DEGREE OPTIONS English Teaching, B.A.

Do you enjoy working with young adults? Do you love to share your enthusiasm for literature with others? Does the give and take of a classroom discussion about, say, Huckleberry Finn (or, name your favorite book), energize you? Do you like to help others with their writing? Do you enjoy seeing someone learn how to shape an idea? If so, consider becoming an English teacher. First, complete your Bachelor of Arts in English teaching. Then, to meet state certification requirements to teach in public schools in New Hampshire, during your senior year, you will apply to the university's education department to complete a fifth year of graduate study. This entails both graduate coursework and a yearlong internship. Upon completion, you will graduate with either a Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.) or Master of Education (M.Ed.) degree.
