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## STRONG SUPPORT FOR SUNUNU, DRUGS REMAIN MOST IMPORTANT PROBLEM FACING NH

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DURHAM, NH – Governor Chris Sununu enjoys bipartisan approval of his job performance as well as increasing personal favorability among New Hampshire adults. A strong majority continue to believe overall the state is headed in the right direction, but for the first time, a majority of Granite Staters believe drug misuse is the most serious problem facing the state. Support for more permissive marijuana legislation remains high, particularly among young people and Democrats.

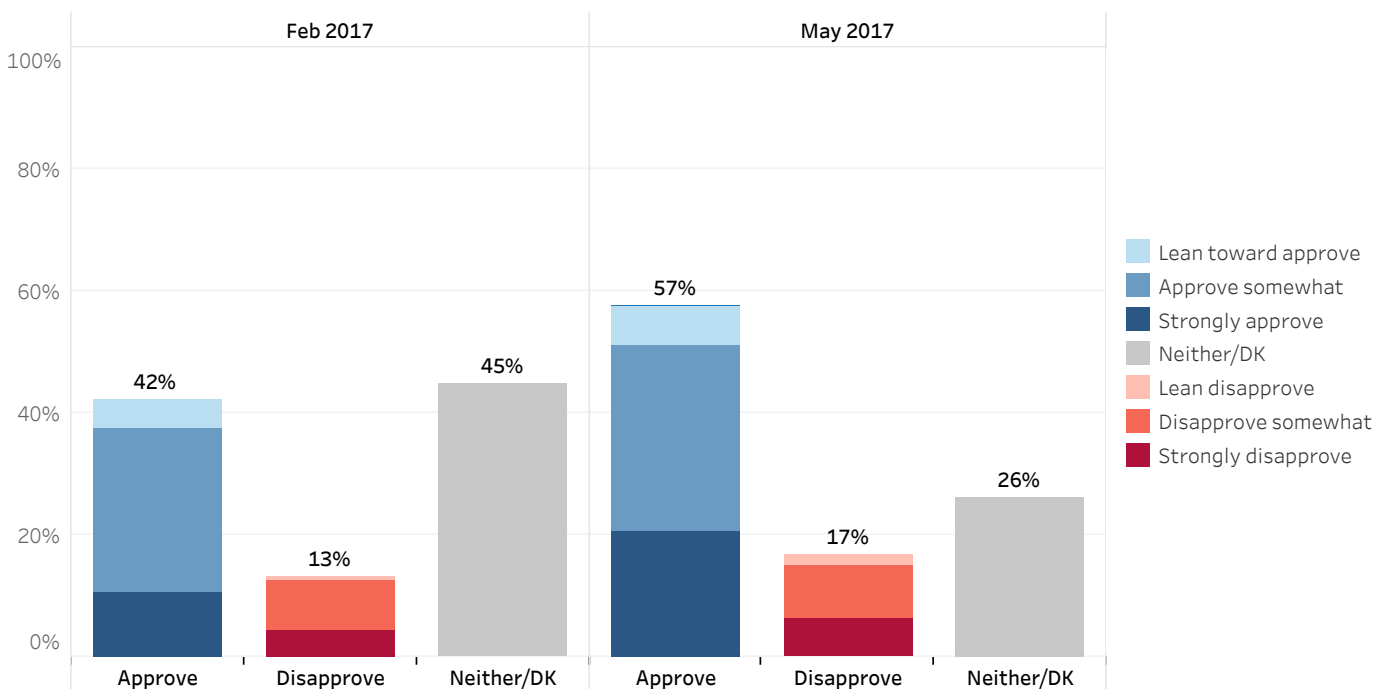
These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll\***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and eighteen (518) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between April 24 and May 4, 2017. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.3 percent.

### Gubernatorial Approval

In the second Granite State Poll since Chris Sununu's inauguration, 57% of Granite Staters say they approve of the job he is doing as Governor, 17% disapprove, and 26% are neutral or don't know enough to say. Sununu's approval rating has increased significantly since February (42%). Three-quarters (75%) of Republicans, 56% of Independents, and 43% of Democrats approve of Sununu's performance.

Frequent conservative radio listeners (81%), self-described conservatives (77%), Donald Trump voters (74%), and those who attend religious services once or twice a month (71%) are most likely to approve of the job Sununu is doing as governor. Boston Globe readers (37%), union members (32%), self-described liberals (31%), and Hillary Clinton voters (28%) are most likely to disapprove.

