

Learning Through Teaching

Continue this summer's growth mindset with people in your school–consider Learning Through Teaching.

Learning Through Teaching (LTT) is an innovative, inservice program designed to help K-12 teachers meet their individual goals in teaching, reading, writing, and literature. It is unique because it brings teacher education to the site of instruction—the teacher's school and classroom.

The format includes observation, feedback, individualized learning, and shared expertise. Each course will be coordinated by a faculty consultation from the New Hampshire Literacy Institutes who will work with teachers to develop individual programs.
