Christie, 14% would vote for Paul, 11% for Bush, 8% for Rubio, 5% for Jindal, 5% for Cruz, 3% for Walker, 2% for Perry, 1% for Portman, and 1% for Santorum. All other potential candidates receive less than 1% support, and 15% say they are undecided.

NH 2016 GOP Presidential Primary -- Support If Vote Held Today



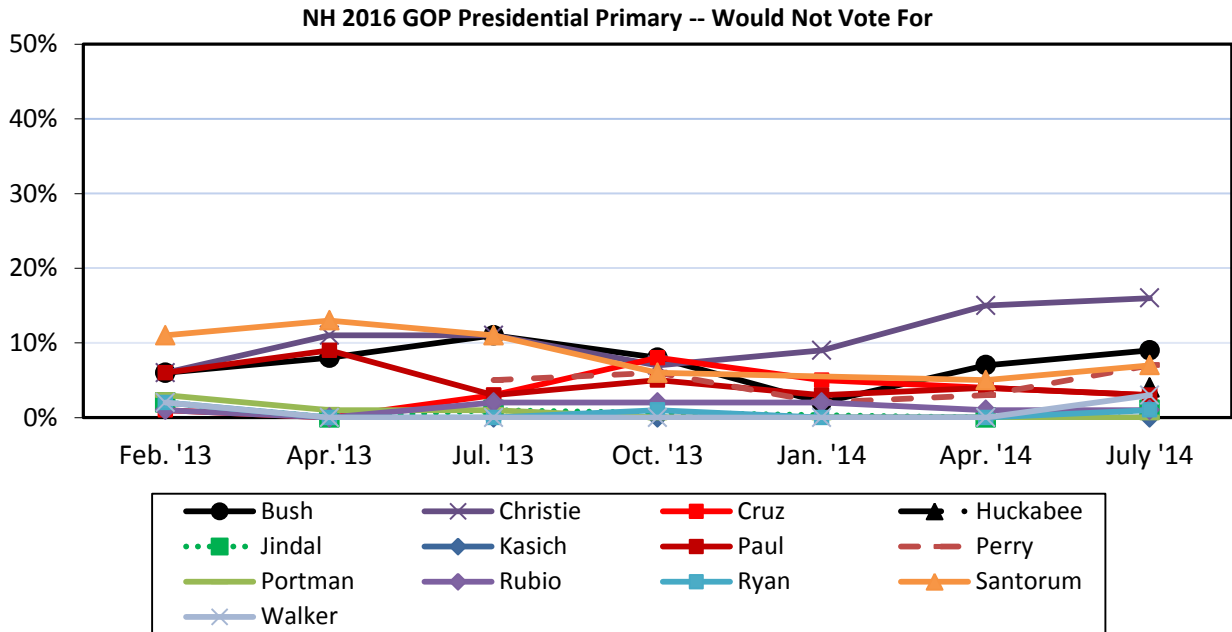
### 2016 NH Republican Primary with Second Choice

When asked who their second choice would be, 10% chose Christie, 9% chose Paul, 8% chose Rubio, 8% chose Bush, 7% chose Huckabee, 7% chose Ryan, 5% chose Cruz, 4% chose Jindal, 4% chose Walker, 3% chose Perry, 2% chose Santorum, 1% chose Portman and 1% chose Kasich.



