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NH REPUBLICANS INCREASINGLY ENTHUSIASTIC ON TRUMP, OUTLOOK OF COUNTRY

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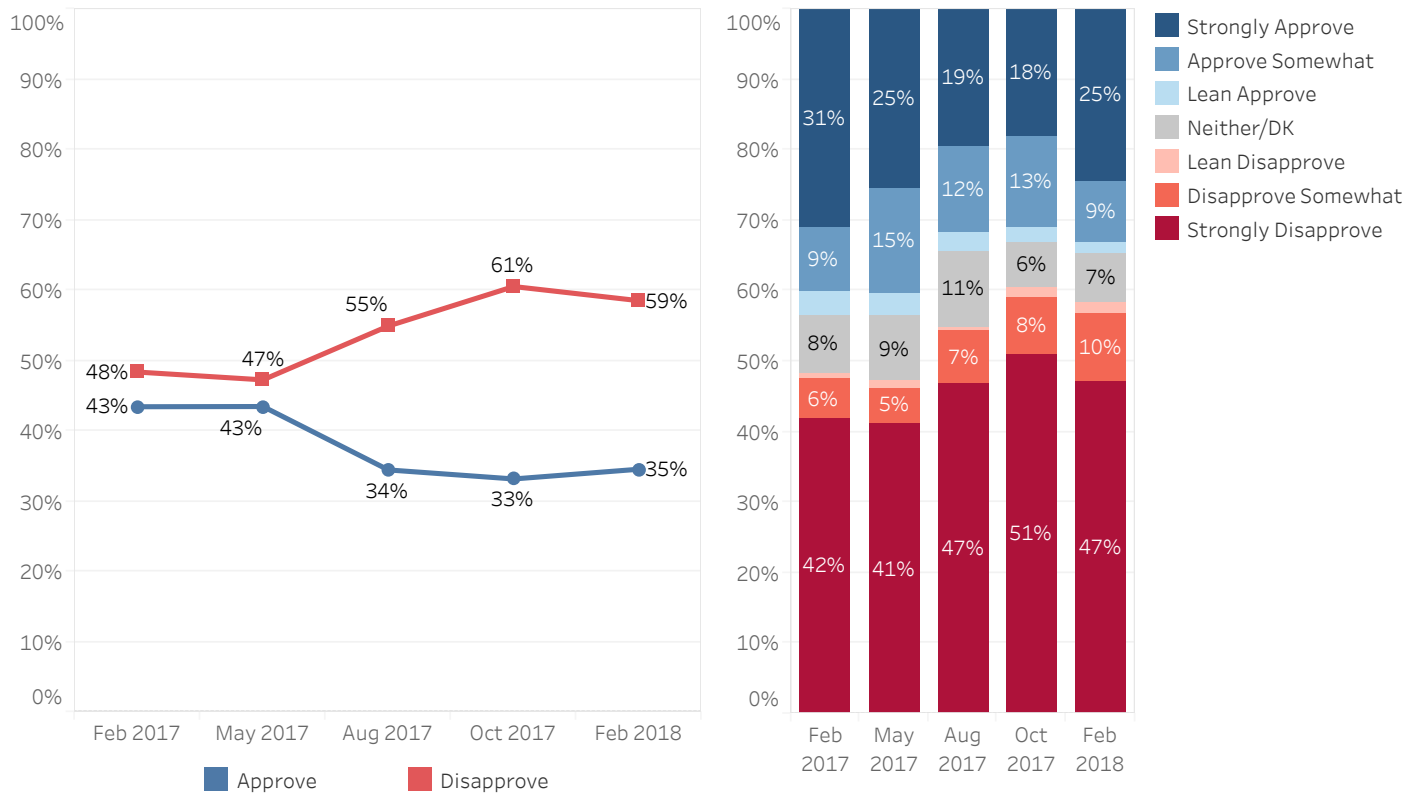
DURHAM, NH – Approval of Donald Trump's performance as president among New Hampshire residents remains low. Trump's personal favorability and approval of his handling of the economy and foreign affairs are largely unchanged. New Hampshire Republicans are more likely to approve of the job Trump is doing and more likely to view him favorably than they were last October and Republicans are more optimistic about the outlook of the country than they have been at any point since 2005.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and twenty-three (523) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between January 28 and February 10, 2018. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.3 percent.

Presidential Approval

Granite Staters' assessment of Donald Trump's performance as president remains largely negative. Just over a year into his presidency, only 35% of New Hampshire residents approve of Trump's performance as President, 59% disapprove, and 7% don't know or are unsure.