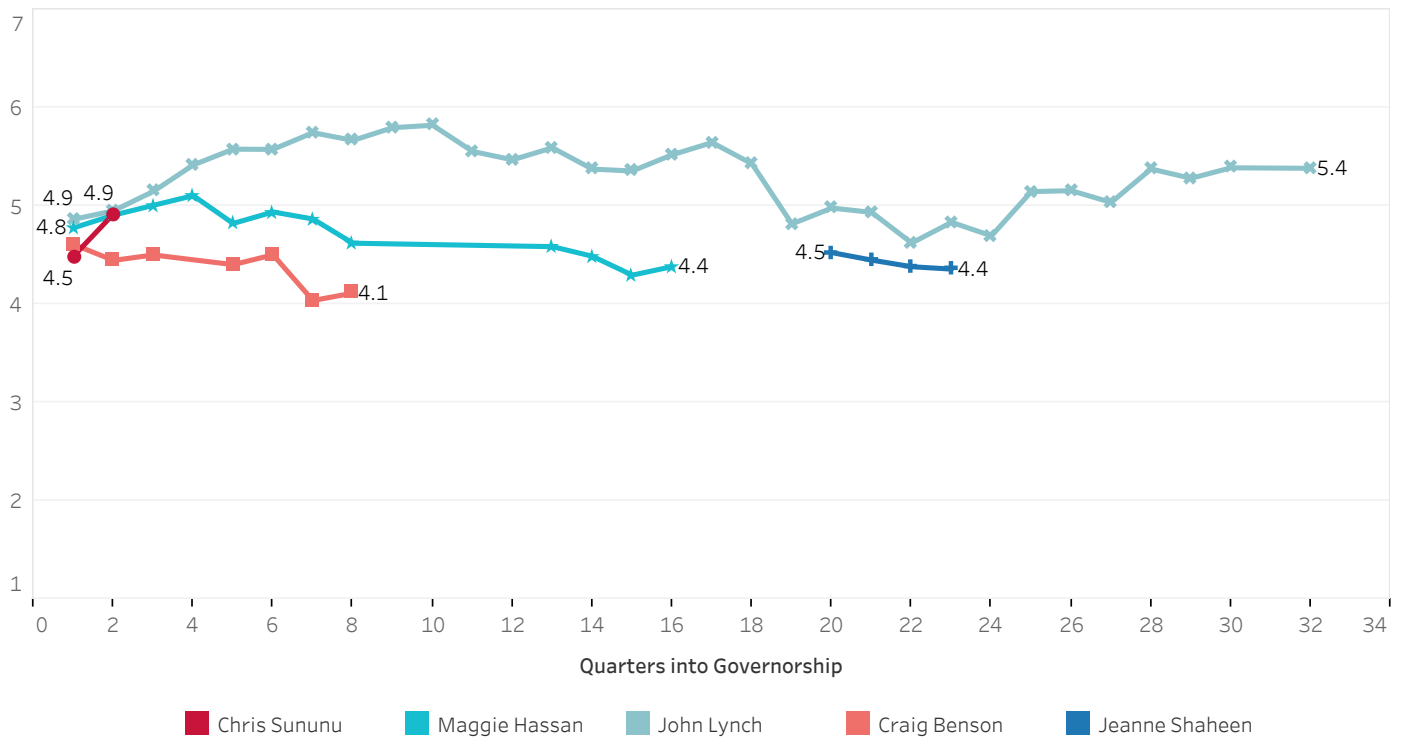
### NH Gubernatorial Approval

On a scale where "strongly approve" equals 7 and "strongly disapprove" equals 1, Sununu's approval (4.9) in his second quarter has risen quickly since February (4.5), and now enjoys the same level of support as Maggie Hassan and John Lynch did at the same point in their governorships.

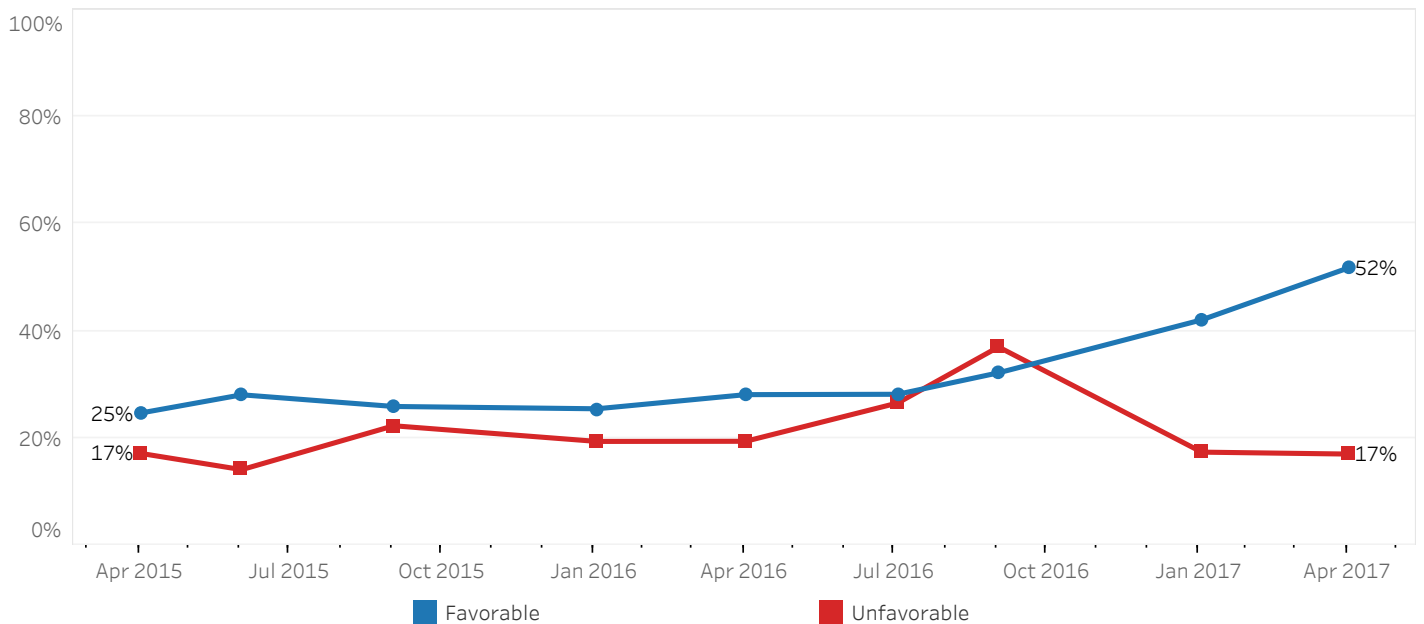
**Gubernatorial Approval Score by Quarters Into Governorship -

