TRUMP JOB APPROVAL IN NH STEADY, NO CONSENSUS ON ACTION IN SYRIA

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DURHAM, NH – New Hampshire residents are divided about President Donald Trump's administration. Approval of Trump's performance as President, his handling of foreign affairs and the economy, and opinion on the direction of the country remain closely tied to partisanship. A majority of Granite Staters support the removal of Bashar al-Assad from power in Syria, but respondents have varied opinions on how this should be accomplished.

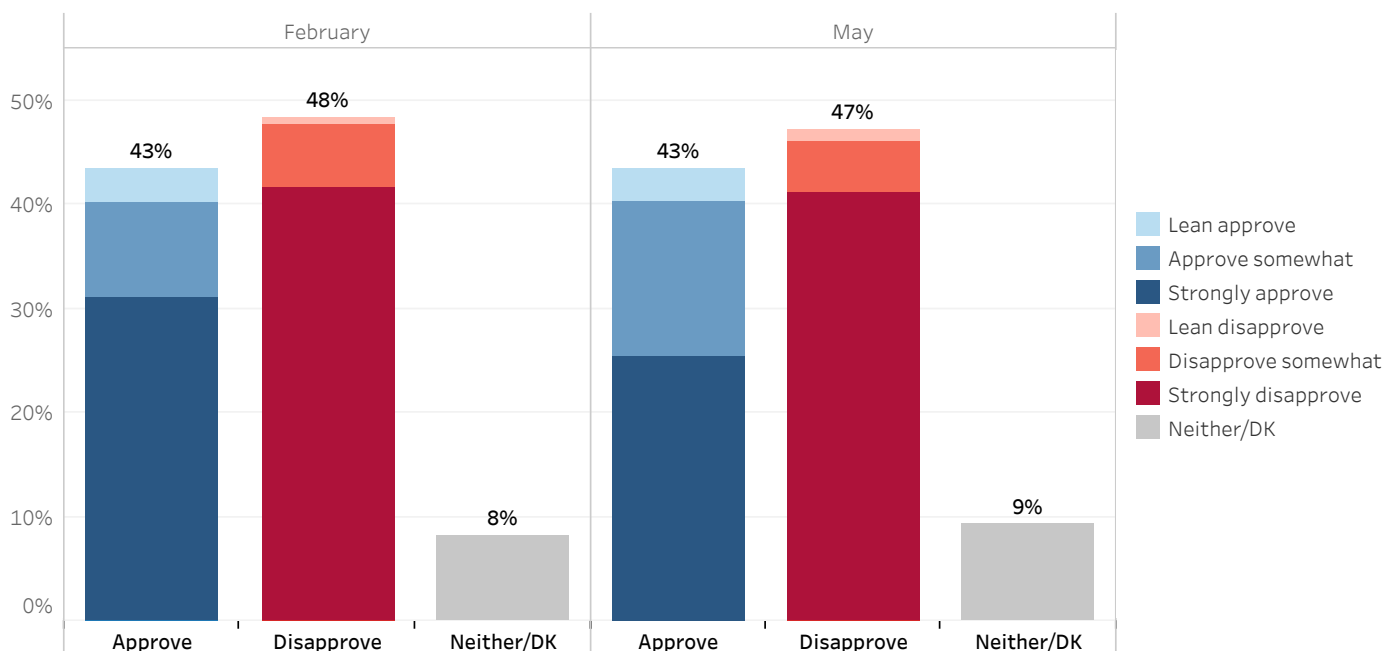
These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and eighteen (518) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between April 24 and May 4, 2017. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.3 percent.

Presidential Approval

Just over one hundred days into President Trump's administration, less than half of New Hampshire adults approve of his performance so far as President. Currently, 43% of New Hampshire adults say they approve of the job Trump is doing as President, 47% disapprove, and 9% are neutral.

While overall approval of Trump's job performance is unchanged since February, the percentage of respondents who strongly approve of Trump has declined somewhat from 31% in February to 25% in May, while the percentage who strongly disapproves (41%) has remained the same since February.

