SANDERS, BIDEN & WARREN EARLY DEMOCRATIC FRONTRUNNERS; TRUMP NOT CONSENSUS CHOICE IN GOP PRIMARY

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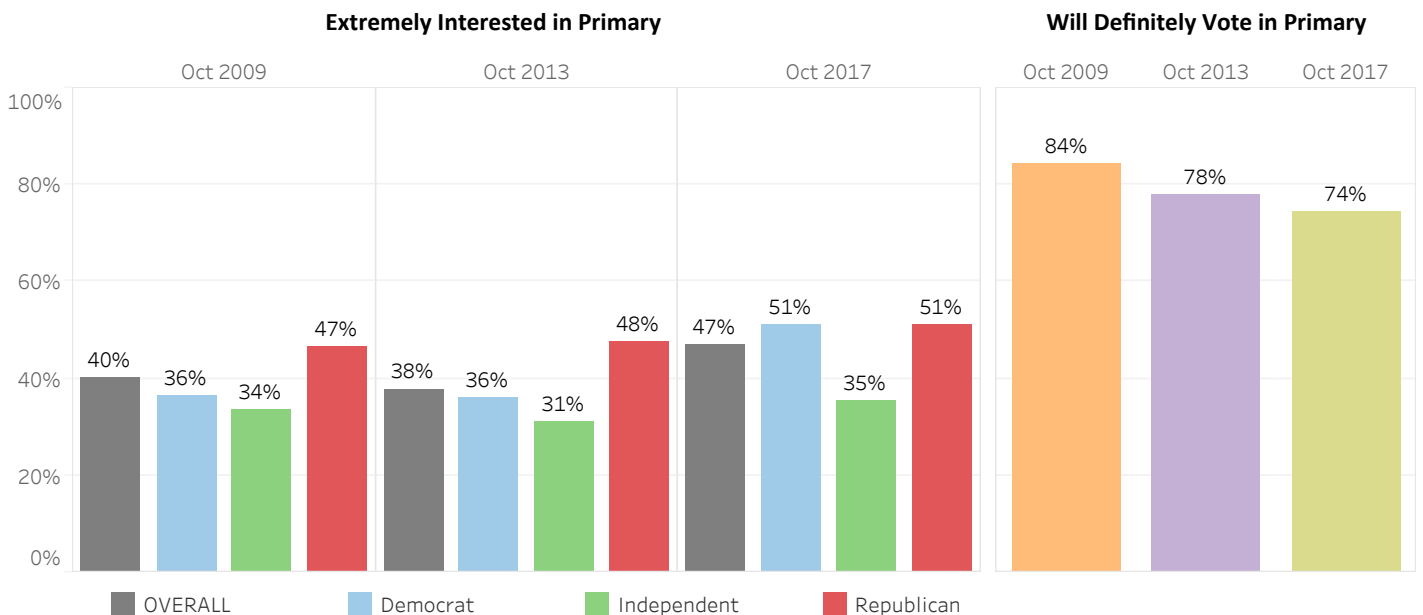
DURHAM, NH – While nearly all likely Democratic primary voters are still trying to make up their minds in the 2020 New Hampshire Presidential Primary, Bernie Sanders, Joe Biden, and Elizabeth Warren are the early frontrunners. More than three-quarters of Republicans are still trying to decide whom to support, and just under half say they currently plan on voting for Donald Trump, considerably lower than the proportion of Democrats who planned on voting for Barack Obama in October 2009. Interest in the 2020 primary is quite high and greater than at this point in the last two electoral cycles.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and seventy-three (573) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between October 3 and October 15, 2017. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.1 percent. Included in the sample were 191 likely 2020 Republican Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 7.1 percent) and 212 likely 2020 Democratic Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 6.7 percent).

Interest in 2020 New Hampshire Presidential Primary

With more than two years until the 2020 NH Presidential Primary, nearly half of Granite Staters (47%) say they are extremely interested in the primary, while just over a quarter (27%) are very interested, 18% are somewhat interested, and 8% are not very interested. Interest in the 2020 primary is slightly higher than in October 2013 and October 2009, the last two similar points in the presidential electoral cycle.

Democrats (51%) and Republicans (51%) are equally likely to say they are extremely interested, while only 35% of Independents are extremely interested. Democrats in particular are far more interested than they were in October 2013. While respondents say they are slightly more interested in the presidential primary than at the same moment in previous electoral cycles, slightly fewer respondents currently say they will definitely vote the primary.

