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DRUG ABUSE THE MOST IMPORTANT ISSUE FACING NH

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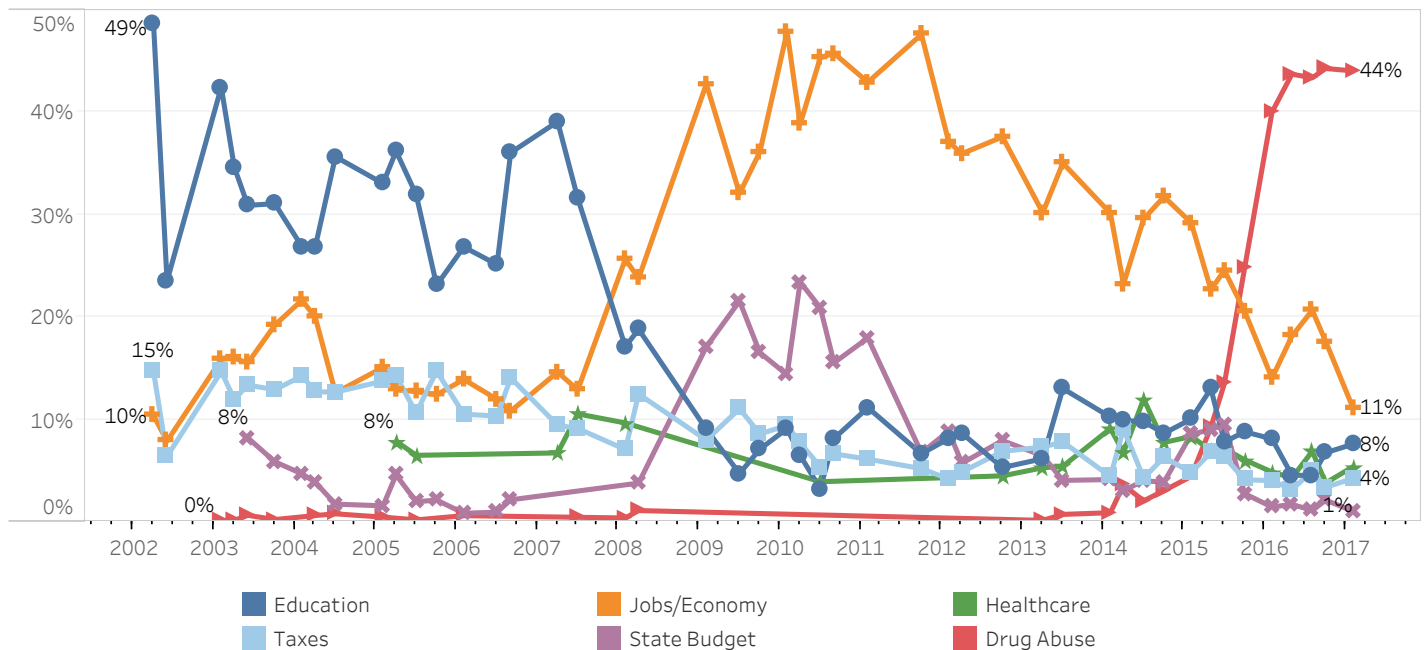
DURHAM, NH – Misuse of drugs continues to be seen as the most important problem facing the state. New Hampshire residents are divided over several controversial issues being considered by the New Hampshire legislature including constitutional carry for concealed weapons, "right to work," and the Northern Pass power project.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and five (505) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between January 31 and February 8, 2017. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent.

Most Important Problem Facing New Hampshire

Granite Staters remain very concerned with the drug crisis facing the state. Currently, 44% of New Hampshire adults cite drug misuse as the most important problem facing the state, followed by jobs and the economy (11%), education (8%), health care (5%), taxes (4%), and the state budget (1%). Misuse of drugs has been the most important problem for more than a year.

Respondents who frequently listen to conservative talk radio (69%), those who read the Union Leader (58%) or the Boston Globe (56%), those who frequently attend religious services (57%) and those who live in the Manchester Area (57%) are most likely to say that drugs are the most important problem facing New Hampshire.