Presidential Approval - Donald Trump

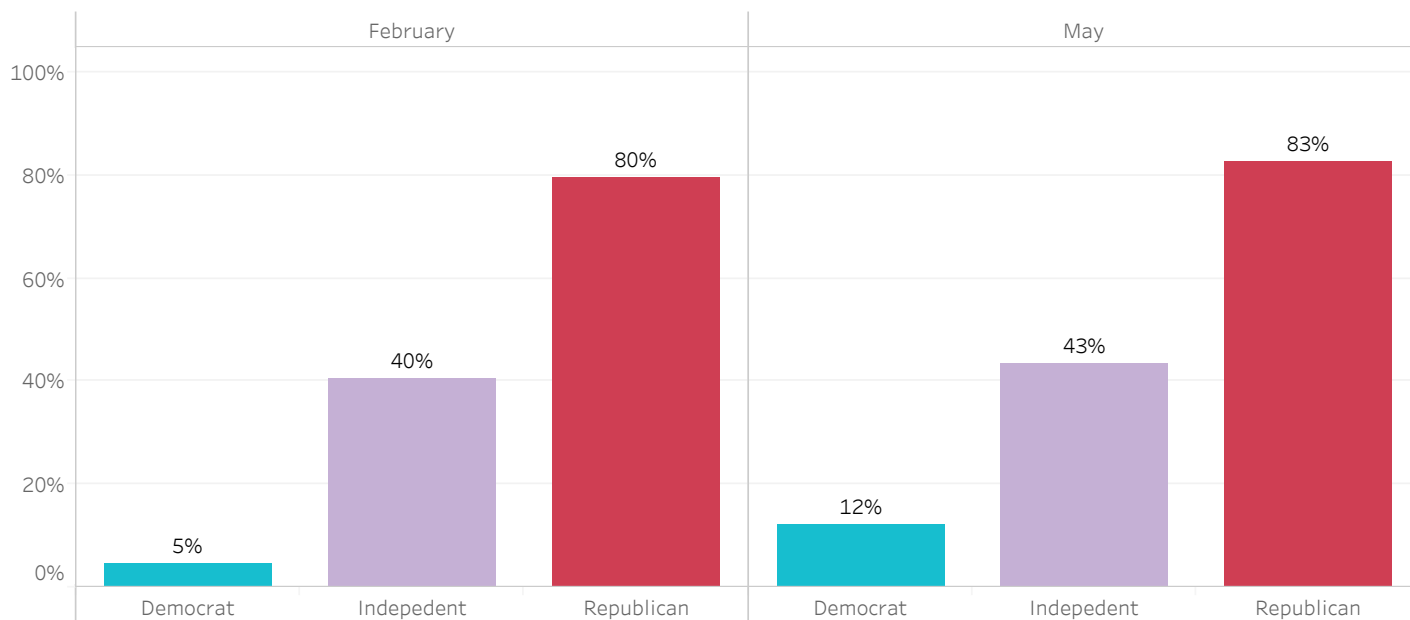

Approval of President Trump remains closely tied to partisanship. Eighty-three percent of Republicans approve of Trump's job performance, 43% of Independents approve, but only 12% of Democrats approve. While very few Democrats approve of Trump's performance (12%), this represents a slight increase since February (5%).

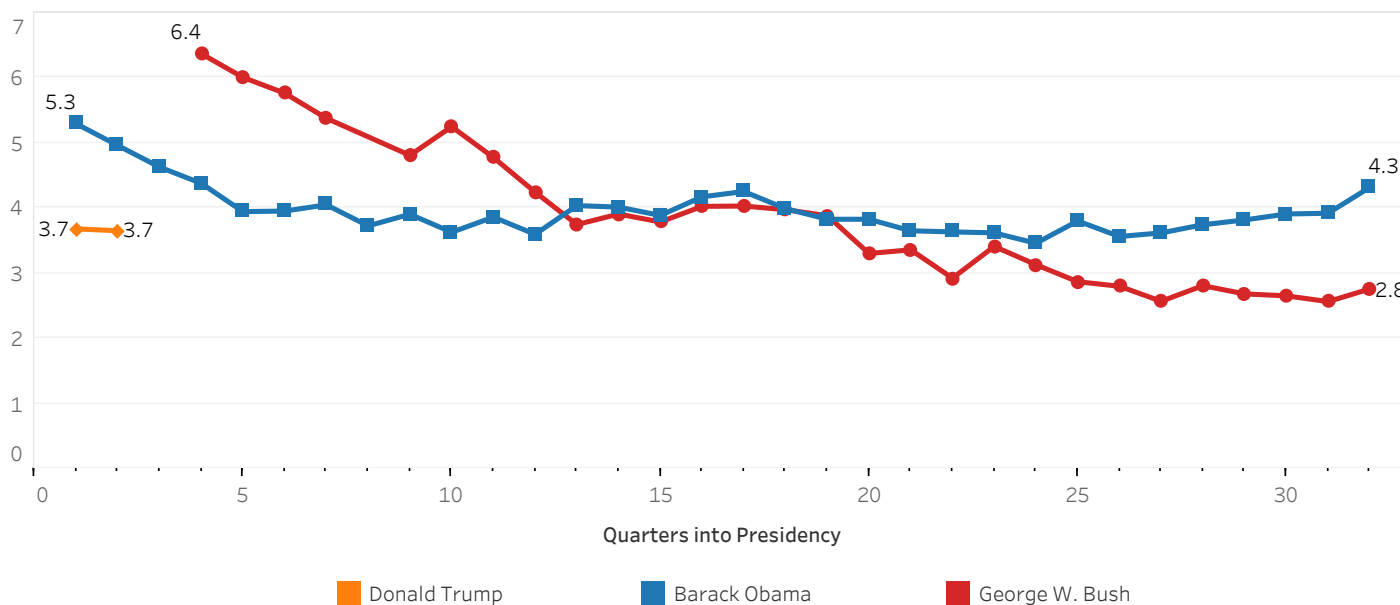
Frequent conservative radio listeners (86% approve), self-described conservatives (81%), and gun owners (62%) are most likely to approve of Trump's performance, while self-described liberals (91% disapprove), those who read the Boston Globe (75%), Gary Johnson voters (73%), frequent NHPR listeners (70%), those who have completed postgraduate work (64%), and union members (59%) are most likely to disapprove.

On a scale where "strongly approve" equals 7 and "strongly disapprove" equals 1, Trump's approval (3.7) is unchanged since February and remains well below that of his predecessor, Barack Obama (5.0) in the second quarter of his presidency. However, Trump's job approval has been stable since the first quarter of his presidency, while President Obama experienced a decline each quarter in his first year in office.