Presidential Approval - Donald Trump

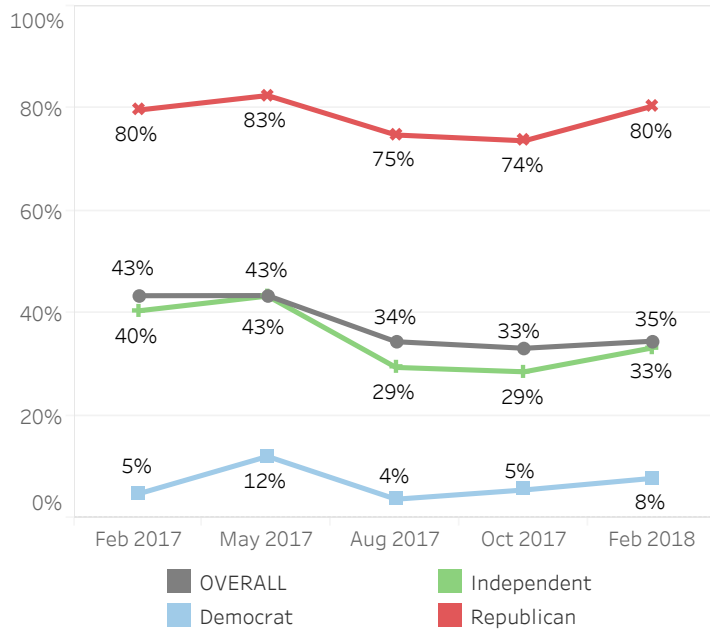

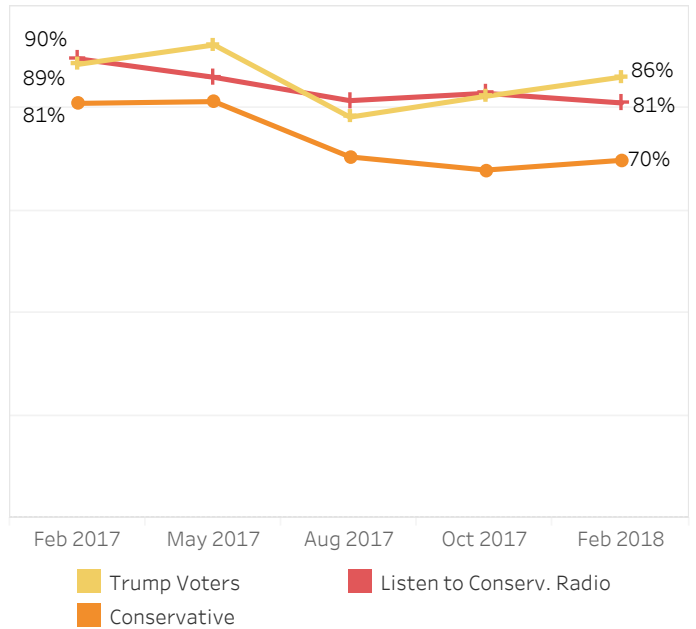
Approval of President Trump is closely tied to partisanship. Eighty percent of Republicans approve of Trump's job performance, up from 74% in October 2017, while only 33% of Independents and 8% of Democrats approve.

Those who voted for Trump in 2016 (86%), conservative talk radio listeners (81%), self-described conservatives (70%), and those who attend religious services once a week or more often (47%) are most likely to approve of Trump's performance. Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016 (2%), self-described liberals (4%), those aged 18 to 34 (21%), NHPR listeners (23%), Seacoast residents (23%), and *Boston Globe* readers (25%) are least likely to approve of Trump's performance. Half (50%) of those who say they approve of the job Chris Sununu is doing as governor disapprove of the job President Trump is doing as president.