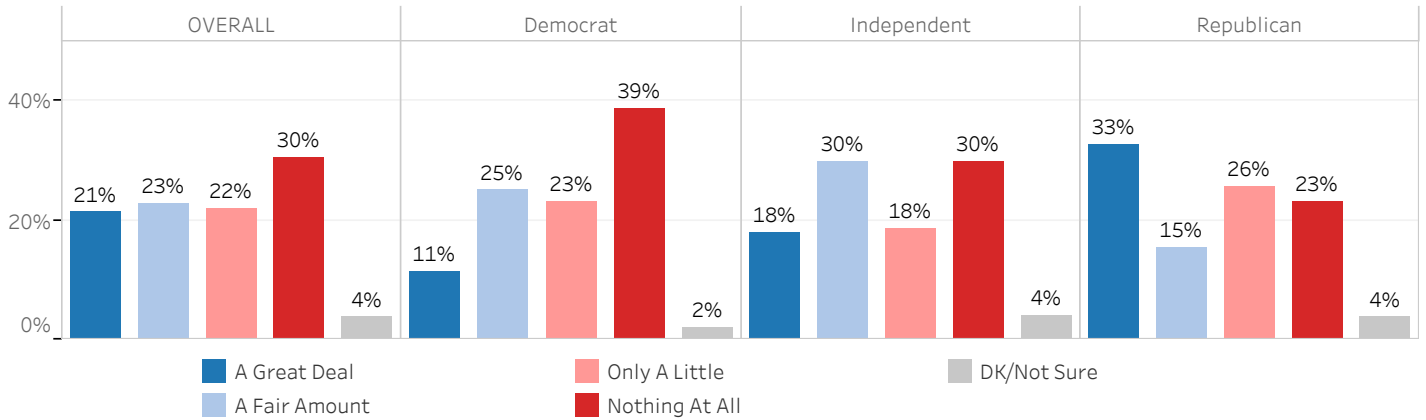

Constitutional Carry

The New Hampshire legislature has recently passed “constitutional carry” legislation that would no longer require a permit from a police chief in order to legally carry a concealed firearm in New Hampshire. Governor Sununu has indicated he will sign this legislation. However, New Hampshire residents are only somewhat familiar with the topic. Only 21% say they have heard a great deal about this and 23% say they have heard a fair amount about it while more than half (52%) say they have heard only a little (22%) or nothing at all (30%) about it. Republicans are significantly more aware of this issue than Independents or Democrats.