(7=Strongly Approve, 1= Strongly Disapprove)

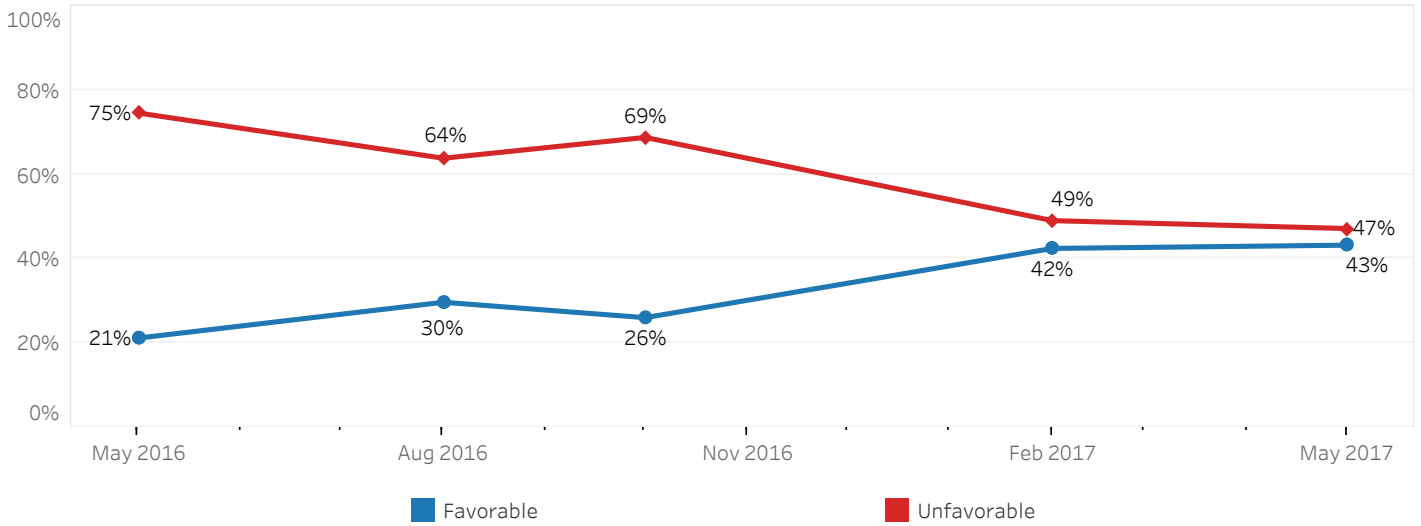


Favorability Ratings - President Donald Trump

Trump's favorability among New Hampshire adults has remained steady since February after rising considerably following the 2016 presidential campaign. Trump is currently viewed favorably by 43% of Granite Staters, 47% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 10% are neutral or don't know enough to say.

Frequent conservative radio listeners (82% favorable), self-described conservatives (81%), gun owners (62%), active or veteran military members (57%), Manchester area residents (54%), and those who attend religious services once a week or more often (53%) are most likely to have a favorable opinion of Trump. Self-described liberals (87% unfavorable), Boston Globe readers (82%), frequent NHPR listeners (69%), those who have completed postgraduate work (65%), union members (61%), and those who attend religious services once or twice a month (57%) are most likely to have an unfavorable opinion of Trump.

Favorability - Donald Trump

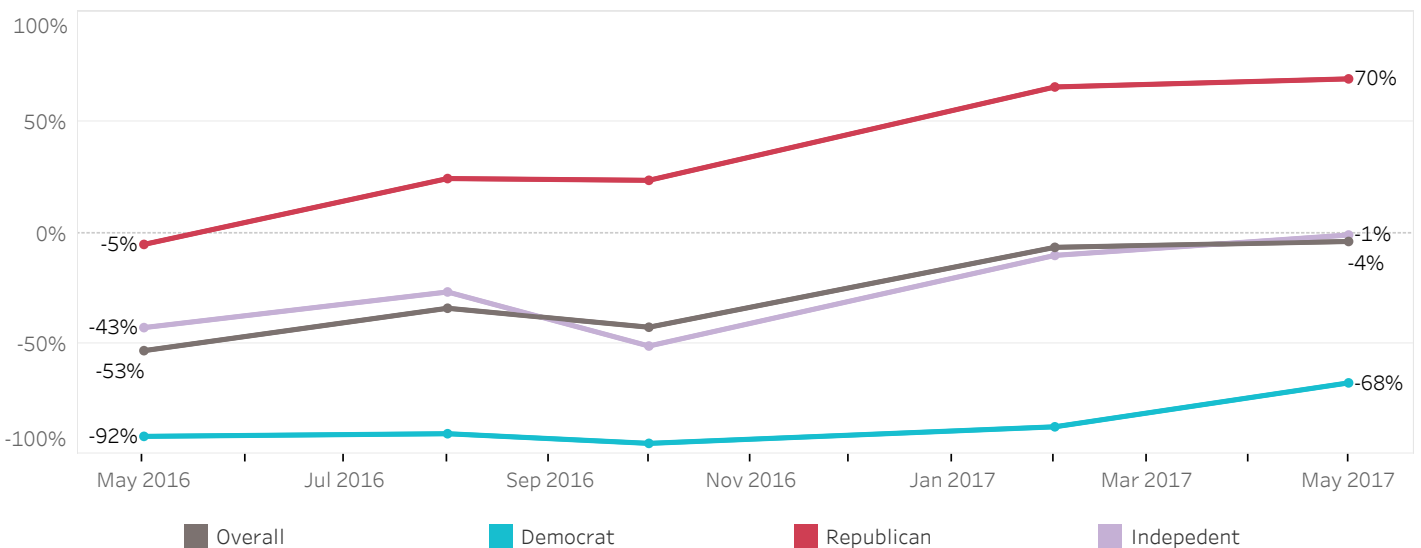


Net Favorability Rating - President Donald Trump

Trump's net favorability rating - the percentage of people who say they have a favorable opinion of him minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion - remained steady since February among Republicans and Independents but improved among Democrats. Trump remains highly popular among Republicans (+70%), significantly higher than in October 2016 (+24%), while Independents are neutral (-1%). Though his net favorability among Democrats remains very low (-68%), it has increased considerably since February 2017 (-88%).