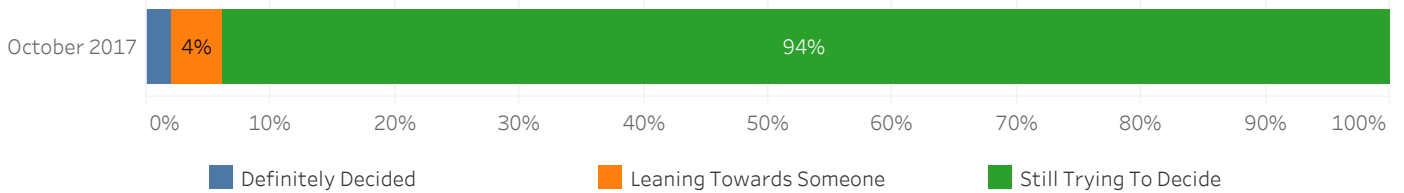

2020 Democratic Primary

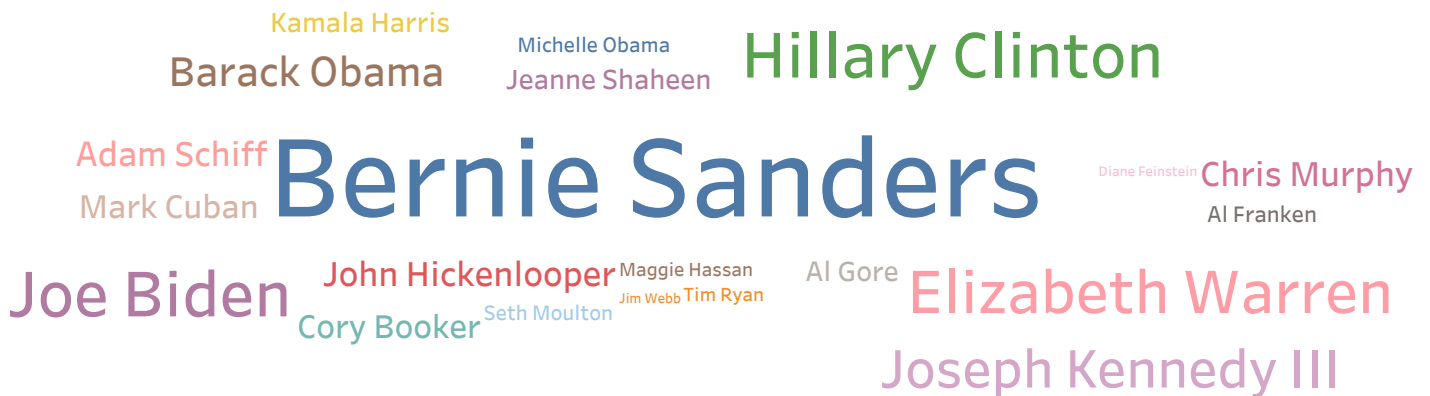
New Hampshire primary voters typically decide whom they will vote for in the final weeks or days of the campaign. It is therefore no surprise that nearly all Democratic voters (94%) say they are still trying to decide whom they will support in 2020. Only 2% of likely Democratic primary voters say they have definitely decided whom they will support, while 4% say they are leaning toward someone.