Constitutional Carry Familiarity

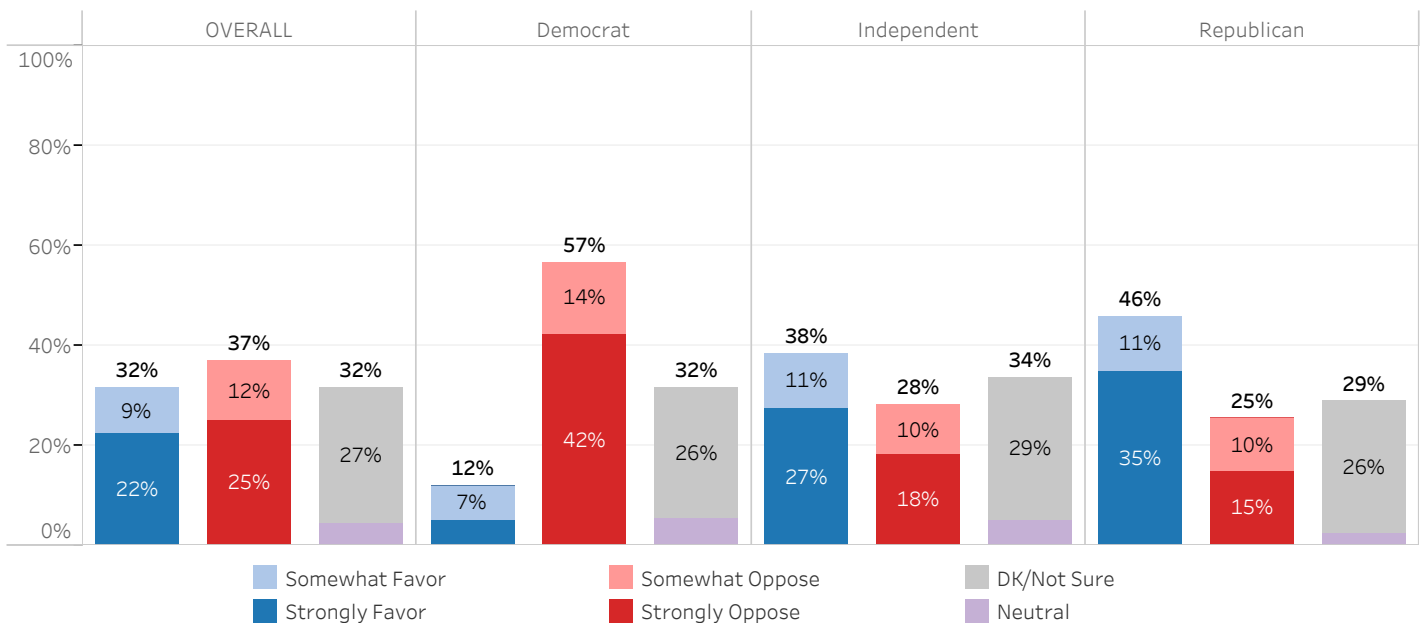


New Hampshire residents are closely divided over the issue of constitutional carry of firearms. Thirty-two percent (32%) of respondents strongly (22%) or somewhat (9%) favor this measure, while (37%) strongly (25%) or somewhat (12%) oppose it. A large proportion of respondents do not have a definitive opinion on the issue; 32% say they are neutral (5%) or don't know or are unsure (27%).

Partisanship plays an important role in support for constitutional carry of concealed firearms, with higher opposition to the measure among Democrats (57% oppose) and greater support among Republicans (46% favor).

Donald Trump voters (48% favor), Gunowners (47%), North Country residents (47%) and men (43%) are most likely to favor constitutional carry of concealed firearms while Hillary Clinton voters (59% oppose), those who frequently listen to NHPR (56% oppose) and those who have completed postgraduate work (51%) are most likely to oppose it.