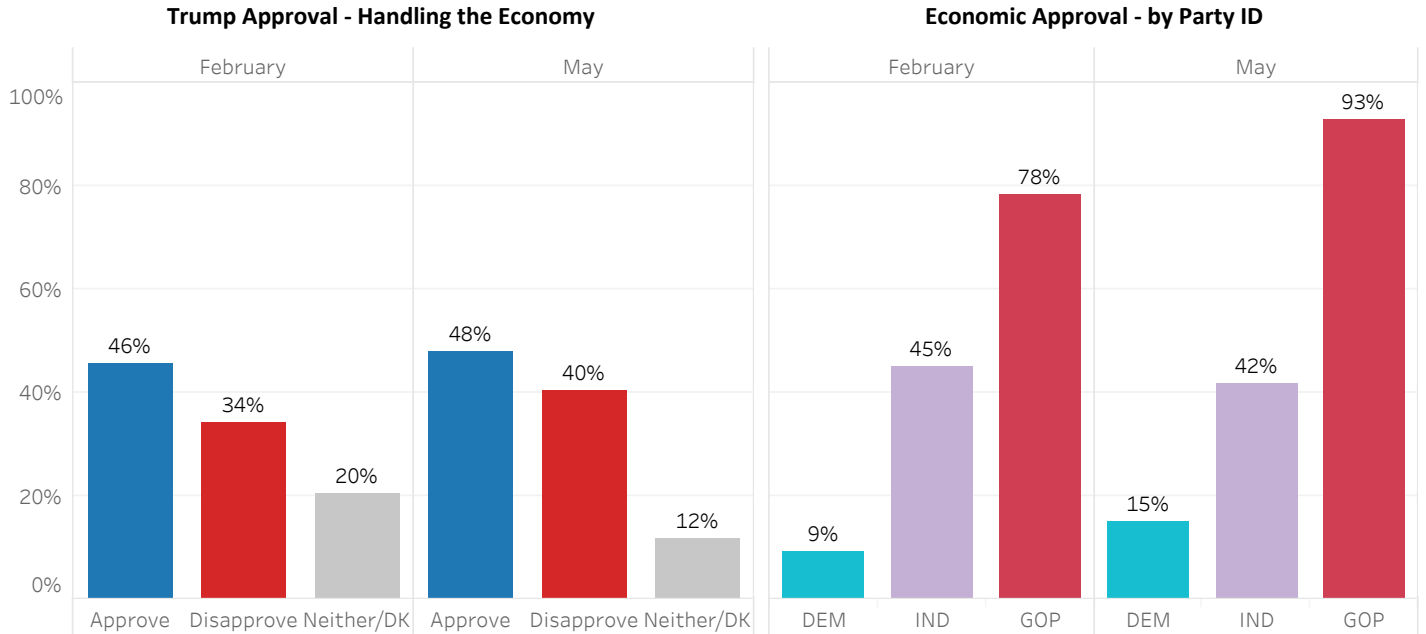
Net Favorability Rating - Donald Trump

Net Approval = (% Approve - % Disapprove)