Job Approval - President Donald Trump - By Party Identification

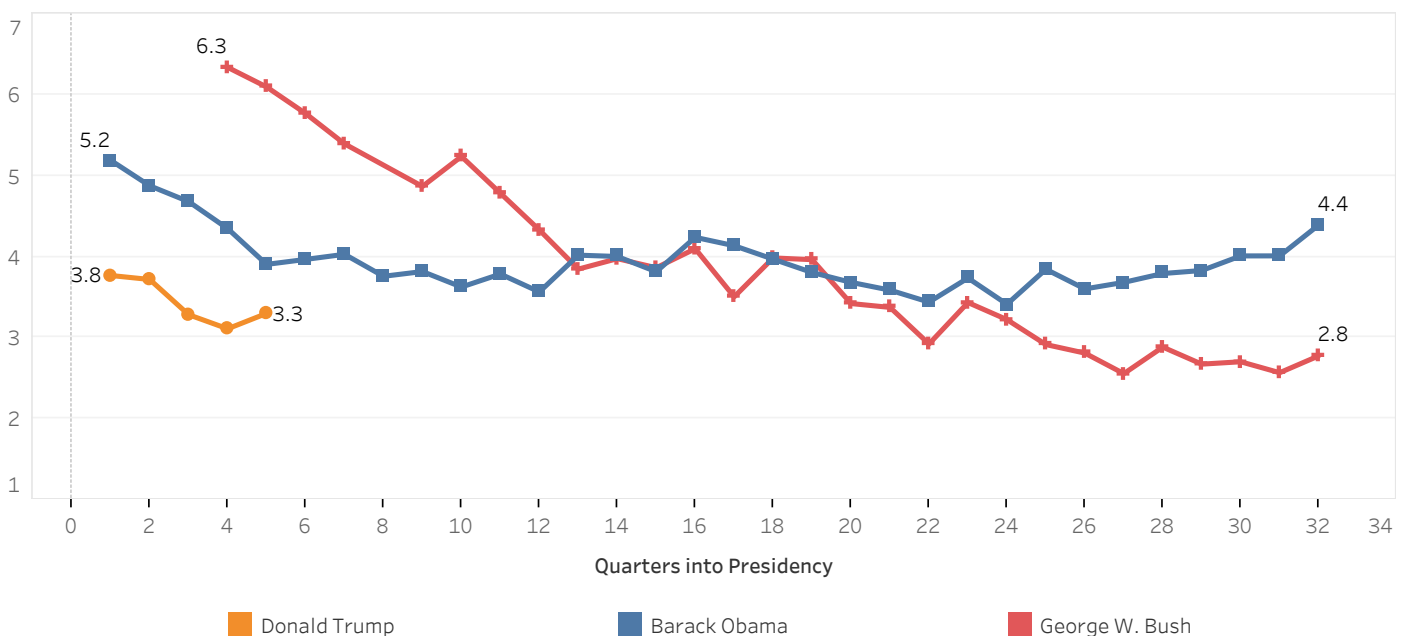


Job Approval - President Donald Trump - By Strongest Supporters



On a scale where "strongly approve" equals 7 and "strongly disapprove" equals 1, Trump's average approval rating (3.3) remains below his predecessor, Barack Obama (3.9), in the fifth quarter of his presidency.

(7=Strongly Approve, 1= Strongly Disapprove)

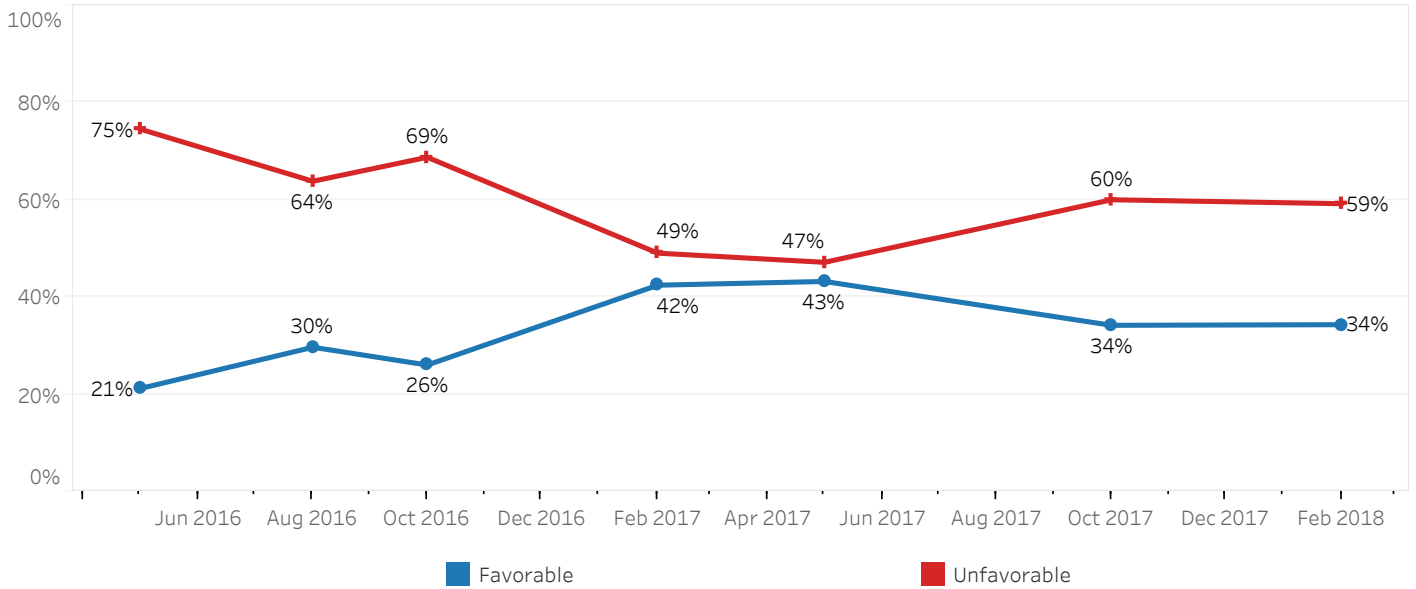


Favorability Ratings - President Donald Trump

Trump's personal favorability rating among New Hampshire adults is unchanged since October 2017. Trump is currently viewed favorably by 34% of Granite Staters, 59% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 6% are neutral or don't know enough to say.