Favor/Oppose Constitutional Carry



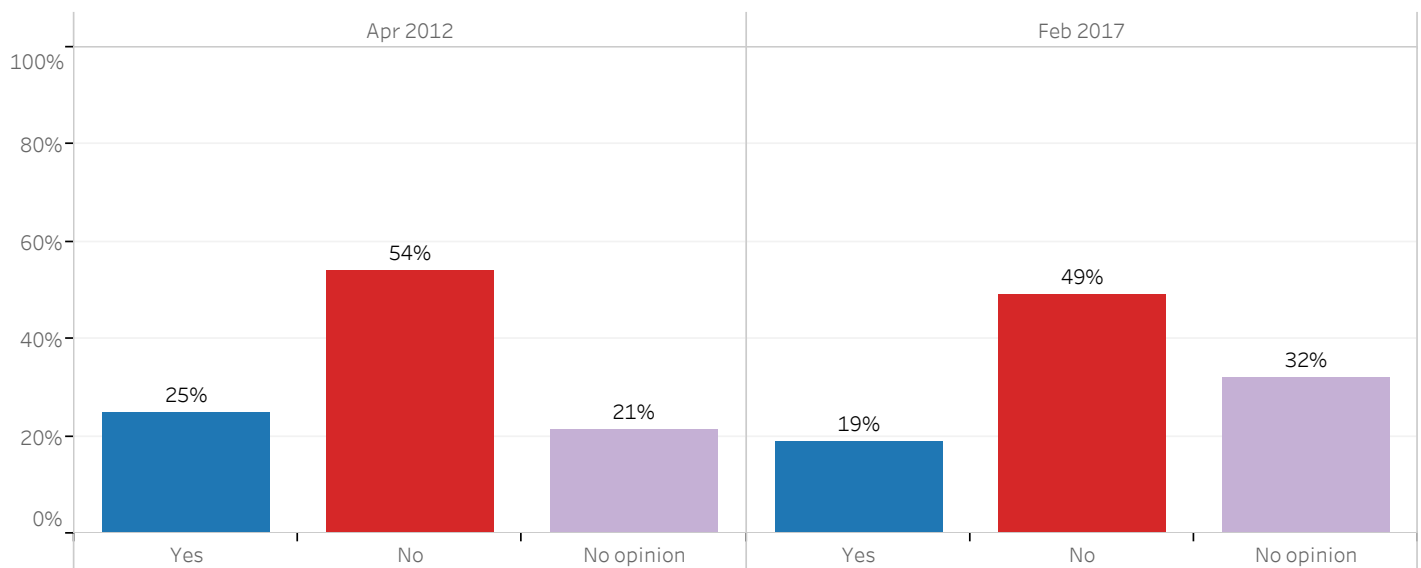
Right to Work Legislation

The New Hampshire Legislature is also considering "right to work" legislation that would change the relationship between employees and labor unions in the state. This proposed law would prohibit unions from forcing non-union members to pay fees to the union.

A plurality of New Hampshire residents (49%) do not believe an employee should be required to help pay for the costs associated with negotiations between a company and a union even if the employee is not in the union, 19% think an employee should be required to help pay for these costs, while nearly a third (32%) don't know or are unsure. These figures are similar to those seen in 2012 when similar legislation was vetoed by Governor Lynch. Republicans (57%) and Independents (49%) are slightly more likely than Democrats (40%) to say they an employee should not be required to pay in this situation, but partisan differences on the issue appear to be smaller than in other issues.

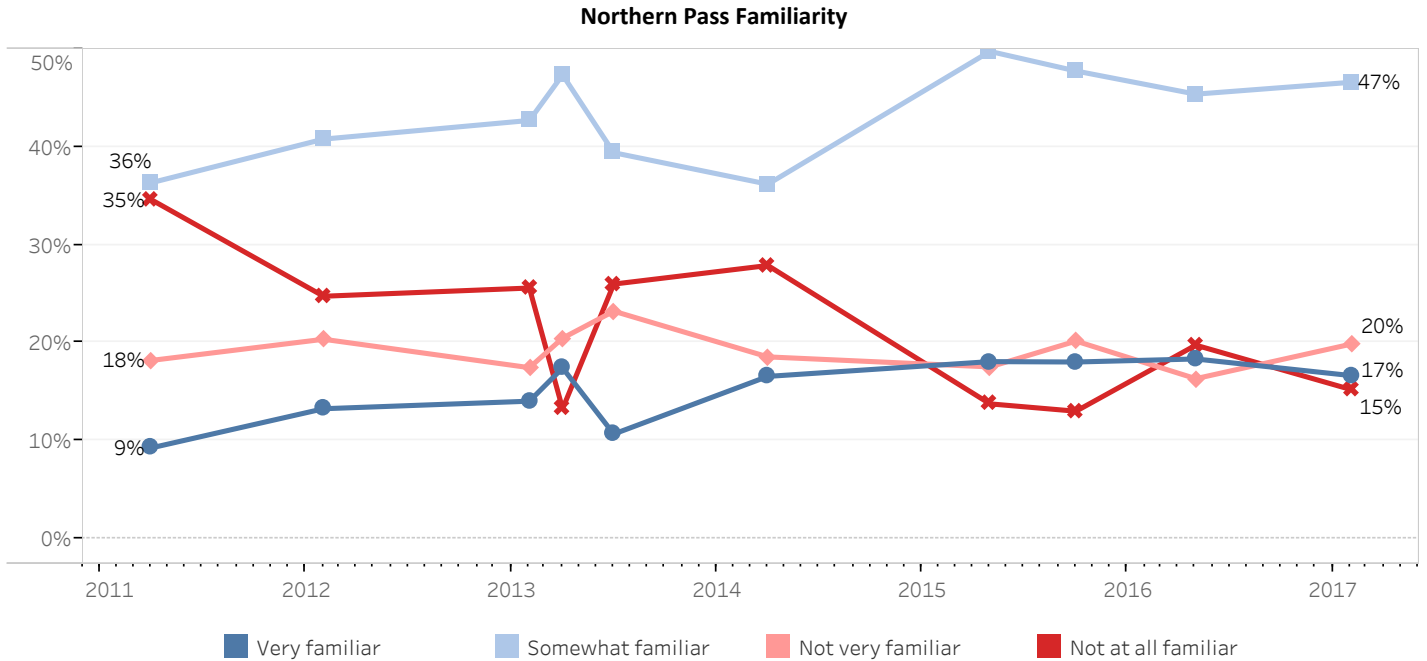
Frequent listeners of conservative talk radio (69%), those between the ages of 50 and 64 (58%), and Donald Trump voters (55%) are most likely to believe employees should not be required to pay for these costs. But even a plurality of union households (41%) believe employees should not have to pay union negotiation costs.