**Favorability Ratings - Governor Chris Sununu**

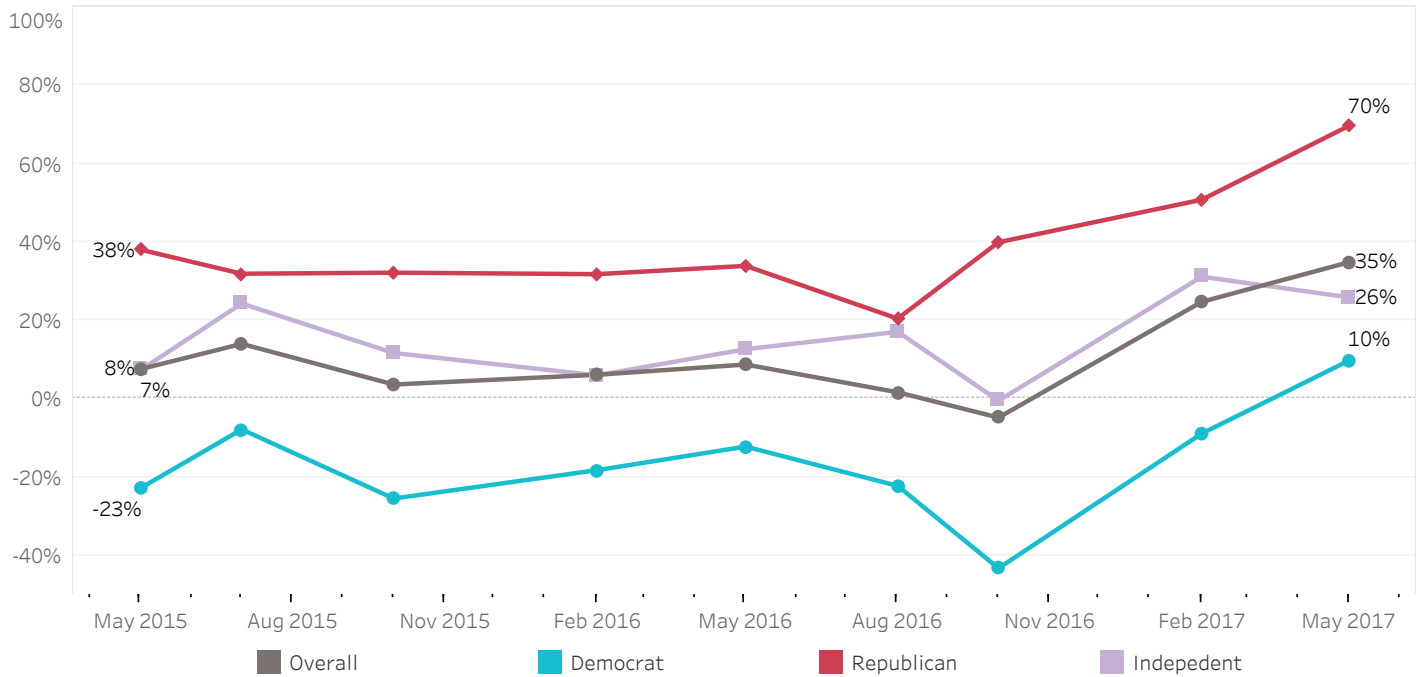
Sununu's personal favorability rating continues to rise following his election in November. Currently, 52% of New Hampshire adults say they have a favorable opinion of Sununu, 17% have an unfavorable opinion, 17% are neutral, and 14% say they don't know enough about him to say.

Sununu's net favorability rating, the percentage having a favorable opinion minus the percentage having an unfavorable opinion, is +35%, up significantly from -5% in October 2016 and +25% in February. Sununu is very popular among Republicans (+70% net favorability), popular among Independents (+26%), and somewhat popular among Democrats (+10%).