Those who voted for Trump in 2016 (85%), self-identified Republicans (84%), conservative talk radio listeners (82%), self-described conservatives (72%), those who attend religious services once a week or more often (50%), men (45%), and Massachusetts Border residents (44%) are most likely to have a favorable opinion of Trump. Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016 (1%), self-described liberals (4%), self-identified Democrats (5%), NHPR listeners (20%), those aged 18 to 34 (21%), and women (24%) are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Trump.

Favorability - Donald Trump

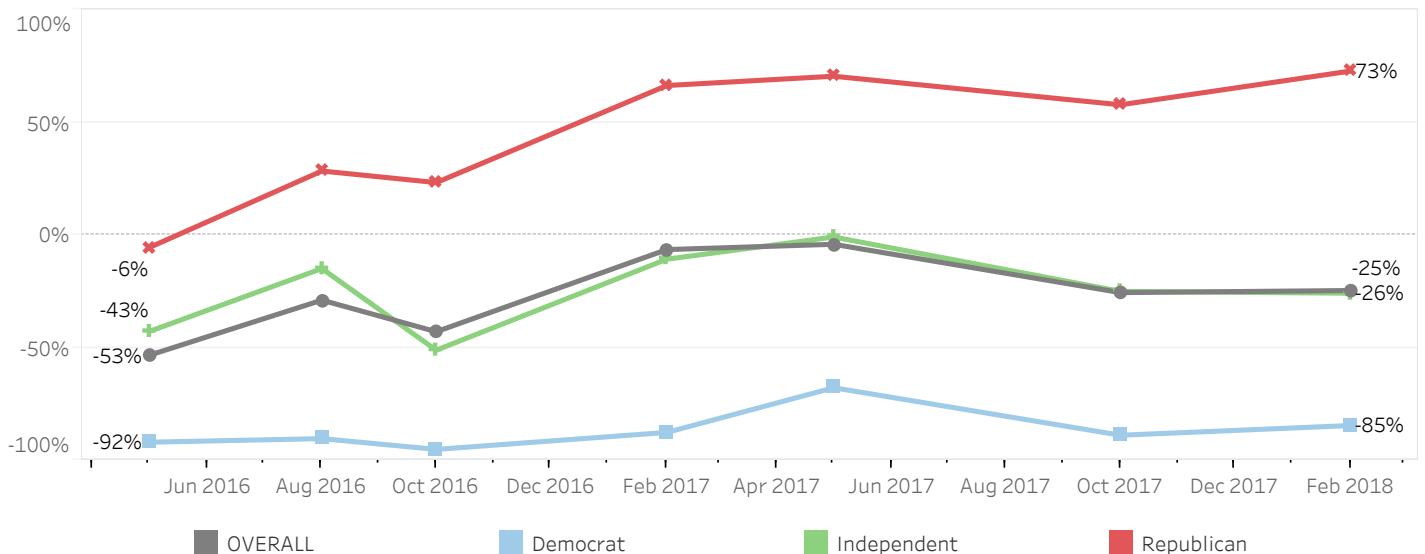


Net Favorability Rating - President Donald Trump

Trump's net favorability rating (-25%), the percentage of people who have a favorable opinion minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion, has remained steady since October 2017 (-26%) but remains far lower than in May 2017 (-4%). Trump's popularity among Republicans (73%) has increased since last October (58%), but Trump remains unpopular among Independents (-26%) and very unpopular among Democrats (-85%).