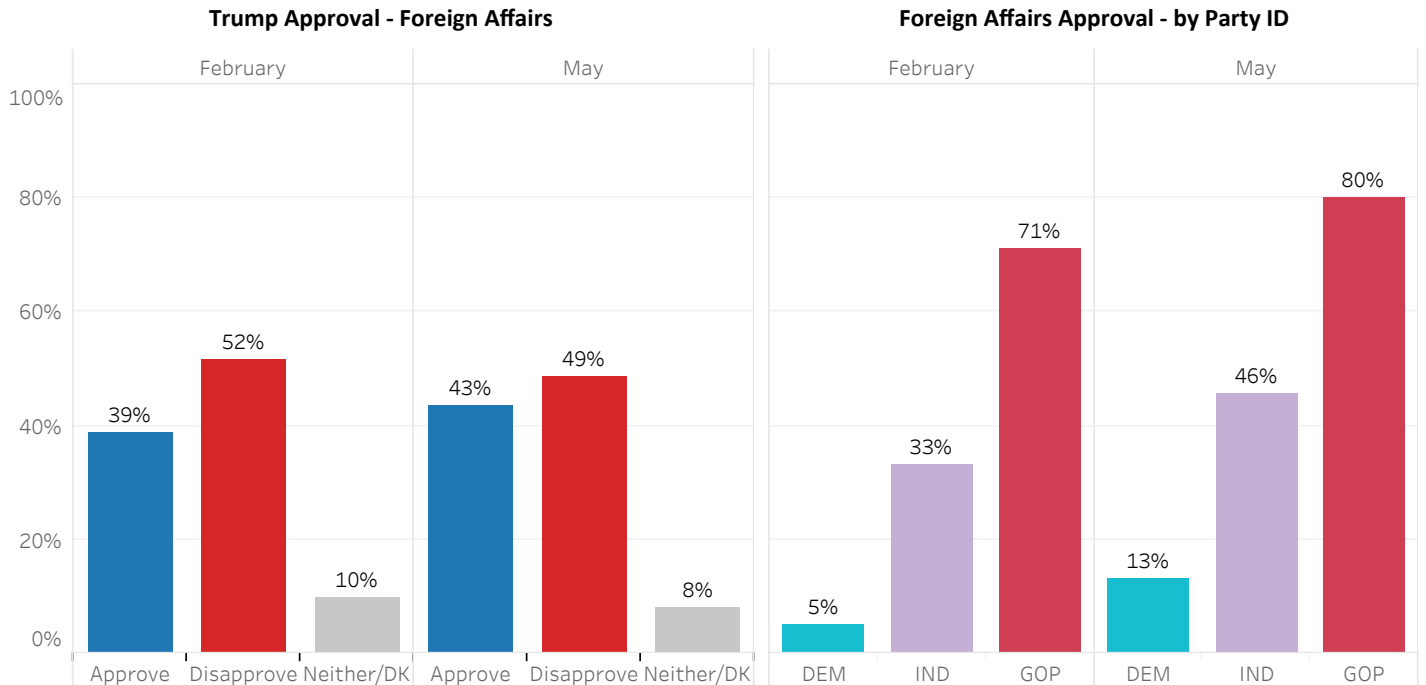
Economic Approval

In the second Granite State Poll since his inauguration, Granite Staters' approval of Trump's handling of the economy is unchanged. Currently, 48% approve of how Trump is handling the economy, 40% disapprove, and 12% are neutral or unsure. Republicans nearly universally approve of Trump's handling of the economy (93%), while Independents (42%) and Democrats (15%) are much less likely to do so.



Foreign Affairs Approval

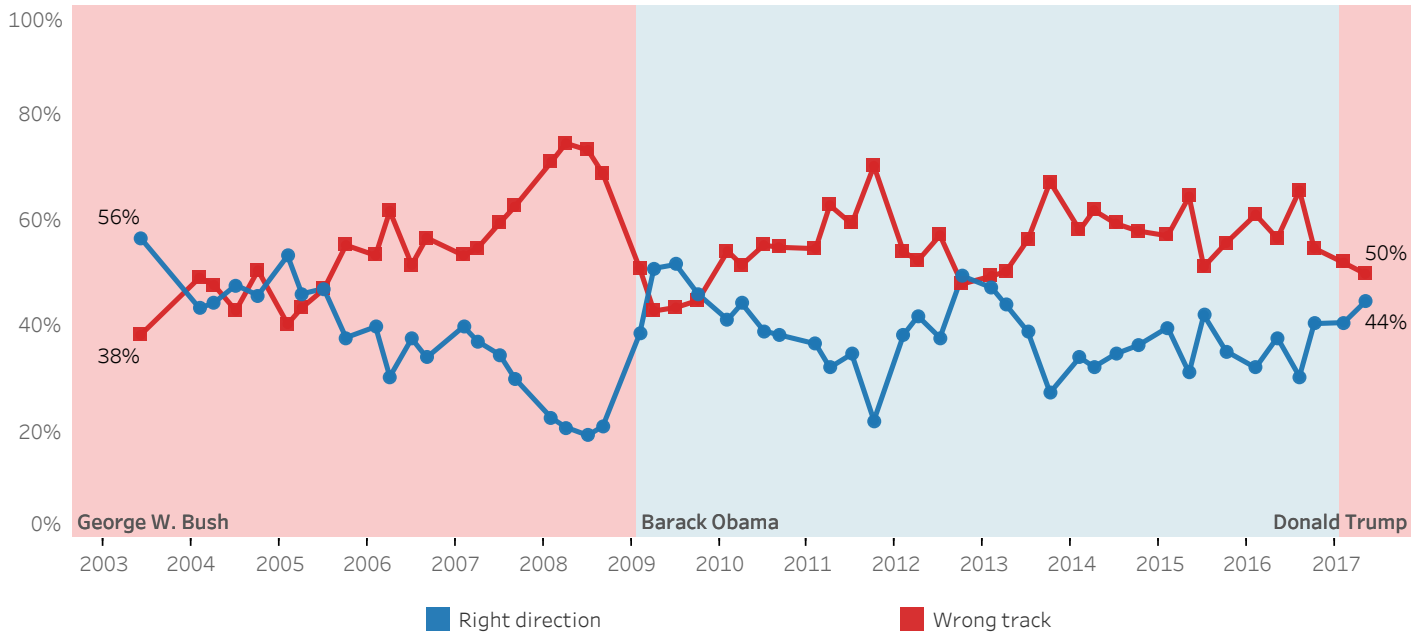
Granite Staters have a lower opinion of Trump's handling of foreign affairs than his handling the economy. Currently, 43% of New Hampshire adults approve of how Trump is handling foreign affairs, 49% disapprove, and 8% are neutral. Eighty percent of Republicans approve of Trump's performance in foreign affairs, but only 46% of Independents and 13% of Democrats do so. Approval of Trump's handling of foreign affairs has slightly increased since February among Republicans, Independents, and Democrats.