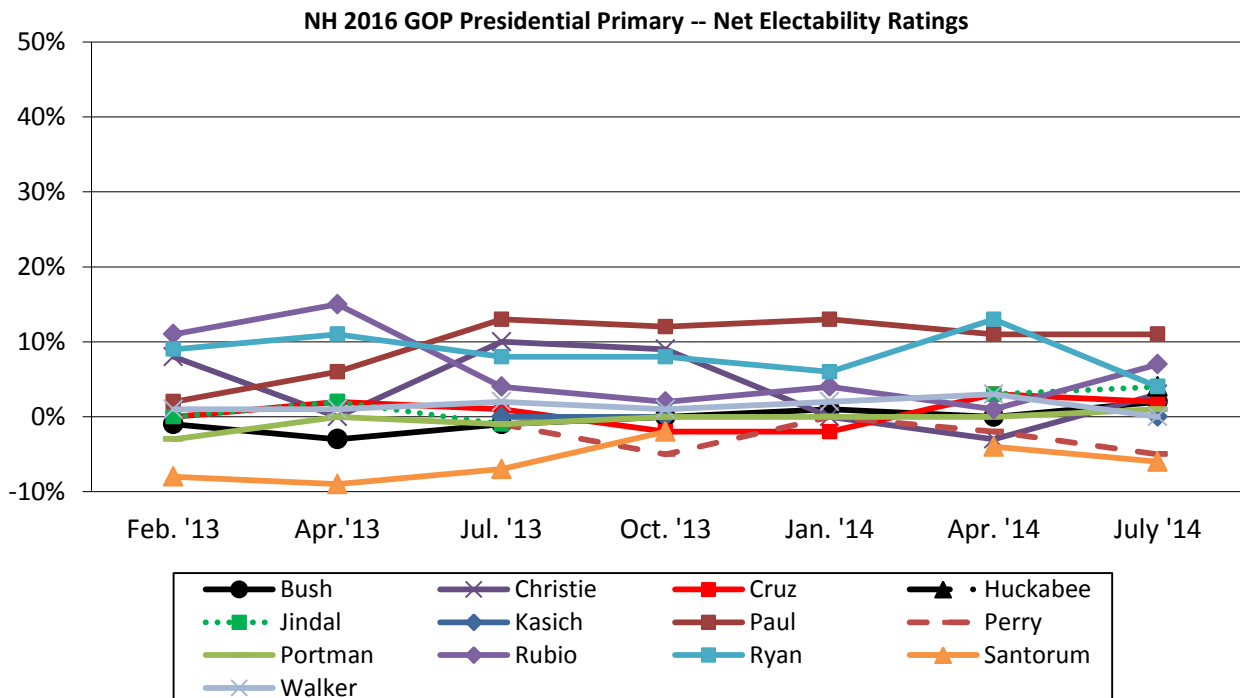
### Most Unpopular Republican Candidate

When asked which candidate they would NOT vote for under any circumstance, 16% of likely Republican Primary voters say they would not vote for Christie, 9% would not vote for Bush, 7% would not vote for Santorum, 7% would not vote for Perry, 4% would not vote for Huckabee, 3% would not vote for Cruz, 3% would not vote for Paul, 3% would not vote for Walker, 1% would not vote for Jindal, 1% would not vote for Ryan, 1% would not vote for Rubio, 23% think all the prospective candidates are acceptable, and 21% are unsure.