Net Favorability Rating - Donald Trump

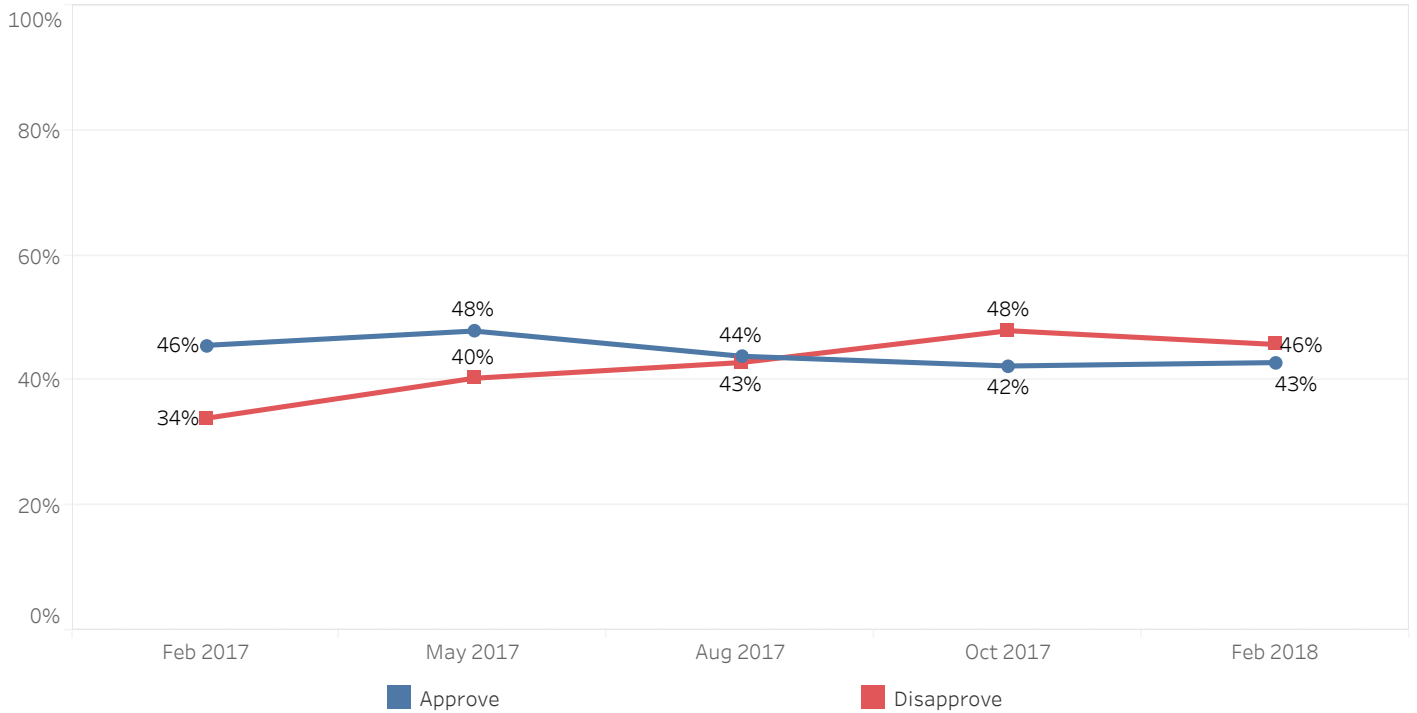
Net Favorability = (% Favorable - % Unfavorable)



Economic Approval

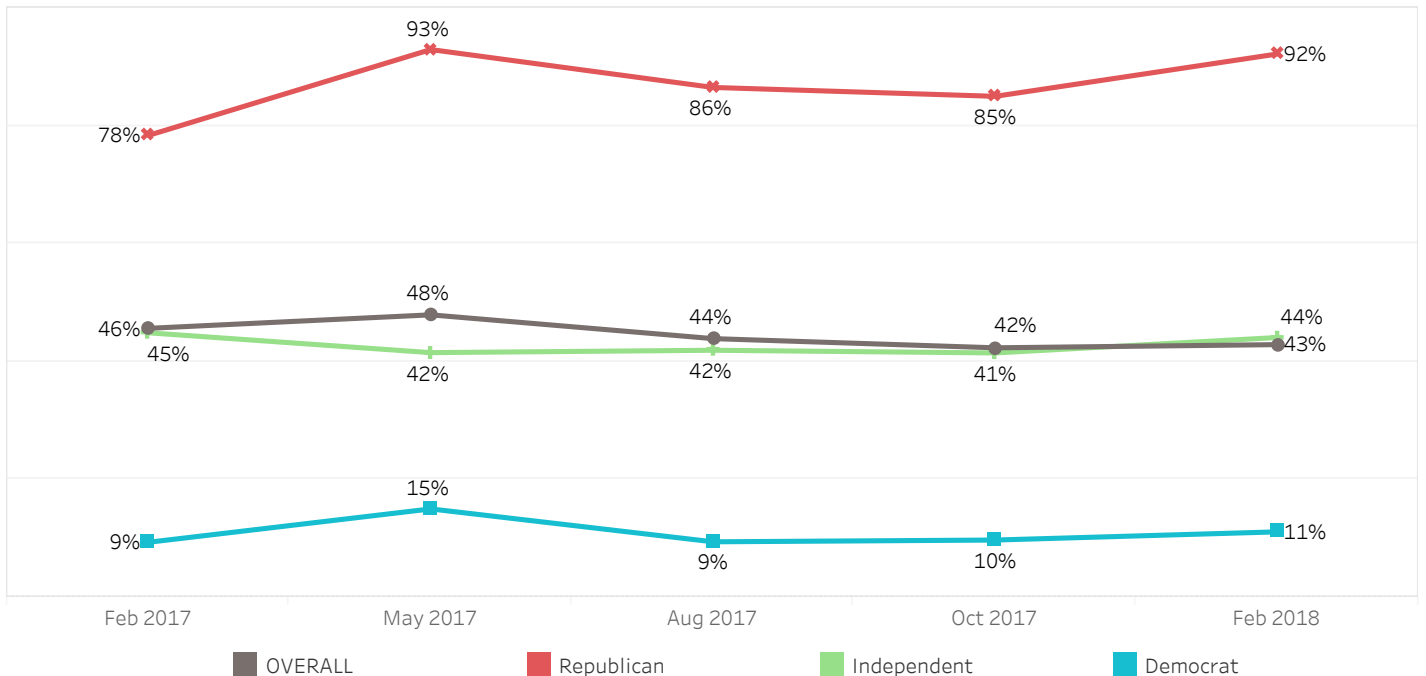
Despite a strong economic performance since his election, approval of President Trump's handling of the economy among New Hampshire residents has remained steady since October: 43% of respondents currently approve, 46% disapprove, and 11% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know.