Definitely Decided on Candidate - Democratic Primary Voters



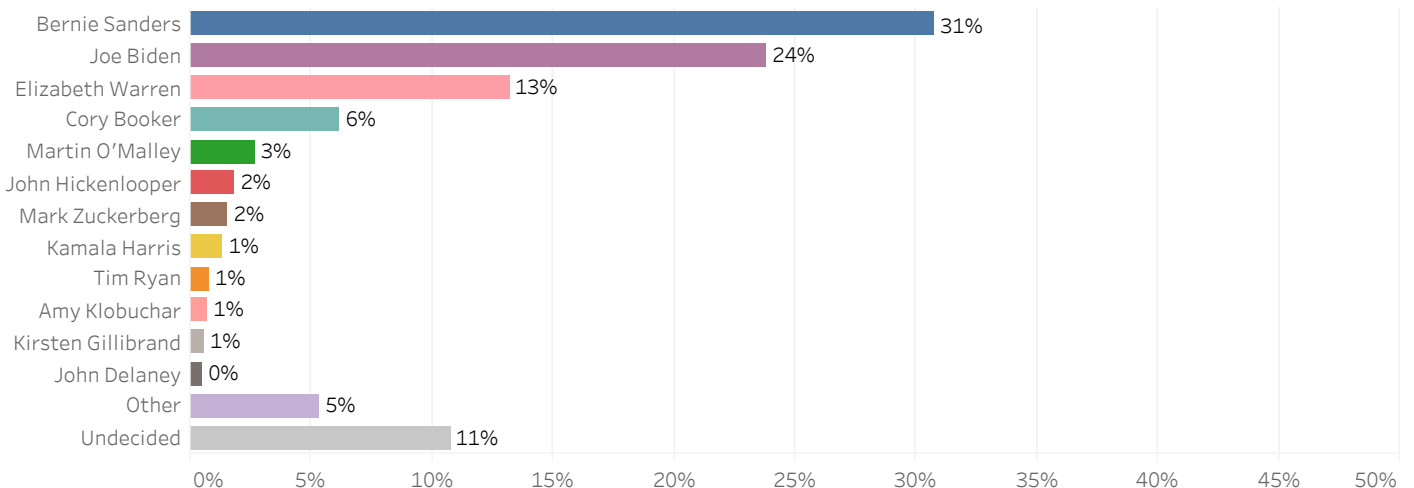
Most Democratic primary voters (58%) are undecided or could not provide a name when asked in an open-ended question whom they would support. Democratic primary voters most frequently mentioned Bernie Sanders (14%), Joe Biden (5%), Hillary Clinton (5%), Elizabeth Warren (4%), and Joseph Kennedy III (3%).

When provided with a list of potential candidates for the 2020 Democratic Presidential nomination to choose from, nearly one-third (31%) choose the 2016 NH Democratic Primary winner, Bernie Sanders, nearly a quarter choose Joe Biden (24%), and 13% select Elizabeth Warren. Smaller numbers of respondents choose Cory Booker (6%), Martin O'Malley (3%), John Hickenlooper (2%), Mark Zuckerberg (2%), Kamala Harris (1%), Tim Ryan (1%), Amy Klobuchar (1%), Kirsten Gillibrand (1%), or John Delaney (<1%). Five percent of respondents mentioned another candidate while 11% remain undecided about whom to support.

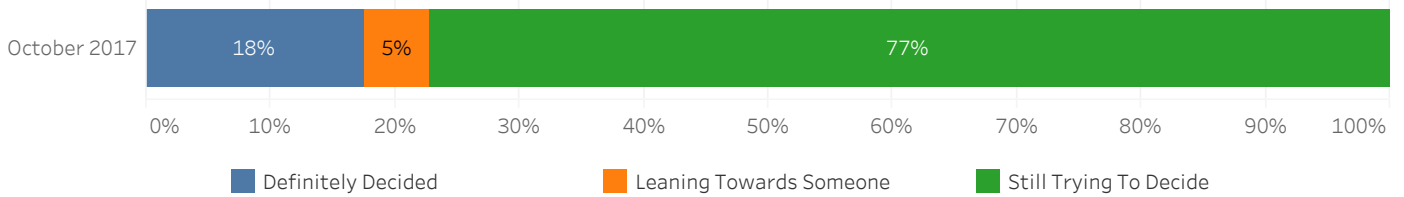
Preferred Democratic 2020 Presidential Nomination Candidate - List



2020 Republican Primary

Only 18% of Republican primary voters say they have definitely decided whom they will support for the 2020 Republican Presidential Primary. Five percent say they are leaning toward someone while 77% say they are still trying to decide.

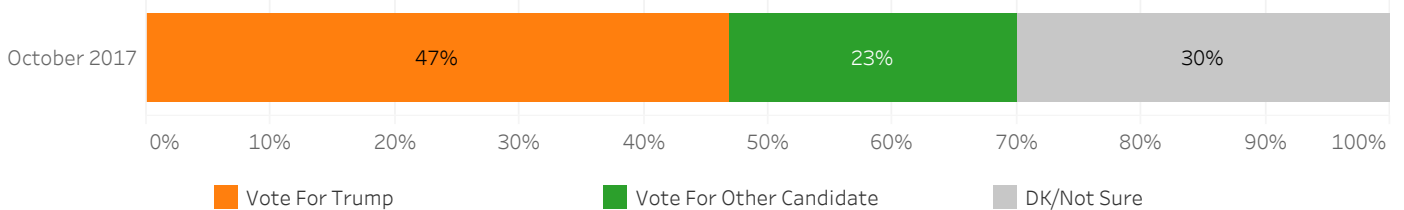
Definitely Decided on Candidate - Republican Primary Voters



Just under half (47%) of likely Republican primary voters say they plan on voting for Donald Trump in the 2020 New Hampshire Republican Presidential primary. Just under a quarter (23%) say they plan on voting for another candidate, while 30% don't know or are unsure.

