

English Certification (5-12)

Students pursuing English Certification (5-12) through a UNH teacher education program must complete a bachelor's degree (or equivalent) in English, in addition to the Education Program requirements. Undergraduates are strongly encouraged to complete a B.A. in English Teaching, which includes the following requirements:

English Methods courses: ENGL 792/892 *Teaching Literature and Literacy* & ENGL 710/810 *Teaching Writing* or ENGL 725/810S *Seminar in English Teaching* & ENGL 726/892S *Seminar in English Teaching*

- Two literature courses numbered 600 or above. (ENGL 512 or 513, Survey of British Literature, may be substituted for one of these two.)
- Any English Department course in writing, linguistics, critical theory, film or literature (**except** English 401, 403 and 444)
- One course that addresses race, the construction of race, and racial theories. Choose from: 517, 540, 609, 690, 738, 740, 693R, or 797R. (other courses may count. Please see your advisor).

You must plan your English course schedule in advance. A course you need to satisfy an English requirement might not be offered in the semester you plan to take it, which could delay your internship. Please see your English advisor for help with planning your junior/senior years at UNH.

* ENGL 791/891 is offered separately as 791 and 891 in alternating years at UNH-M.

Any Education course taken for a teacher licensure requirement must be completed with a grade of **B-** or better. This applies to any courses from other departments that have been designated as equivalent to an Education course.

Degrees (Minimum of 32 Graduate credits)

<p>M.Ed. In addition to the 12 credit internship, 10 graduate credits must be UNH Education courses. The remaining graduate credits can be in Education, English or another department.</p>	<p>M.A.T. In addition to the 12 credit internship, three graduate level courses (9-12 credits) must be in English. The remaining graduate credits can be in English, Education or another department.</p>
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Admission to the M.Ed. or M.A.T. is competitive and requires submission of an application to the UNH Graduate School. This includes official transcripts, scores from the Praxis Core exam, personal statement and three letters of recommendations. Thirty-two (32) Graduate credits are the minimum for either degree.