The vast majority of Republicans approve of Trump's handling of the economy (92%), while Independents (44%) and Democrats (11%) are much less likely to approve.

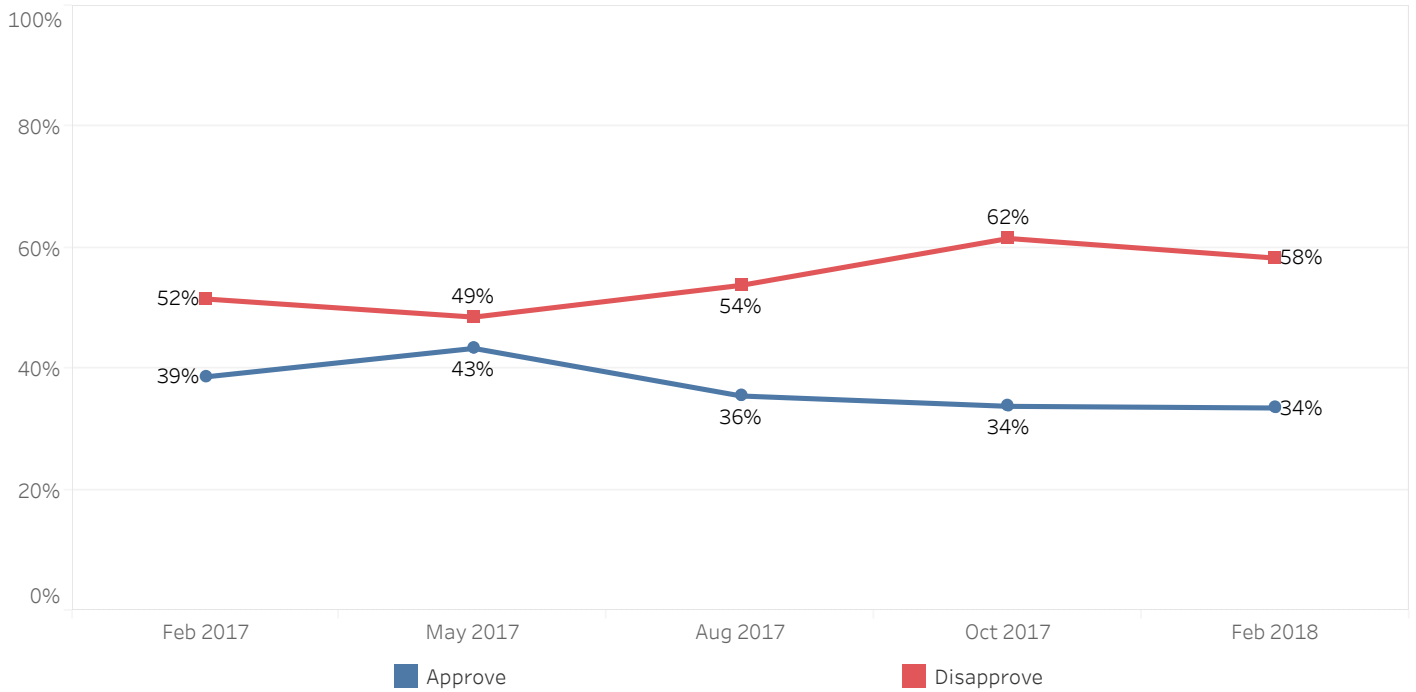
Economic Approval - by Party ID



Foreign Affairs Approval

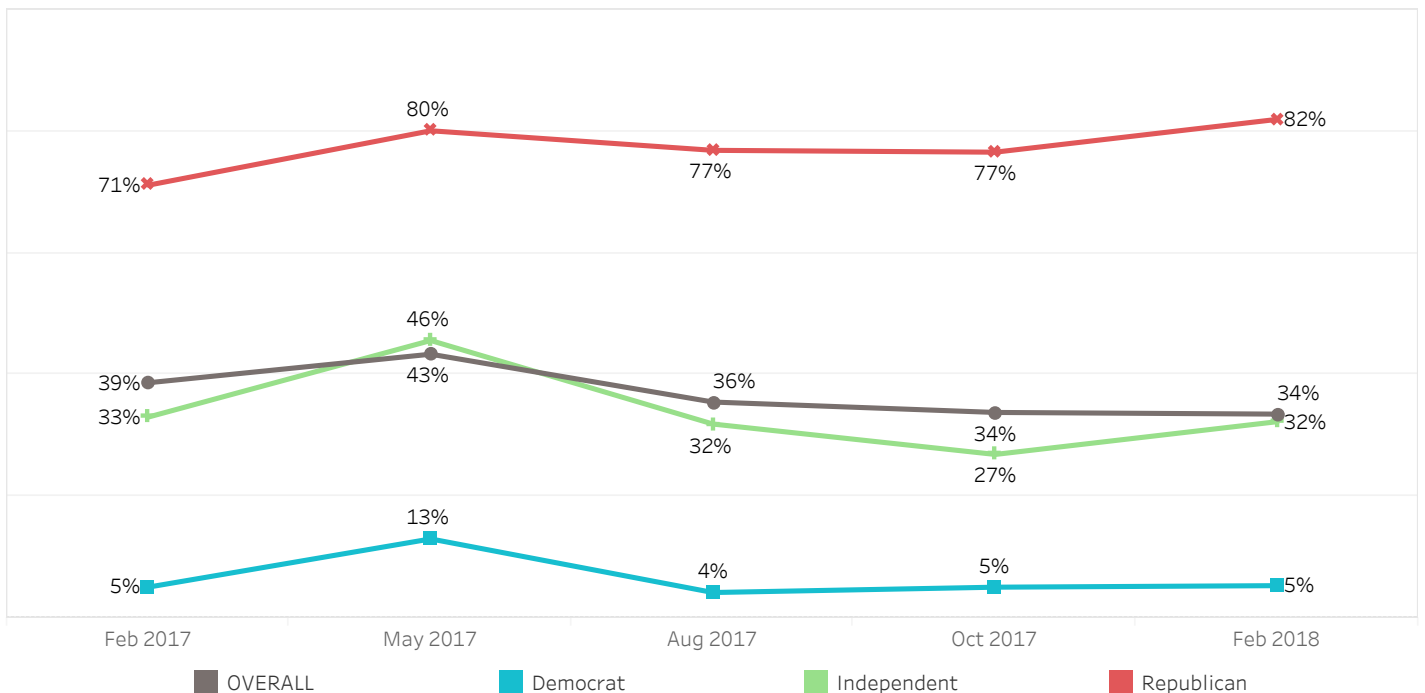
Granite Staters continue to have a lower opinion of Trump's handling of foreign affairs than his handling of the economy. Currently, only 34% of New Hampshire adults approve of how Trump is handling foreign affairs, 58% disapprove, and 8% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know.

Eighty-two percent of Republicans approve of Trump's performance in foreign affairs, but only 32% of Independents and 5% of Democrats agree. Approval of Trump's handling of foreign affairs among Republicans is at its highest point in his presidency.