Employees Should be Required to Contribute to Costs of Negotiations

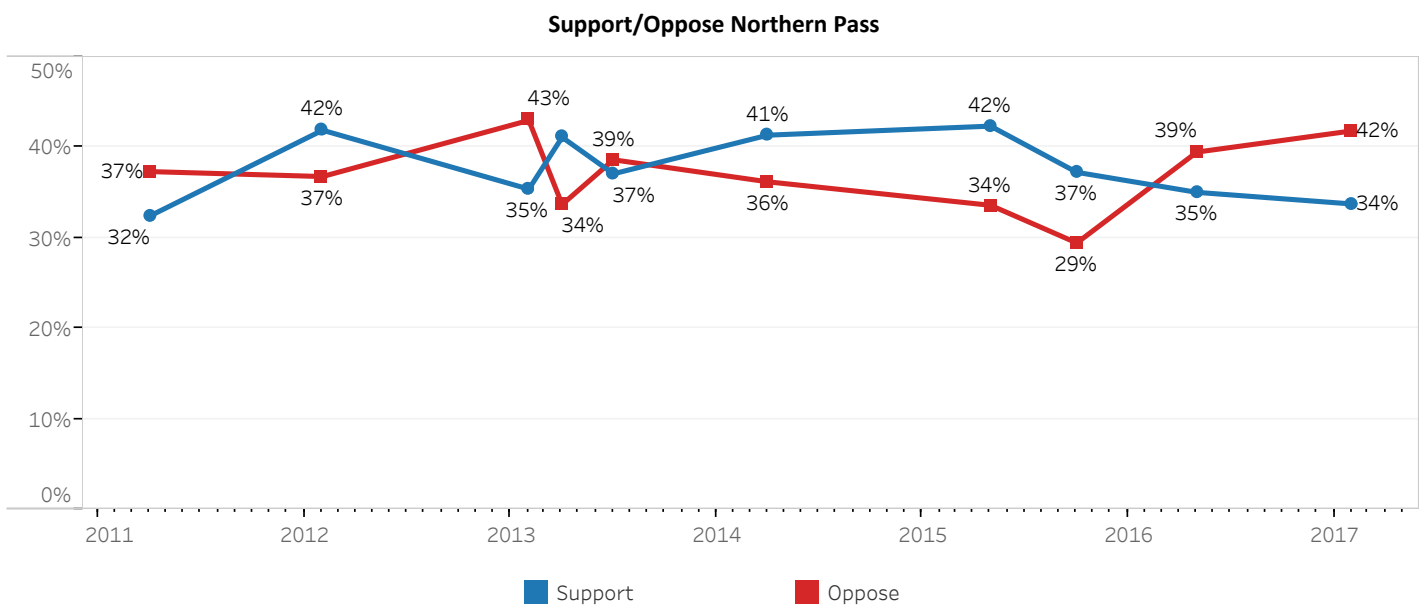


Northern Pass

Another controversial issue facing the state is the proposed “Northern Pass” project which would bring hydro-electric power from dams in Canada through New Hampshire on high tension wires. Nearly two-thirds of Granite Staters are at least somewhat familiar with the project, 17% say they are very familiar and 47% are somewhat familiar. However, more than a third (35%) say they are either not very familiar (20%) or not at all familiar (15%) with Northern Pass.



Northern Pass remains slightly unpopular among New Hampshire residents. Thirty-four percent of respondents strongly (15%) or somewhat (19%) support the project, 19% are neutral, and 42% strongly (21%) or somewhat (21%) oppose it. Support has declined slightly over the last two years; from 42% in April 2015 to 34% today. Republicans (52%), Donald Trump voters (50%) and men (46%) are most likely to support the project while Independents (24%), women (21%), Hillary Clinton voters (16%) are least likely to support it.



Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and five (505) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between January 31 and February 8, 2017. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.2%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