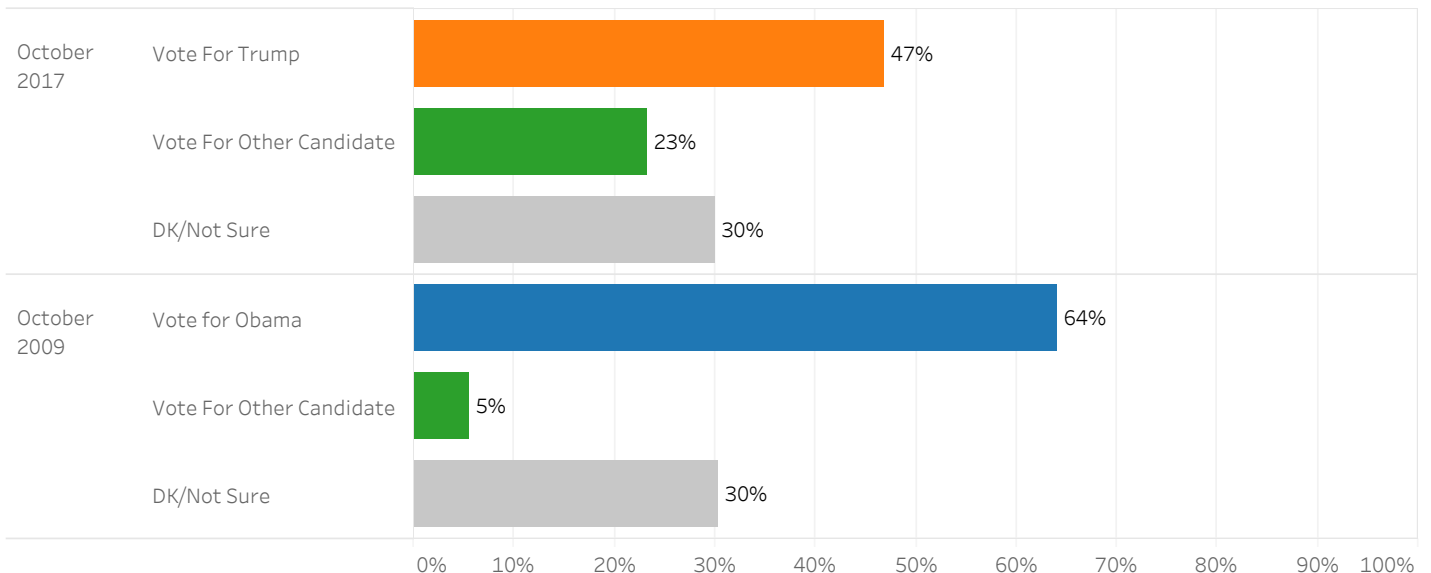
Likely Republican primary voters who listen to conservative radio (72%), those aged 65 and older (69%) or 50 to 64 (58%), those who voted for Trump in the 2016 general election (58%), self-described conservatives (58%), and First Congressional District residents (58%) are most likely to say they plan on voting for Trump in the 2020 Republican primary. Republican primary voters who voted for Clinton in the 2016 general election (82%), those who did not vote in 2016 (70%), those aged 18 to 34 (67%), self-described liberals (61%), self-described moderates (36%), and self-identified Independents (35%) are most likely to say they plan on voting for another candidate.

Plan on Voting for Trump or Other Republican Candidate?



Trump's support among likely Republican primary voters at this early juncture is considerably weaker than his predecessor. In October 2009, at the same period in his presidency, 64% of likely Democratic primary voters said they planned on voting for Barack Obama in the 2012 primary, compared to just 47% of likely Republican voters who currently say they will vote Trump.