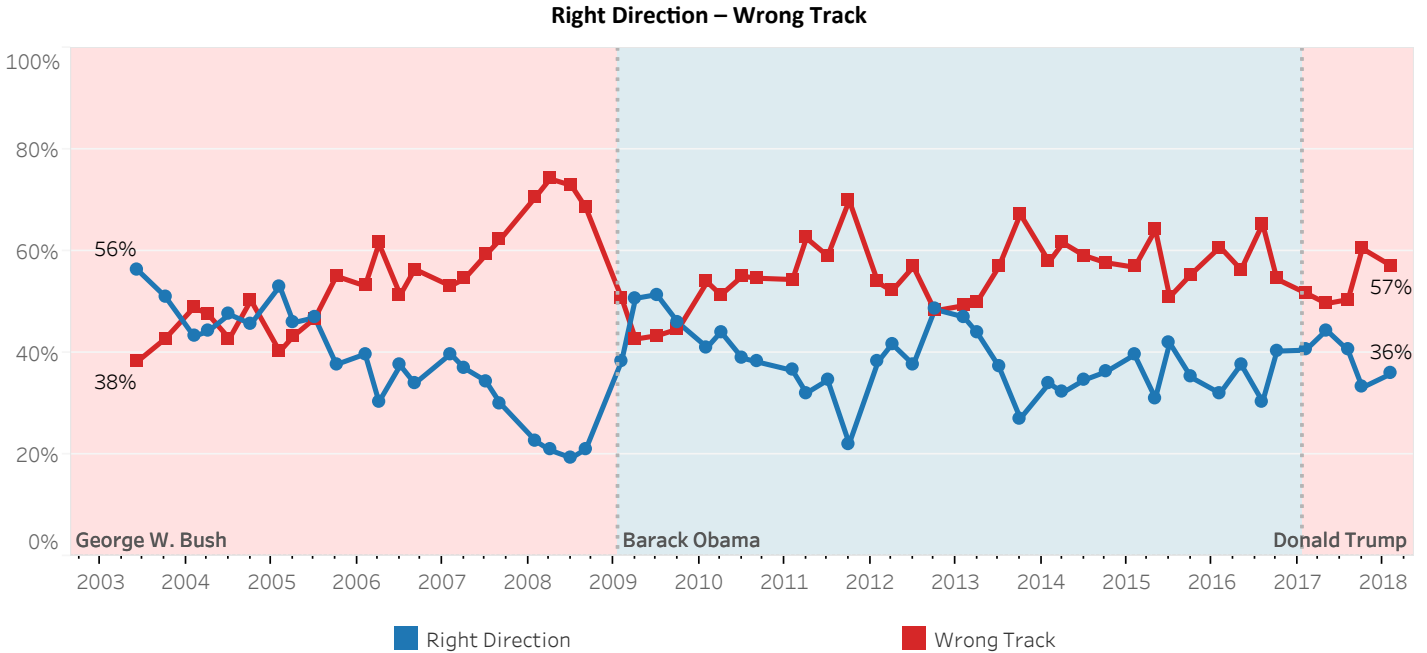
Foreign Affairs Approval - by Party ID



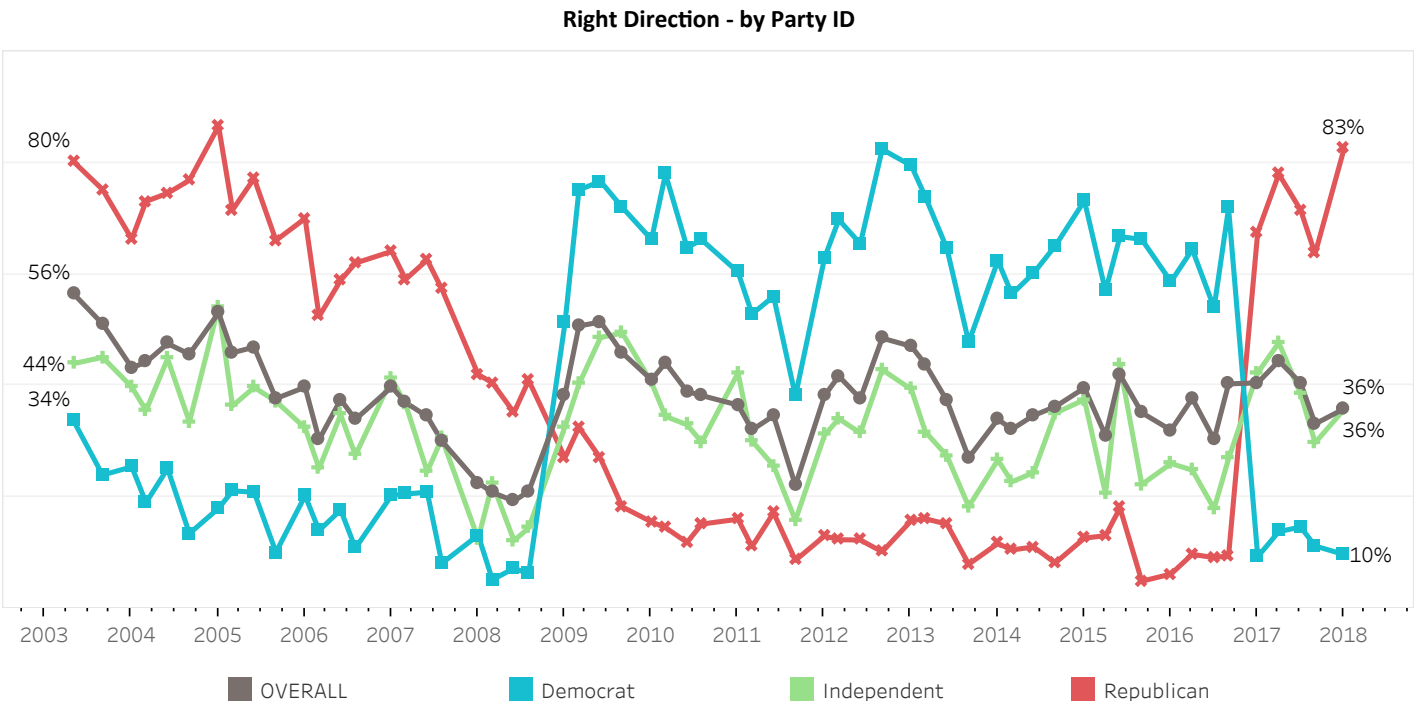
US Heading in Right Direction or On Wrong Track

Overall, New Hampshire residents continue to be pessimistic about the direction the country is heading. Thirty-six percent of New Hampshire residents think things in the country are going in the right direction while 57% say things are seriously off on the wrong track and 7% don't know or are unsure.

Respondents are far more optimistic about New Hampshire than the country as a whole; only 48% of respondents who think NH is going in the right direction feel the same way about things in the U.S.



Opinion on the direction of the country remains closely tied to partisanship. Eighty-three percent of Republicans believe the country is headed in the right direction but only 36% of Independents and 11% of Democrats agree. Belief among New Hampshire Republicans that the country is headed in the right direction (83%) has increased markedly since October 2017 (64%). Republicans are more optimistic about the outlook of the country than they have been at any point since 2005.



Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and twenty-three (523) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between January 28 and February 10, 2018. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.3 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.3%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers. When a landline number is reached, the interviewer randomly selects a member of the household by asking to speak with the adult currently living in the household who has had the most recent birthday. This selection process ensures that every adult (18 years of age or older) in the household has an equal chance of being included in the survey.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
