Audition requirements (please read carefully)

- All auditions will be in person, and are "no cut," meaning everyone who auditions will be cast in at least one song.
- Please prepare one 19th-century song with piano accompaniment (Viardot and composers listed above are encouraged, but all composers of this time period are welcome) if you wish to be considered for casting in the romantic-era repertoire.
- Please prepare one contemporary song with piano accompaniment or *a cappella* (pop, folk, jazz, MT, rock, gospel, country) if you wish to be considered for casting in the contemporary repertoire.
- Bring legible sheet music for the collaborative pianist in your desired key and arrangement.

- If you prefer to use a prerecorded track, ensure that it contains *only one* accompanying instrument (piano, guitar, etc.). No orchestral or full band tracks, please. You are responsible for your own track playback device.
- A note about style: all singers are encouraged to adhere to stylistic performance practices for each song they present. That means you should show that you know about the style of the music you sing, regardless of genre.
- SIngers who accompany themselves well may audition with their instrument, if they wish.
