HONORS IN Neuroscience

The minimum requirements for honors work in Neuroscience will be the following:

1. An overall grade point average of 3.2 and a minimum grade point average in Neuroscience of 3.4 at the end of the sophomore year. * Submitting an application to the chairperson of the Neuroscience Honors Program.

To be awarded "Honors in Neuroscience," each student must complete 20 credit hours of honors courses (including 4-8 credits of Senior Honors Thesis NSB 797, 799H) within the Department. In addition, each student must attain an overall GPA of 3.2 and a

Neuroscience GPA of 3.2. The student must earn at least a B on the Senior Honors Thesis (797 & 799), and a B- in each honors seminar.

In order to fulfill these requirements, the student may choose from the following options in consultation with his or her advisor:

1. Students must choose three courses from the following options:
 - Honors sections of 700-level courses (any 700-level course, other than 793, 795) may be designated as "Honors") with permission of the instructor.
 - Any graduate seminar with the permission of the instructor, the department, and the Graduate School (seniors only).
2. Each student must complete NSB 797 and NSB 799H. The Senior Honors Thesis will culminate in a paper (deadline set by mentor) and a presentation at the URC or other significant public event or conference.

*It is possible to apply up to the end of the junior year. All honors students must have a faculty sponsor for their thesis PRIOR TO the beginning of the Fall semester of their senior year.