**Net Favorability Rating - Chris Sununu**

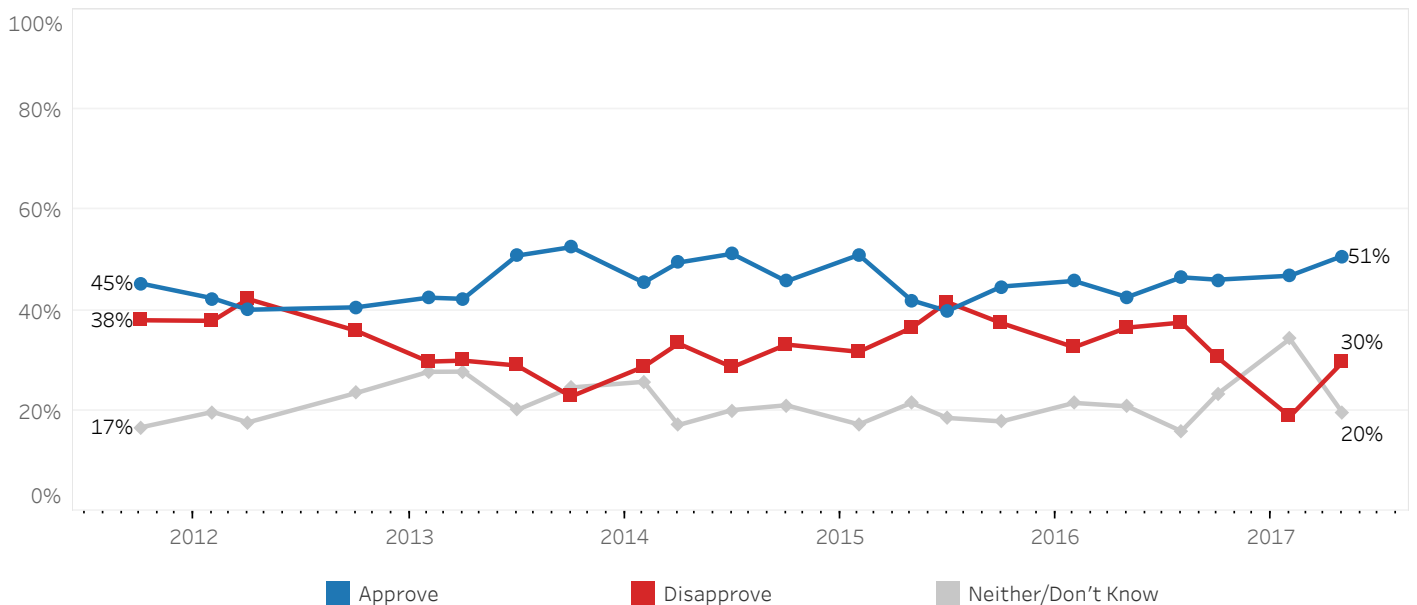


**Approval of New Hampshire Legislature**

Currently, 51% of New Hampshire adults approve of how the Republican-controlled State Legislature is doing its job, 30% disapprove, and 20% are neutral or don't know enough to say. Disapproval of the State Legislature's performance (30%) has increased since February (19%).

Approval is somewhat tied to partisanship; two-thirds (66%) of Republicans approve of the job the legislature is doing but only 45% of Democrats and 43% of Independents feel that way.

**Approval Rating - NH Legislature**

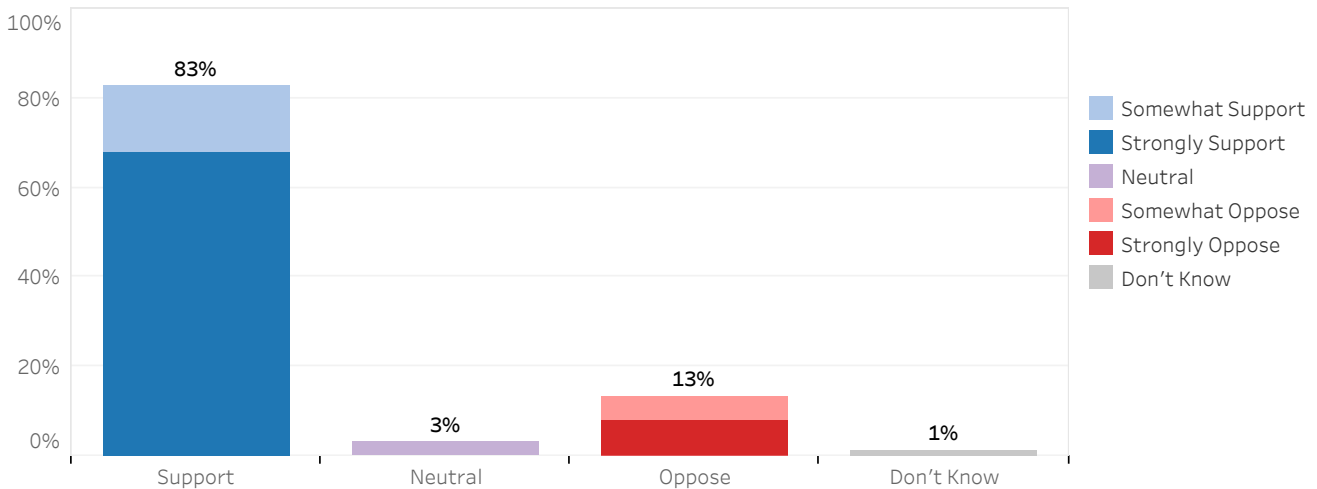


### Full-Day Kindergarten

The New Hampshire State Legislature recently passed a bill that partially funds full-day kindergarten at New Hampshire public schools. New Hampshire adults emphatically favor such a measure; 83% of Granite Staters strongly or somewhat support the proposed law, 3% are neutral, 13% somewhat or strongly oppose, and 1% don't know or are unsure.