Right Track – Wrong Track

Overall, New Hampshire residents continue to be slightly pessimistic about the direction the country is heading. Forty-four percent (44%) of New Hampshire adults think things in this country are generally going in the right direction, 50% think things are seriously off on the wrong track, and 6% don't know or are unsure. Opinion remains very closely tied to partisanship; 78% of Republicans believe the the country is heading in the right direction but only 48% of Independents and 14% of Democrats agree.

US Heading in Right Direction or On Wrong Track

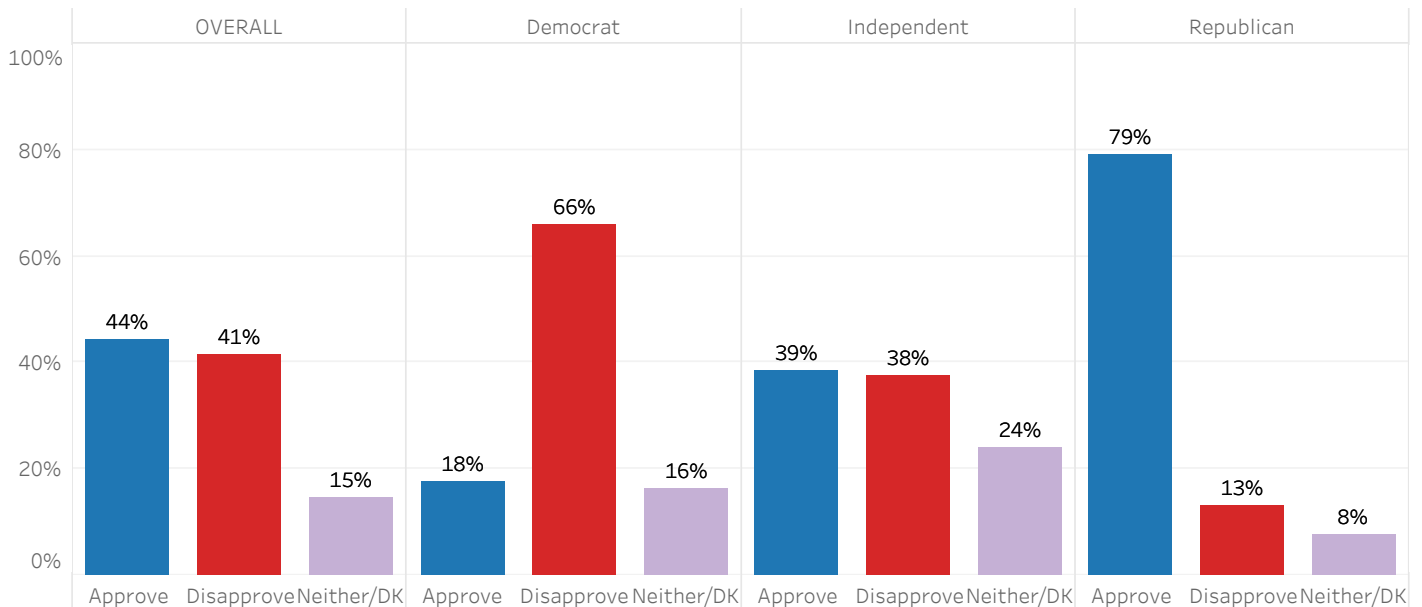


Syria

Granite Staters are divided in their opinion on how President Trump is handling the situation in Syria. A slight plurality (44%) approve of Trump's handling of Syria, 41% disapprove, and 15% are neutral.

Republicans are far more likely than Democrats or Independents to approve of Trump's handling of the situation in Syria; more than three-quarters (79%) approve while only 13% disapprove. Only 18% of Democrats approve of Trump's handling of the situation in Syria, while 39% of Independents do so.