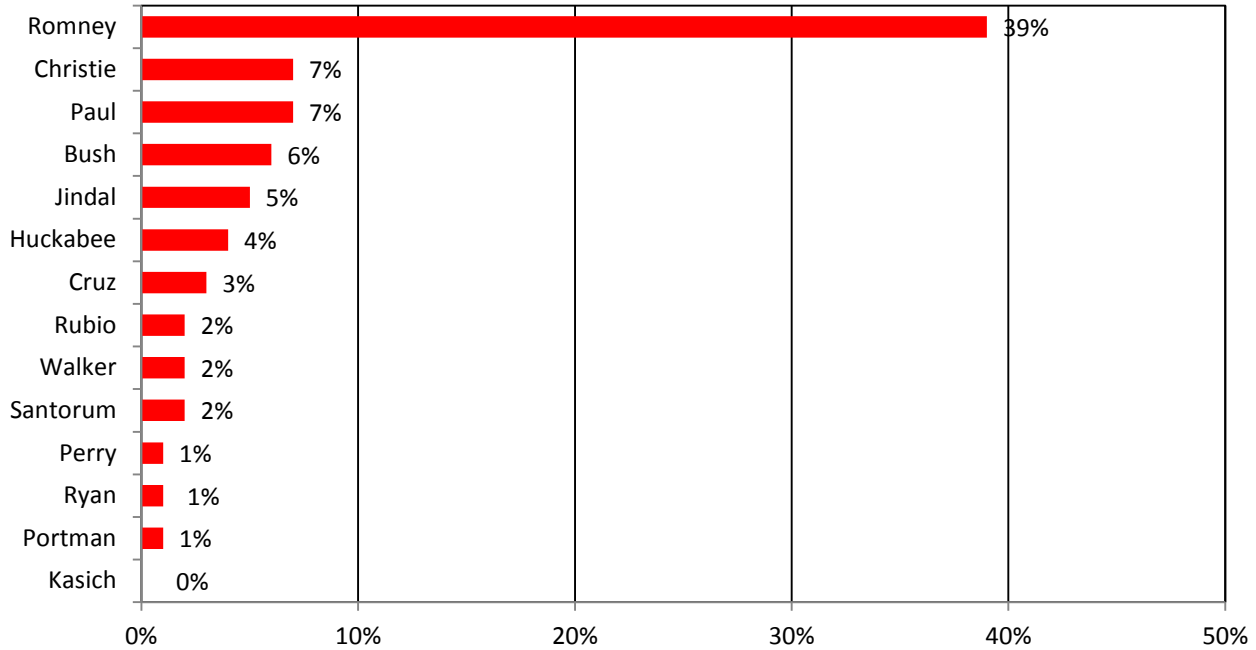
### Republican Net Electability

When looking at electability scores, Republicans are unlike Democrats in that there is no clear leader -- Paul (+11%), Rubio (+7%), Jindal (+4%), Ryan (+4%), Huckabee (+4%), Christie (+3%), Bush (+2%), Cruz (+2%), and Portman (+1%) all have positive net electability scores. Kasich (0%), Walker (0%), Perry (-5%) and Santorum (-6%) have either neutral or negative net electability scores.



### The Romney Effect

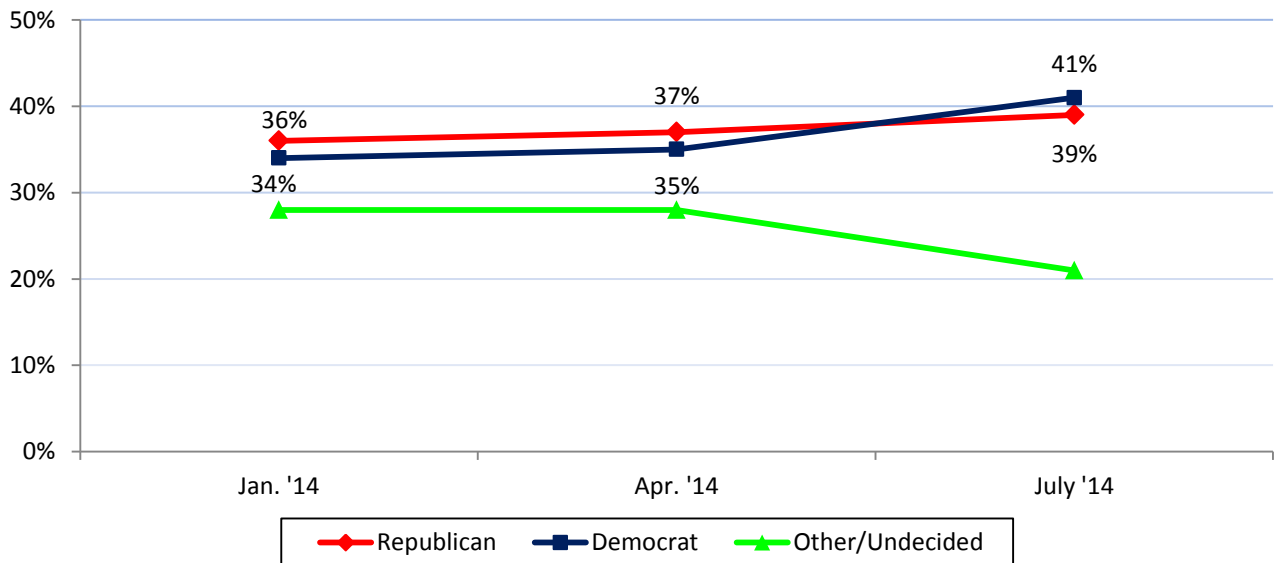
There has been recent speculation over whether Mitt Romney will run again for President in 2016, although Romney himself reiterated that he had no plans to run again during a recent stop in New Hampshire. However, when Romney is added to the list of potential Republican candidates, 39% of likely GOP primary voters say they would vote for him while all other Republicans fall to below 10%.



### Generic 2016 Presidential Election

Though the 2016 general election is more than two years away, if the election was held today, 41% of New Hampshire residents say they would vote for the Democratic candidate, 39% would vote for the Republican candidate, 3% would vote for another party and 21% are undecided. At this same time in the 2008 cycle, 38% said they would vote for the Democratic candidate, 33% said they would vote for the Republican candidate, and 28% were undecided.

## Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred and sixty-nine (669) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between June 19 and July 1, 2014. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.8 percent. Included in the sample were 251 likely 2016 Republican Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 6.2%) and 257 likely 2016 Democratic Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 6.1%).

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, age, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