Support for full-day kindergarten funding breaks down along largely partisan lines; self-identified Democrats (94% approve) and self-described liberals (93%) are most likely to support the measure. Union Leader readers (28% disapprove), frequent conservative radio listeners (27%), self-described conservatives (27%), self-identified Republicans (23%), those aged 50 to 64 (23%), and those who voted for Donald Trump in the last presidential election (23%) are most likely to oppose this measure, but majorities of these groups favor full-day kindergarten.

### Full-Day Kindergarten

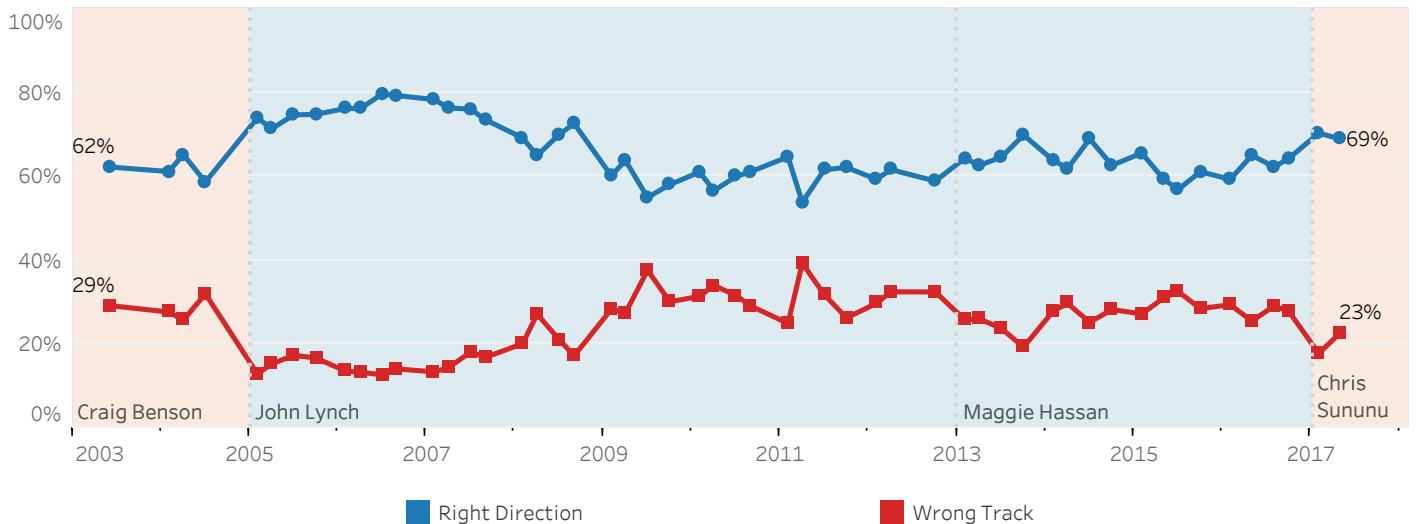


### Right Direction or Wrong Track

Most New Hampshire residents continue to think the state as a whole is headed in the right direction. Currently, 69% of New Hampshire adults feel the state is heading in the right direction, only 23% think the state is seriously off on the wrong track, and 8% don't know or are unsure. Majorities of Republicans (77%), Democrats (66%), and Independents (61%) say the state is headed in the right direction.

Respondents who attend religious services a few times a year (80%) are most likely to say NH is heading in the right direction. Boston Globe readers (40% wrong track), union members (36%), self-described liberals (35%), Manchester Area residents (35%), and self-identified Independents (34%) are most likely to say NH is seriously off on the wrong track.

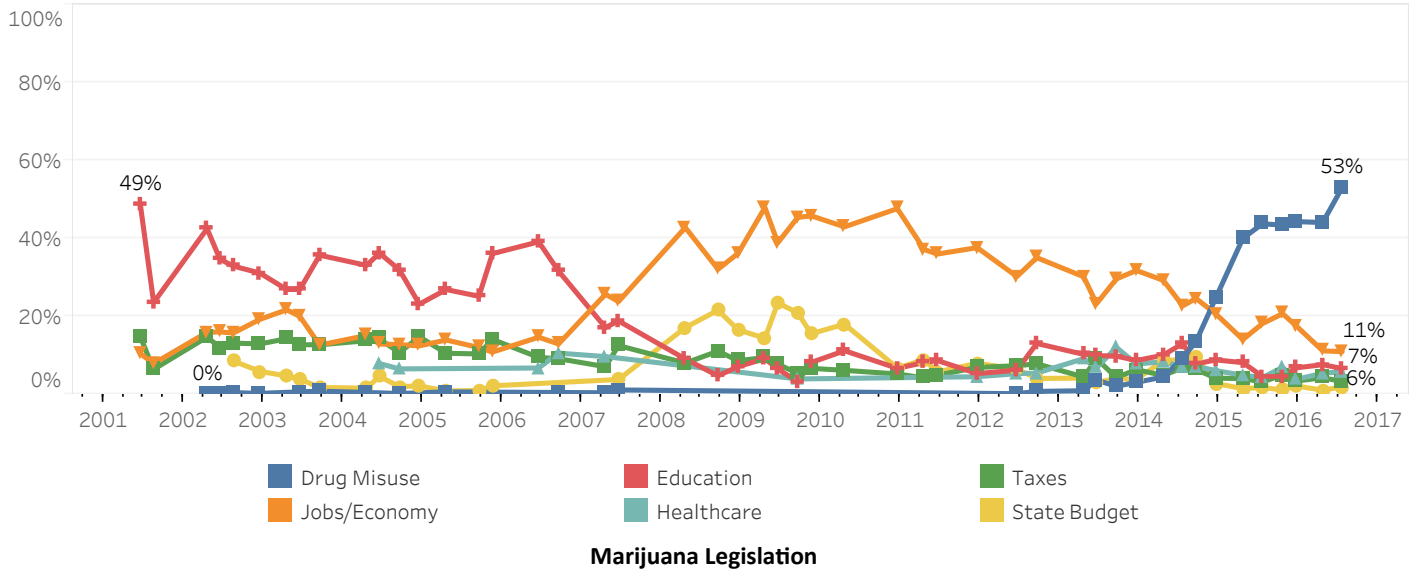
### NH Heading in Right Direction or On Wrong Track?