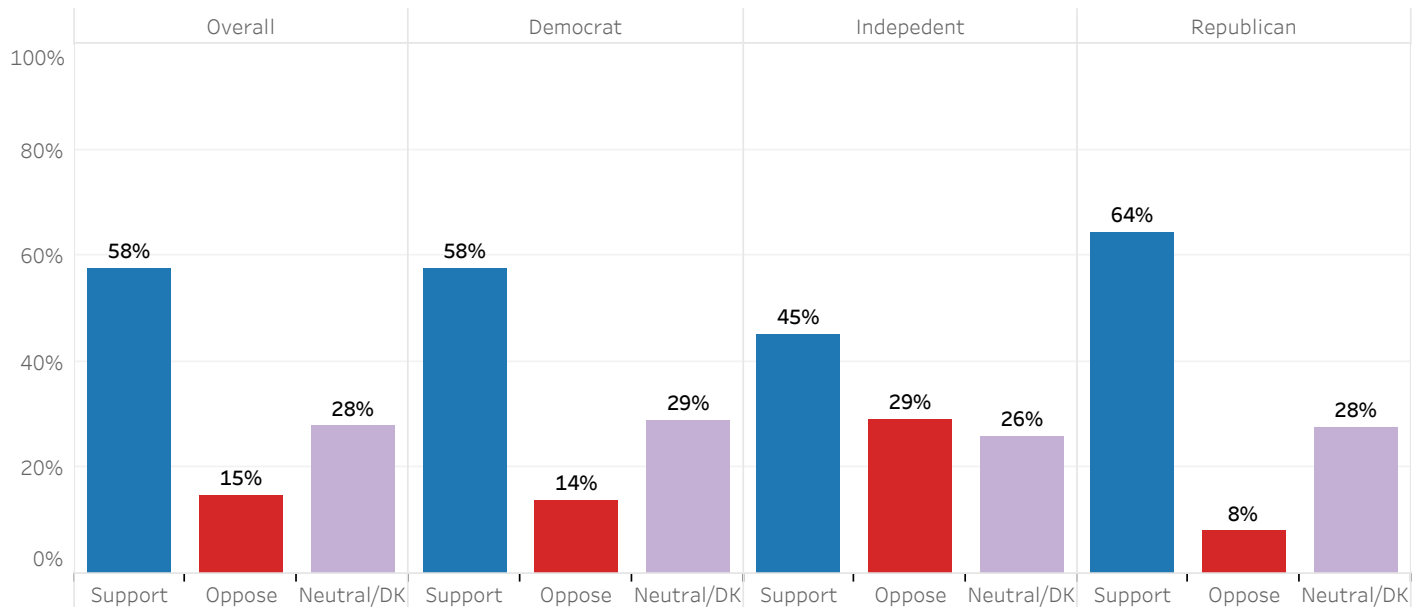
Syria - Approval of Trump Handling



More than half (58%) of Granite Staters support the removal of Syrian President Bashar al-Assad. Fifteen percent oppose Assad's removal from power while more than a quarter (28%) are neutral or don't know.

Unlike most current issues, opinion on Assad's removal is not tied to partisanship: 58% of Democrats, 45% of Independents, and 64% of Republicans favor Assad's removal. Frequent conservative radio listeners (43% oppose), Gary Johnson voters (40%), and Manchester Area residents (40%) are most likely to be neutral or not know whether they support or oppose the removal of Assad from power.

Support/Oppose Removal of Syrian President Bashar al-Assad

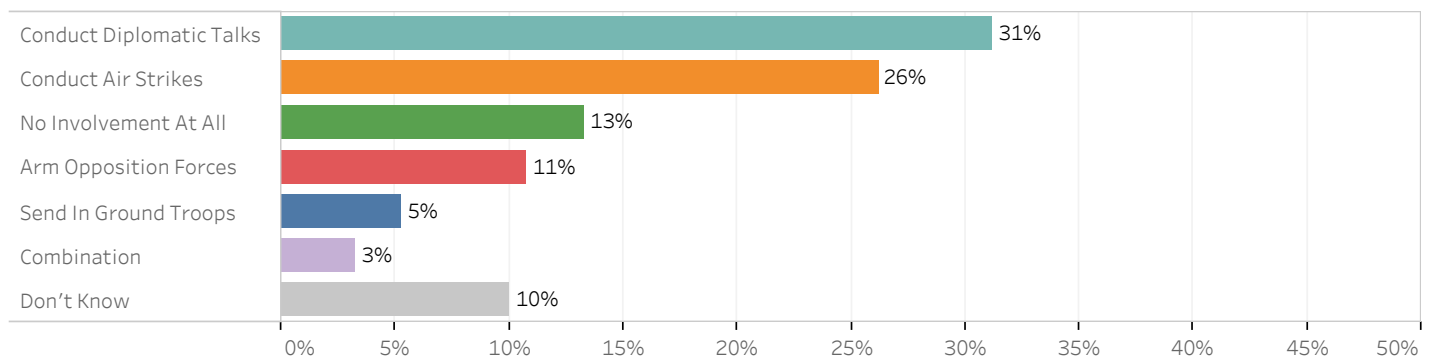


Although more than half of New Hampshire adults support the removal of Syrian President Bashar al-Assad from power, Granite Staters are divided on what specifically the US should do in Syria. Nearly a third of respondents (31%) would only like the US to conduct diplomatic talks, 26% support air strikes, 13% want no American involvement in the conflict at all, 11% support arming Syrian opposition forces, and only 5% favor sending American ground troops to Syria. Three percent want a combination of these options, and 10% don't know or are unsure.

Among those who support the removal of Assad, only 57% prefer a military action such as sending in ground troops, conducting air strikes, or arming opposition forces. Among those who oppose Assad's removal, 30% would like the United States to hold diplomatic talks and 31% would like no American involvement at all.

Registered Republicans (46%), Donald Trump voters (46%), those who attend religious services once or twice a month (45%), and Central/Lakes Region residents (41%) are more likely than others to prefer sending in ground troops or conducting airstrikes while self-described liberals (58%), Hillary Clinton voters (55%), and self-identified Democrats (55%) are more likely than others to prefer conducting diplomatic talks or having no US involvement at all.