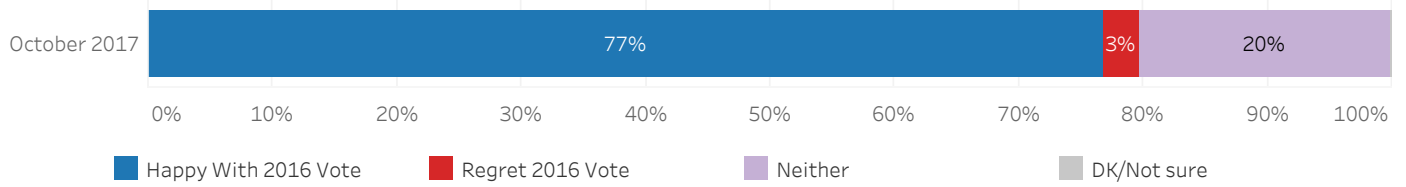
Plan on Voting for Incumbent President in Primary - October 2017 & October 2009



Feelings about 2016 Presidential Election Choice

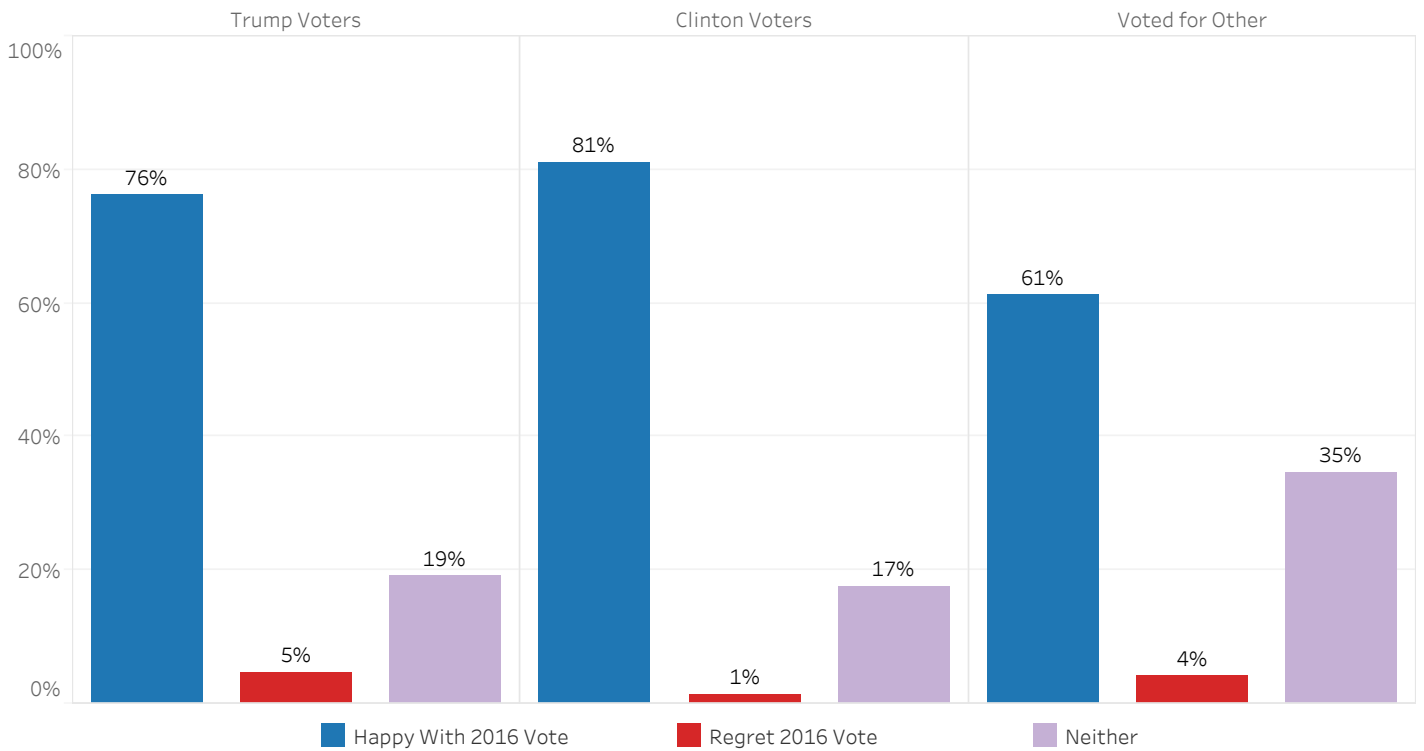
Very few Granite Staters say they regret their choice in the 2016 Presidential election. More than three-quarters of respondents (77%) say they are happy with their selection, only 3% say they regret it, and 20% say they are neither happy with nor regret their choice.

Few voters regret their choice regardless of whom they voted for in 2016. Only 5% of Trump voters say they regret their vote while 1% of Clinton voters and 4% of those who voted for another candidate regret theirs.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and seventy-three (573) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between October 3 and October 15, 2017. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.1 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. Included in the sample were 191 likely 2020 Republican Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 7.1 percent) and 212 likely 2020 Democratic Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 6.7 percent). The design effect for the survey is 1.2%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