### Most Important Problem Facing New Hampshire

Granite Staters remain very concerned with the drug crisis facing the state. More than half (53%) of New Hampshire adults cite drug misuse as the most important problem facing the state, the first time in the Granite State Poll a single issue has been cited as the most important problem by a majority of respondents. Eleven percent cite jobs or the economy as the most important problem facing the state, while 7% choose education and 6% choose healthcare.

Younger adults (18 to 34) are most likely to cite drug misuse as the most important problem facing the state.

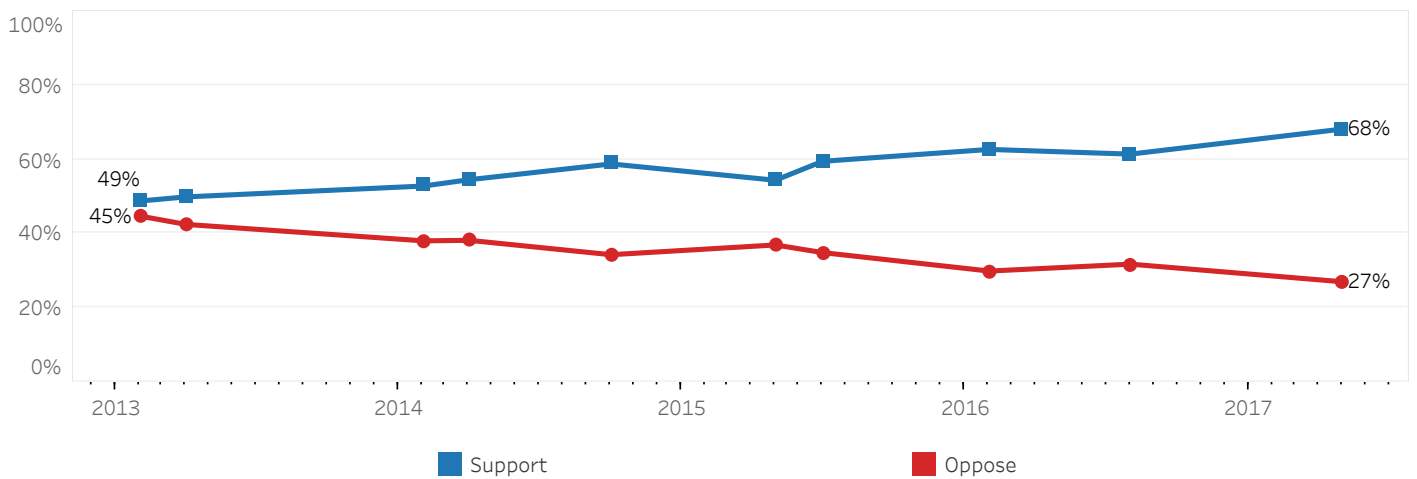


The New Hampshire State Legislature is considering legalizing possession of small amounts of marijuana for personal recreational use similar to what some other states have recently done.

Currently, more than two-thirds (68%) of New Hampshire adults strongly (49%) or somewhat (19%) support such legislation, while only 27% strongly (19%) or somewhat (8%) oppose it; 4% are neutral and 1% don't know or are unsure. This represents a substantial shift in public opinion since the question was first asked in February 2013, when 49% supported such a measure and 45% opposed. The proportion who strongly support legalization (49%) has increased significantly since 2013 (31%), while the proportion who strongly oppose it (19%) has decreased (37%).