Preferred US Option in Syria



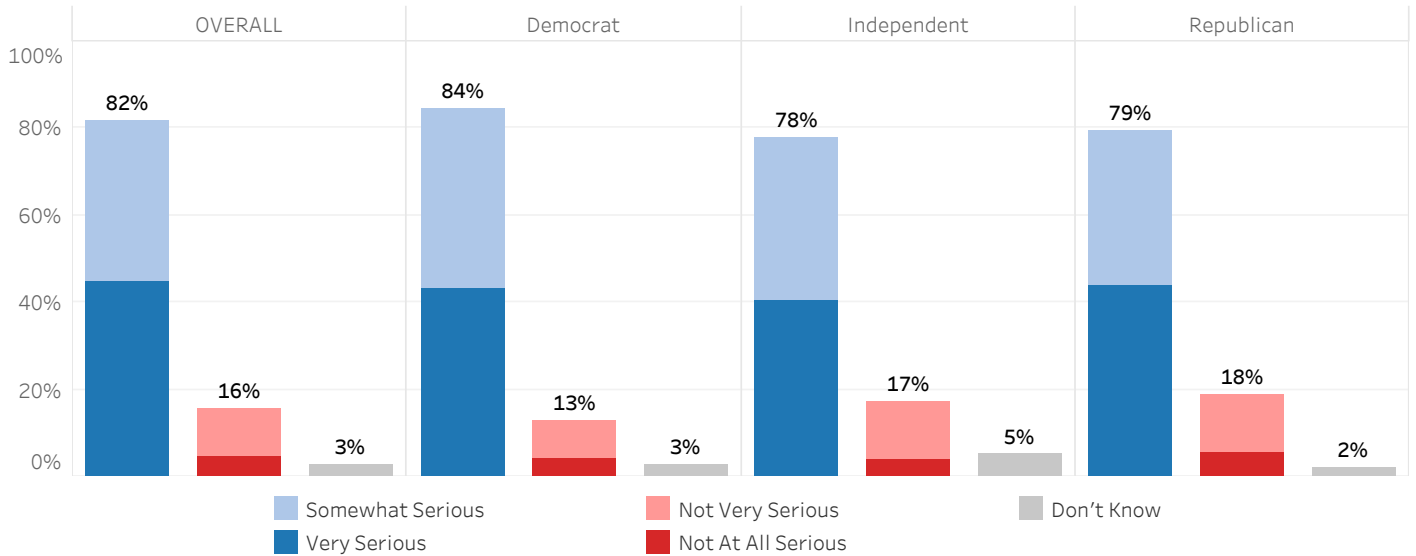
North Korea

Most New Hampshire adults (82%) believe North Korea poses a very (45%) or somewhat (37%) serious threat to the United States and its allies. Sixteen percent consider the threat to be not very serious (11%) or not at all serious (5%) and 3% don't know or are unsure.

Partisanship does not appear to play a strong role in how serious a threat respondents consider North Korea to be; more than three-quarters of Democrats (84%), Independents (78%), and Republicans (79%) each consider North Korea to be a very serious or somewhat serious threat.

Those aged 50 to 64 (92%) are most likely to say North Korea is a serious threat, while Gary Johnson voters (29%) and those aged 18 to 34 (28%) are most likely to say it is a not very serious or not at all serious threat.

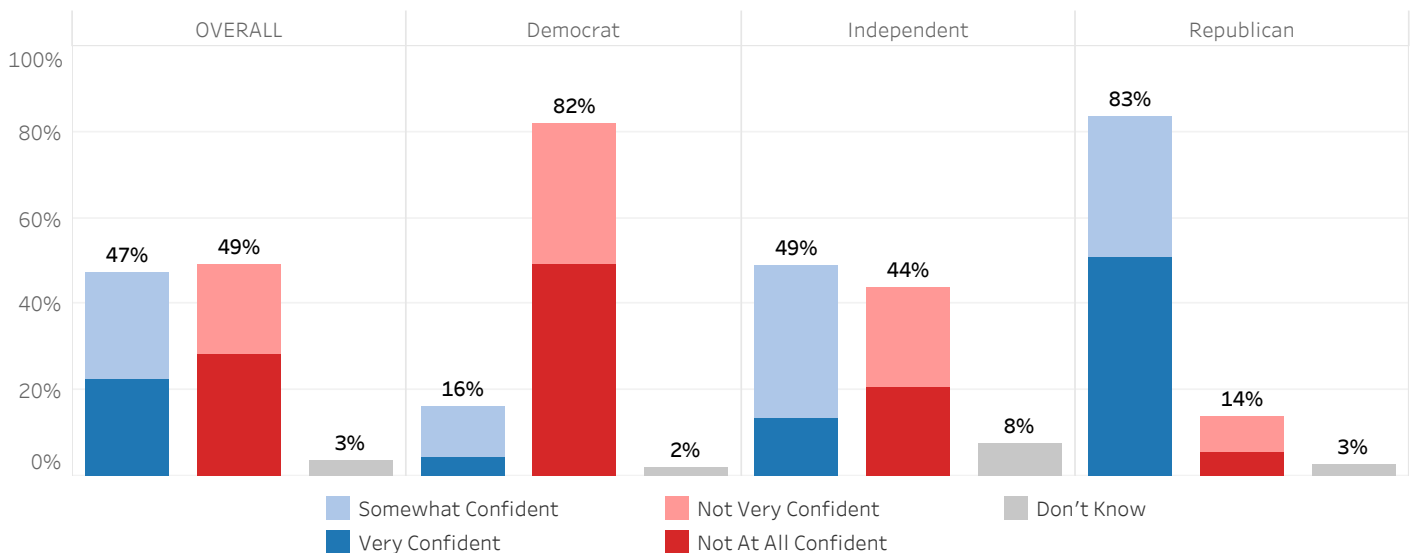
Threat Posed by North Korea



Granite Staters are divided about whether Trump has the ability to handle the situation with North Korea's nuclear program; 47% are very (22%) or somewhat (25%) confident that Trump can handle North Korea, while 49% are not very (21%) or not at all confident (28%).

Most Republicans (83%) are confident in Trump to handle the situation, but only 16% of Democrats and 49% of Independents feel this way.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and eighteen (518) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between April 24 and May 4, 2017. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.3 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.2%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
