

Hailed as one of the 100 Passionate People (Taiwanese American Project), Ming-Hui Lin is a versatile cellist, an avid chamber musician, and a devoted teacher and coach.

Broadcasted on the Sound of Hope Radio Station (San Francisco) and NYC Chinese American Voice, Ming-Hui's concert engagements have taken her to Europe, Asia, and throughout the United States and Canada, including such venues as Carnegie Recital Hall, Kennedy Center, and Jordan Hall.

In addition to serving on the faculties of New England Conservatory Preparatory School, Ming-Hui was a former instructor at Boston University and is now on faculty at the Belmont Hill School. She has been faculty members at summer festivals such as Altschuler Summer Music Institute in Italy, Boston Music Institute, Foulger International Music Festival, and Summer Music at Rivers School Conservatory. She has also been invited to teach at the Saarbarg International Music Festival & School in Germany.

As a founding member of the New England String Quartet, Ming-Hui performed extensively in the New England area and coached at Harvard University's Dudley House where the quartet served as the ensemble in residence. Having made its debut at Weill Recital Hall, the quartet has released seven albums on the PARMA label. Ming-Hui has also appeared with the Vermont Symphony Orchestra and Boston Modern Orchestra Project. The BMOP Sound has received the 44th Gramophone Classical Music Award and has earned its 8th Grammy Award Nomination.

Ming-Hui has been serving as the music director at the Boston Youth Music Charity group since 2010. Most recently she has been advocating for Ukraine through music engagements, as well as partnering with Celebrity Series of Boston (Concert for One project). Ming-Hui holds a Doctor of Musical Arts Degree from Boston University, a Graduate Performance Diploma and a Master of Music Degree from Peabody Conservatory of the Johns Hopkins University, and a Bachelor of Music Degree from the Taipei National University of the Arts. She is also a certified Suzuki cello instructor.