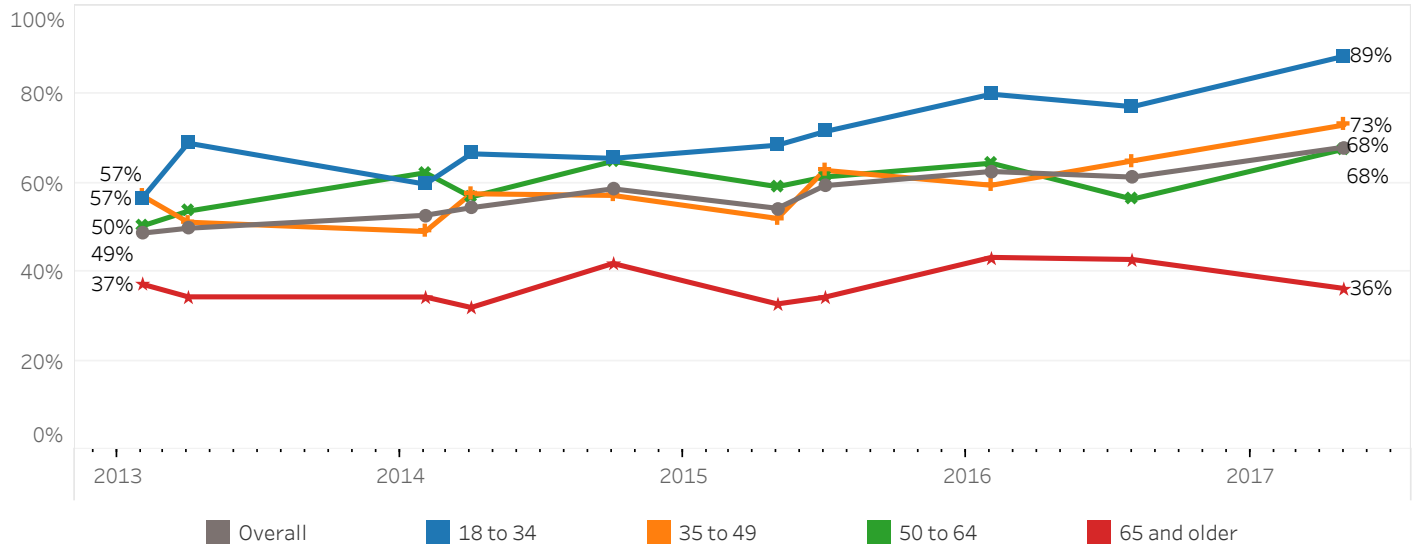
Self-described liberals (90% support) and those who never attend religious services (80%) are most likely to support legislation legalizing marijuana for recreational use. Those who attend religious services once a week or more often (53% oppose), self-described conservatives (51%), frequent conservative radio listeners (50%), self-identified Republicans (44%), and Donald Trump voters (42%) are most likely to oppose such legislation.

### Legalization of Marijuana for Recreational Use



Support for legalizing possession of small amounts of marijuana for personal recreational use is strongly tied with age, and differences between age groups on the issue are increasing over time. In early 2013, there was only a 20% gap in support between those 18 to 34 and those 65 and older. Now, those 18 to 34 (89% support) are more than twice as likely as those 65 and older (36%) to support the legalization of marijuana for recreational use. Those 65 and older are the only age group to oppose legalizing marijuana for recreational use.

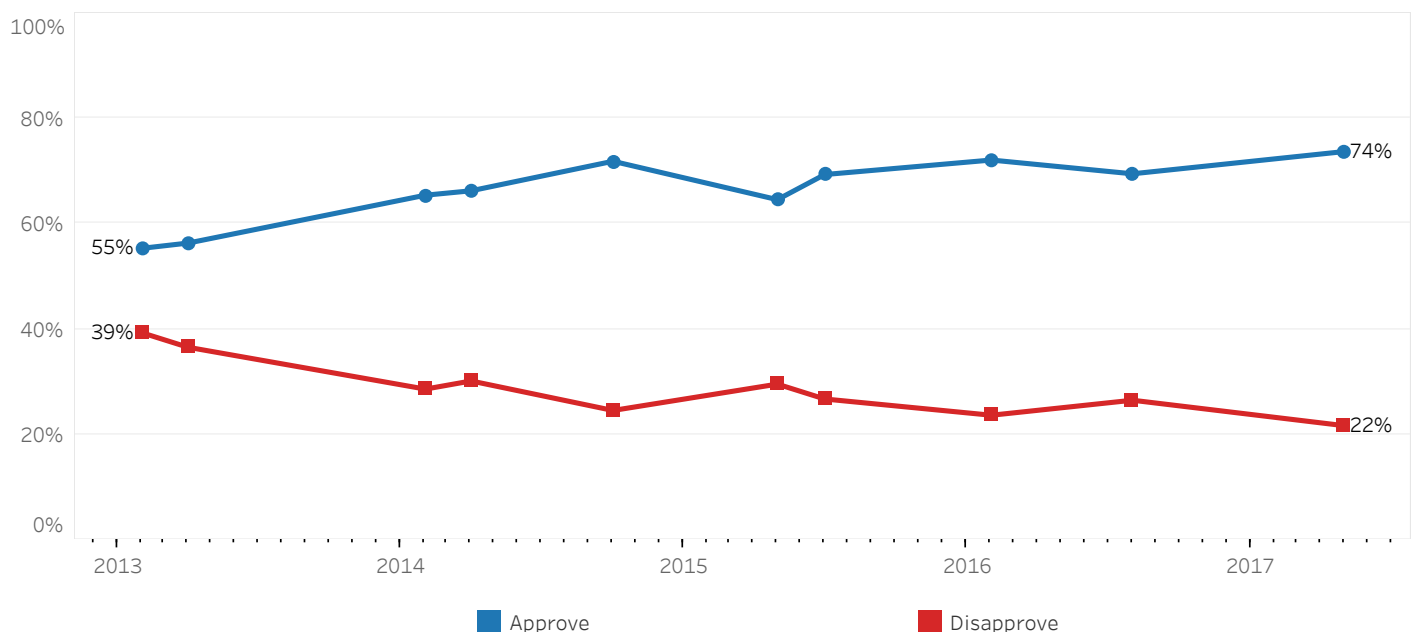
**Legalization of Marijuana for Recreational Use by Age Responded "Strongly Support" or "Somewhat Support"**



If possession of a small amount of marijuana for personal recreational use were legal in New Hampshire, nearly three-quarters (74%) of New Hampshire adults would strongly or somewhat approve of marijuana being sold at licensed retail outlets and taxed at levels similar to alcohol or tobacco while 22% somewhat or strongly disapprove. This too represents a shift in public opinion since the question was first asked in February 2013, when 55% approved of such a measure and 39% disapproved.

