English Literature, B.A.

English literature majors are skilled readers and interpreters of literary works, films, media creations and cultural phenomena. Understanding literature is multidimensional and includes the consideration of the artistic, historical, cultural and theoretical contexts that inform imaginative creations.

Small classes provide opportunities to work closely with faculty and explore questions that are fundamental to our understanding of what it means to be human: questions of identity (national, religious, racial, class, gender, sexual), questions of the purposes of storytelling and the imagination in human society, and questions of how humans interact with the non-human (the supernatural, animals, technology, the environment).
