

Guidelines for Reading & Research (JUST 995)

1. Students who wish to work independently on research related to the justice field may do so for variable credits (up to 4 credits) under JUST 995.
2. You may do one of the following three:
 - a. Broad reading in an area
 - b. Intensive investigation of a special problem
 - c. Empirical testing of a particular question
3. Select one of the following Justice Studies area for your Independent Study:
 - a. Courts
 - b. Criminology
 - c. Law and Psychology
 - d. Law and Society
 - e. Philosophy of Law
 - f. Statistics/Methodology
4. An agreement/proposal must be completed and signed by the student and the Justice Studies faculty member who will supervise the Independent Study. Make 3 copies of the agreement/proposal and give one to Deb Briand in Justice Studies, one to the faculty supervisor, and one to the student.
5. This course is by permission only.
6. The student is required to submit a written report to the Justice Studies faculty member supervising the Independent Study.