Self-described liberals (88%), and those aged 18 to 34 (85%) are most likely to approve of selling marijuana at licensed retail outlets and taxed at levels similar to alcohol or tobacco. Those who attend religious services once a week or more often (50% disapprove), those aged 65 and older (43%), frequent conservative radio listeners (42%), self-described conservatives (37%), and those who read the Union Leader (37%) are most likely to disapprove.

**Sale/Tax of Legal Marijuana at Licensed Retail Outlets**

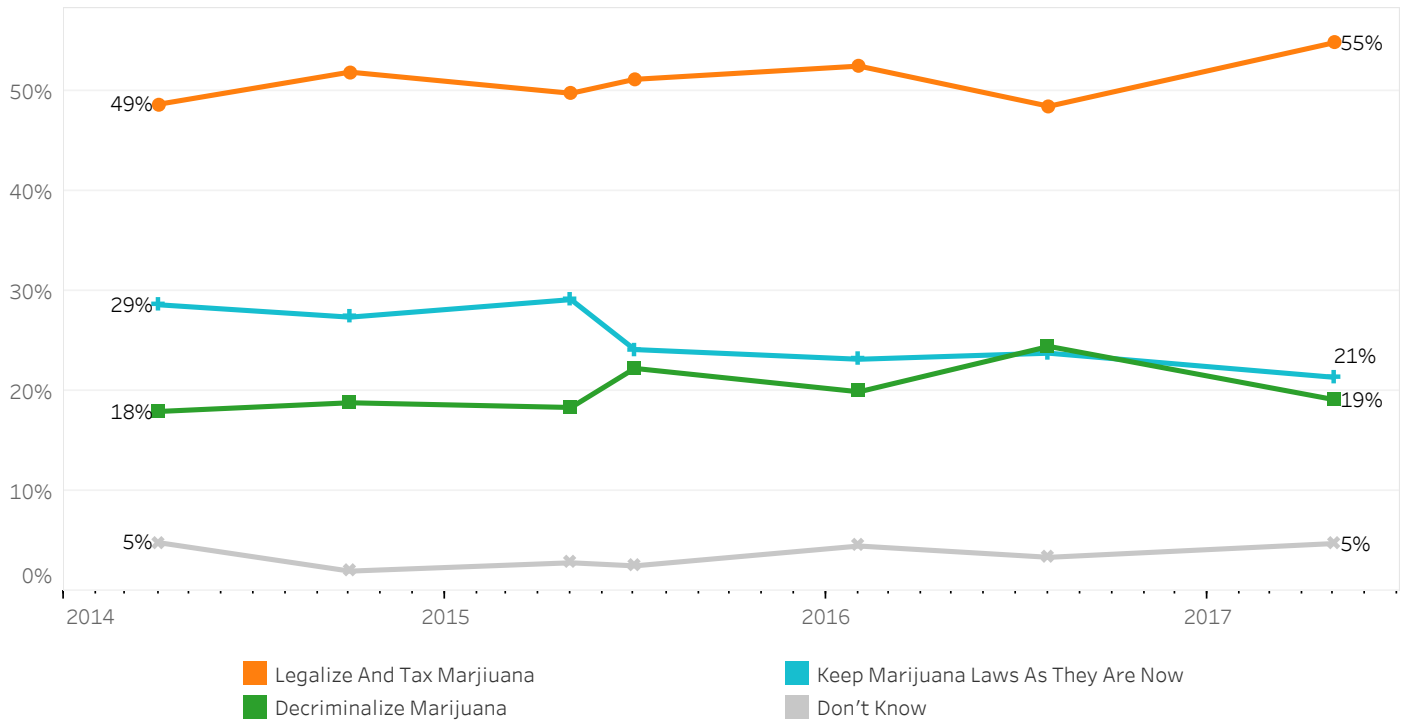


When asked what they would prefer the State Legislature to do about marijuana laws, 55% say they want marijuana legalized and taxed like alcohol, 19% would like to decriminalize marijuana, 21% would like to keep the laws as they are now, and 5% don't know or are unsure. Support for legalizing and taxing marijuana has slightly increased since April 2014 (49%), while support to maintain current marijuana laws has slightly decreased since then.

Those aged 18 to 34 (77%), self-described liberals (74%) and those who never attend religious services (68%) are most likely to prefer the legislature legalize and tax marijuana like alcohol. College graduates (30%) are most likely to prefer the legislature decriminalize marijuana.

Respondents aged 65 and older (42%), self-described conservatives (40%), those who attend religious services once a week or more often (35%), and frequent conservative radio listeners (32%) are most likely to prefer the legislature keep marijuana laws as they are now.

### Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and eighteen (518) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between April 24 and May 4, 2017. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.3 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.2%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
